President's Report

- **a.** Report on Staff Activities Mary Alltop announced that Dennis Taylor, Vice Chancellor for Administration at the Higher Education Policy Commission, visited campus on April 12th and 13th to present the compensation plan to classified staff. Mary also hosted the ACCE monthly meeting on April 13th at GSC. She indicated that Staff Council will be holding elections this month to elect the ACCE and Board of Governors representative.
- **b.** Report on Faculty Activities Dr. Joe Evans reported that the Senate adopted a policy regarding consensual relationships and worked on the student assessment of learning policy. Faculty will hold elections this month to elect the Board of Governors and ACF representative.
- **c. Report on Student Activities** Jamie Field reported that the Spring formal was held last Saturday and went very well.
- **d. Report on GSC Foundation** President Barr asked the Board to review the GSC Foundation report included in the Board book. He also referenced the latest Legislative Summary also included in the Board book.
- **e. Quarterly Financial Report** President Barr discussed the quarterly financial report which was disseminated to the Board.
- **f. Update on Enrollment Management** Dr. Debra Harrison reported that the Office of Admissions has received 929 applications for enrollment. She announced that Open House is scheduled for April 21st.
 - President Barr announced that Dr. Harrison turned in a resignation effective May 15th to pursue a position at Salem International University.
- **g. Miscellaneous Updates from the President** President Barr distributed and discussed a partial list of activities which have taken place since the last Board meeting. He noted that the legislature approved

\$400,000 funding for the White Paper he presented to the Governor. Selected Delegates and Senators assisted in getting this approved. He presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding a comparison of GSC's peer institutions. President Barr announced that another Superintendents' Workshop is scheduled for April 20th.

Committee Reports

Business and Finance Committee

Terry Butcher reported that the committee considered the proposed resolutions for the science building renovations and increased tuition for resident and non-resident students.

IT WAS MOVED BY TERRY BUTCHER THAT THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS APPROVE TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF \$4,500,000 THROUGH THE ISSUANCE OF CAPITAL REVENUE BONDS TO COMPLETE THE RENOVATION OF THE SCIENCE BUILDING. FRED RADABAUGH SECONDED THE MOTION.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

IT WAS MOVED BY TERRY BUTCHER THAT THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS APPROVE A 7.5% INCREASE IN THE REGULAR RESIDENT TUITION AND A 7.5% INCREASE IN REGULAR NON-RESIDENT TUITION FOR THE 2007-2008 ACADEMIC YEAR. FRED RADABAUGH SECONDED THE MOTION.

Student and Academic Affairs Committee

Sue Morris reported that the committee considered the proposed action items. She asked Dr. Kathy Butler to discuss the programs further.

Dr. Butler explained the logistics of the Bachelor of Arts in Music program and pointed out that it will be the first program of its kind offered in the State of West Virginia.

Dr. Butler indicated that the certificate of completion programs were originally implemented for non-degree seeking students; however, students may later apply the credits to a regular degree program.
