The 148th Glenville State University Commencement Ceremony will take place on Saturday, May 7 at 10:00 a.m. in the GSU Waco Center.

The Glenville State University class of 2022 will walk across the graduation stage to receive their degrees in a variety of programs including business, education, land resources, criminal justice, science, music, and more. The prospective grads hail from throughout West Virginia and several other states.

In recognition of an ongoing tradition at Glenville State, alumni who graduated fifty years ago have been invited back to campus to join the current graduates at the ceremony. Members of the class of 1972 will be recognized as "50 Year Graduates" during the event.

The keynote address will be delivered by Andy Knicely, Publisher of WV News. WV News encompasses several publications in North Central West Virginia and beyond, including the *Exponent Telegram, The State Journal, Blue Gold News, NCWV Life Magazine, Fairmont News*, and WVnews.com. While a student at Glenville State. Pioneer Alumni -

As Glenville State University continues *Pioneering* in the field of education, it is proud to announce that we are now accepting applications for the Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) degree program for the Fall 2022 semester.

We would like to ask that you help get the word out about our inaugural graduate program for individuals who would like become teachers!

Glenville State University has designed the MAT program with the working person in mind.

- Classes are offered in 8 week sessions during the semester with 2 sessions each semester. Summer classes will also be available.
- Classes are offered online to allow the individual to continue their work as they complete their Masters degree leading to initial license.
- Classes can be completed at a pace that fits the individual's schedule. Student teaching will be in your home county if the district agrees.
- · Program leads to an initial license for teaching in West Virginia.
- The program at Glenville State University is designed to be economical. The cost is \$460 per credit hour, a \$24 per credit hour book fee (books can be picked up or delivered to your home address), and an \$80 per semester instructional technology fee. There are no 'hidden fees' in Glenville State's program.
