"It means a lot to me to be the Glenville State University Pioneer," said Dean. "It is fulfilling a dream I have had since I came to Glenville State, and it is an honor to be chosen for the position. I look forward to representing our school and having the honor of serving as the Pioneer."

For Dean, Glenville State is more than just a school. "I love the family atmosphere of Glenville State University, I love the tight-knit, small town school atmosphere, and of course, I love the Department of Land Resources and being a part of it! I would like to thank God, my family, friends, and supporters, and Glenville State University for this opportunity. I am beyond excited to serve as the 2022-2023 Glenville State Pioneer! As the GSU Pioneer, Dean will attend football and basketball games, tournaments, and other school events. The Pioneer is charged with working with students, faculty, and staff to positively promote and support the university. An ongoing tradition for over 80 years, Dean becomes the 82nd student to portray the Pioneer Mascot. She will be the seventh woman to serve as the Pioneer.

National Champion Glenville State University Lady Pioneers Recognized

The Glenville State University Lady Pioneers have been recognized and congratulated for their recent NCAA Division II Women's Basketball National Championship win in both Glenville and statewide.

On Wednesday, April 6 the team held a meet and greet with fans at the GSU Waco Center before being honored with a parade in downtown Glenville. The streets were lined with members of the community, Glenville State faculty, staff, and students, and elementary, middle, and high school students from Gilmer, Braxton, Calhoun, and Harrison Counties. Following the parade, the team was recognized with a ceremony at the Waco Center. They were presented with commemorative necklaces by Glenville Mayor Dennis Fitzpatrick '73 and Gilmer County Superintendent Patty Lowther '89, a symbolic presentation on behalf of the community. Coach Kim Stephens '11 also received a citation from Delegate Brent Boggs '76 on behalf of the West Virginia House of Delegates. Before the new national championship banner was unveiled inside the Waco Center, West Virginia University head men's basketball coach, Bob Huggins, spoke to the crowd and offered his congratulations to the Lady Pioneers.

On Thursday, April 7 the team traveled to Charleston, West Virginia where they were recognized by Mayor Amy Schuler Goodwin and presented with a key to the city. The team members were greeted at Haddad Riverfront Park by students and coaches from George Washington High School, Charleston Catholic High School, West Side Middle School, Horace

Mann Middle School, and John Adams Middle School. The Lady Pioneers signed basketballs that were then presented to each of the schools in attendance.

Following those events, the team met with West Virginia Governor Jim Justice where he presented Distinguished West Virginian awards to each of the Lady Pioneers, Coach Stephens, and Assistant Coaches Adrianna Bendick and Angel Rizor. The Distinguished West Virginian award is the highest civilian honor that the Governor can bestow.

"It is truly amazing what you've accomplished," Justice said to the Lady Pioneers. "This moment is unbelievable and that's just all there is to it. Think about how many opportunities West Virginia has had to win a national championship in basketball...and how many have we won? We've won one now. You've done something that has never been done before. It is amazing beyond belief."
