# Dance, Dance,





Union fever has no cure, so it's too late for those of you who do everything but sleep there. But to those of you who have never entered the big doors of strange sights and laughter, there's still a chance.









If Glenville had a nickel for each type of person that entered the Halls of Knowledge on our campus, and the nickels were laid side by side, the length would go on practically forever.




Glenville State is known as 'the friendly campus.' The students, faculty, administration and community have a terrific college to be proud of.


