
# Love Is...

You are my love, my friend.








Union fever has no cure, so it's too late for those of you who do everything but sleep there. But to those of you who have never entered the big doors of strange sights and laughter, there's still a chance.








Eye on target

# Baseball, Hot Dogs, Apple Pie . . .




