## Inauguration Ceremony Held for Dr. Mark A. Manchin

Glenville State College officially installed its newest leader on Friday, April 9 as Dr. Mark A. Manchin's inauguration ceremony was held at the College's Waco Center.

Manchin began his tenure as Glenville State's 26th president on July 1, 2020.

During his inaugural address, Manchin spoke about the importance of education, his love of family, and his visions for Glenville State College, including expanding health sciences programs and reinvesting in teacher education.

Dennis has spent his career in education, having served as a teacher, coach, and administrator in Roane County Schools. He also served as the Director of the Roane-Jackson Technical Center until his retirement.

While a student at GSC, Dennis was very active in the Theta Xi fraternity. He graduated from GSC in December 1973, with his bachelor's degree in social studies education (7-12). He later went on to earn his master's degree in educational leadership from the West Virginia College of Graduate Studies.

Originally from Walton, West Virginia, Dennis and his wife Dianna currently reside in Spencer, West Virginia. Together they have two sons, Michael and Brady, and one granddaughter, Reese. In his spare time, he enjoys spending time with his family, golfing, and riding his side-by-side.

When asked about his time at GSC he said, "I left Walton High School in the spring of 1969 believing that I wanted to be a teacher and the most logical and only school I considered was Glenville State College. GSC provided me the opportunity to develop the personal skills necessary to have a career in public education. My instructors were willing to not only teach courses, they taught real life skills. **Land Resources Department Annual Golf Tournament Teeing-Off April 23** 

Planning is underway for the 22nd Annual Glenville State College Department of Land Resources Golf Tournament to be held on Friday, April 23 beginning at 9:00 a.m. Proceeds from the event, which will take place at the Glenville Golf Club in Glenville, West Virginia, will again be used to enhance student learning within GSC's Natural Resource Management programs.

Funds received from the golf tournament will help provide extra tools and equipment for students studying environmental science, forestry, land surveying, energy and land management, wildlife management, and other natural resource management programs at GSC.

Multiple prizes are available, including two hole-in-one prizes of \$10,000 cash and a STIHL Homeowner's Package (package includes a chainsaw, handheld blower, and trimmer) and a closest second shot prize of a STIHL MS251 Chainsaw (or equivalent). The top three teams will receive cash awards including \$400 for first place, \$300 for second place, and \$200 for third place. Prizes also will be awarded for Closest to Pin, Log Driver Champion, Longest Putt, and Longest Drive.

Participants can enter the scramble golf outing for an entry fee of \$80 per person or \$320 per team of four. The entry fee includes green fees, cart rental, and lunch. Organizations and individuals are also welcome to sponsor a hole, starting at \$100. Sponsors will be recognized in a GSC Department of Land Resources newsletter.
