ELECTRONIC NOTIFICATIONS

Students may view grades and other information via the GSC website (www.glenville.edu). Just click “MyGSC” on the homepage and select EdNet Information System. Click Login to the EdNet Information System. Enter the “secure area” and sign in with your student ID number and your PIN number.

DEGREE EVALUATION REQUIRED BEFORE GRADUATING

Students who have completed 80 hours toward a baccalaureate degree or 40 hours toward an associate degree must request and receive an official degree evaluation. Students needing an evaluation and not requesting one will have a HOLD placed on their records. These students will not be permitted to register until the evaluation request is made. Student evaluation requests and the program of study in the Banner system must match. A request for a degree evaluation should be made at the Registrar’s Office.

SEMESTER LOAD

Eighteen (18) hours during the semester is considered a maximum load. Any student requesting more than 18 hours must meet the criteria for an overload. The request must be approved by the academic advisor, department chairperson and Provost prior to enrollment.

A student must obtain the overload form from his/her advisor at the time they discuss the student’s schedule. Once the overload form is signed by the advisor and the department chairperson, the student should carry the overload request form to the Provost’s Office.

STUDENTS ON ACADEMIC PROBATION

A student placed on academic probation at the end of this semester and who has already registered for more than 15 hours for the upcoming semester, must drop back to a total of 15 hours or less. Failure to do so will result in adjustments to their class schedules by the Registrar’s Office.

VETERANS

New veterans should contact the Associate Registrar in order to be certified for benefits. Those wanting advance pay should contact the office at least six weeks prior to the beginning of school.

TUITION & FEES

Students will be invoiced through their official Glenville State College e-mail account. Tuition and Fees must be paid on or before the first day of classes. Failure to make appropriate financial arrangements with the Business Office by Monday, January 9, 2012 may result in students being removed from classes.

LAST DAY TO ADD A CLASS-Tuesday, January 17, 2012

Students who wish to change their schedule by adding classes must do so by January 17, 2012. The student must complete a “add” form with their academic advisor and take it to the academic department secretary for processing.

LAST DAY TO DROP A CLASS without a “W”-Monday, January 23, 2012

Students who wish to change their schedule by dropping classes must do so by January 23, 2012. The student must complete a “drop” form with the academic advisor and take it to the academic department secretary for processing.

LAST DAY TO WITHDRAW WITH A GRADE OF “W”-Friday, March 23, 2012*

After January 23, students may withdraw from a course with a grade of “W” by completing the “drop” form with their academic advisor and taking it to the department secretary for processing. All withdrawals must be processed by March 23, 2012. *February 8 is the last day to withdraw from PED courses meeting for the first half of the semester (January through March). April 10 is the last day to withdraw from PED courses meeting the second half of the semester (March through May).

Only those students obtaining permission from the Provost & Senior Vice President may withdraw from a class after March 23, 2012. (This can only be done for medical reasons or circumstances beyond their control.)

WITHDRAWING FROM THE COLLEGE

For complete withdrawals from the college, students must complete a withdrawal form with the College Completion Center, located in Clark Hall.
