

Gilmer CWA and Relief Administration Food and Other Commodity Shipments from December 1933-????

December 7, 1933 — 5 tons of salt pork from the packing houses of Armour & Company of Chicago. Pork issued in 3 and 6 pound packages.

January 11, 1934 — 5 ½ tons of pork and one ton of butter. Pork comes in 3, 6, and 9 pound packages.

February 15, 1934 — 2 shipments of 1200 dozen eggs.

February 22, 1934 — 600 cotton and woolen blankets, 700 bags of flour, and 2 tons of pork.

March 8, 1934 — 116 crates of oranges. Each crate weighs 45 pounds which makes a total of 5220 pounds of oranges.

March 15, 1934 — 10,000 pounds of smoked pork.

March 29, 1934 — 10,000 pounds of flour. The flour was milled and packed by the Spencer Roller Mill Company.

May 31, 1934 — 25 barrels of flour.

June 14, 1934 — 3518 pounds of salt pork.

June 28, 1934 — 6000 pounds of smoked bacon. Bacon was trucked in from Parkersburg. 14,000 pounds of potatoes and those to receive potatoes have to furnish their own bags or sacks.

July 5, 1934 — 2100 pounds of lard.

August 2, 1934 — 1200 dozen quart glass jars to be used for the FERA canning project.

August 30, 1934 — 100 cases or 3600 pounds of canned beef.

December 6, 1934 — 200 bushels of potatoes.

December 20, 1934 — 17,000 pounds of cabbage from New York State.

January 3, 1935 — 3155 pounds of rice and 16,700 pounds of cabbage.

February 28, 1935 — 5760 cans of evaporated milk delivered by Citizens Transfer and Storage Co. of Parkersburg. Each family gets 6 cans.

March 21, 1935 — 2376 pounds of canned veal; 900 yards of dyed bed ticking; 4800 yards comforter covers; and 4500 pounds of canned roast beef.

May 30, 1935 — 26 mattresses.

June 13, 1935 — 4800 pounds of canned beef.

December 1935 — 6045 pounds of food; 8 furniture pieces; and 2 articles of clothing.

January 1936 — 6475 pounds of food; 46 furniture pieces; and 23 articles of clothing.

February 1936 — 8289 pounds of food.

March 1936 — 18,441 pounds of food.
