## Buidingss

The opering of this college was fouglt for by many Gilmer County residents. Their efforts paid off with the formal opering on Jamuary 14, 1873 of the Normal School at Glewidte. The fiust dauses were keld in the court hoose. This facilty became too mall and money from the legislature made it pousible to build what was called the "Old Building" in 1885. In 1893 a dook tower was added. In 1893 the college name changed to the State Normed School. The present-dny Administration Building remains standing and in ure.

With mones appropriated from the legislature, the President's House was conitructed in 1929 for $\$ 20,000$. After this the college was renamed again in 1931 to Glewille State Teachers College.

As the college grew, need for more houling arose. A dormatory was completed in June, 1937 and was named ater the fiust principal, Louis Bencett. Money from the legillatiure permatted consturction of the two most nodern building in the state at the time. In 1939 the Science Hall was dedicated and put into use. In 1943 the college made is final name change, thus fat, to Glewille State College. In 1952 the Heathe and Physicad Eduration Building was dedicated as the most modern gynuratium, with two gymed, a swimeming pood, daustooms and offices.

In 1956 a dixing kall and student center was coniturcted. And in 1964 the building was enlarged and named the Pioneer Center. As of April 1990 it was rededicated to the Heflin Student Center. A womens hall was constucted in 1960 and in 1964 It was remodeled to kouse both men and women and another wing was added. Pickens Holl was nawed for Pearl Pichens. Dean of Wowen.

Karawha Hall was arquited in 1913 for dorms and a diring hall. This building used to ocoupy the ste of the Robert $F$. Kidd Library. The tibrary was completed in 1967 and nawed after the fourth college president.

On the ste neax present-day Clark Hall, Verowa Mapel Holl ued to be houling for 80 students is 1926. The odd library wat replaced by the new thbrary. In 1968 the name of the old librauy was changed to Clark Hall and was reconsturcted for dasscoomal.

The preesent-day Alumari House was previourly owned by Jokn Arbuckle. This man did many thingi for the college and when he died, his houle was bought by the Alumi Alucciation.

## Teachers Leave the Clossroom

Morch 7: Teachers Leave the Classroom. Teachers in five counties walked off the job on March 7, 1990. By March 8, teachers in 47 of West Virginia's 55 counties put down their pens, pencils, chalk and grade books for picket signs as the first teacher's strike in UV was in full swing. Many counties were forced to cancel class, while others operated with teachers who crossed the picket lines. Teachers walked off their jobs after the legislature and Governor Caperton refused to address any of the educational problems in the legislature. Teachers were upset over being 49th in the country on the pay scale, and the teachers retirement fund was already $\$ 300$ million in debt.
During the strike, the two teachers' Unions- West Virginia Education Association (WVEA) and the West Virginia Federation of Teaching and Gaston Caperton made three attempts to end the strike, but each proposal was either rejected or withdrawn. As things were beginning to "heat up" between the teachers and the Governor, State School Superintendent Henry Marockie

## UV's Roual Couple

June 8, 1989: WV's Roual Couple Divorce. On June 8, 1989 Governor Gaston Caperton announced he would seek divorce from his wife; however, Mrs. Dee Caperton beat her husband to it and filed on July 19. They were officially divorced after 23 years of marriage on October 24, 1989. In less than seven months from his divorce, Governor Caperton announced his engagement to Wheeling Sumphonu conductor Rachael Worby on May 11, 1990.

## Pete Rose



August 24, 1989: Pete Rose banned from baseball for gambling on the sport.
on March 14 decided to close schools in the state on March 15 and 16 for what he called a "cooling off" period. On Saturday March 17 the UVEA and WVFT agreed to end the strike when legislative leaders said they would ask Governor Caperton to call a special session to address long term education needs. Schools on Monday, March 19 began to return to normal when teachers returned to the classroom. The teachers' strike also affected many students here at Glenville State College. All student teaching, observations, and practicums were suspended during the strike. The education department then began to come up with alternatives to student teaching to guarantee timely graduation and certification in case the strike was prolonged.

All in all, the first teachers' strike in UV's history lasted less than two weeks and student teachers returned to the classroom on Wednesday. March 21, 1990.

## Arch Moore

Moy 8, 1990: Arch Moore Pleads Guiltu to Political Corruption. On Maỵ 8, 1990 former Governor Arch A. Moore, Jr. pled guilty to a five-count political corruption indictment. He rendered his plea to U. S. District Court Judge Walter Hoffman, who was called in from Norfolk, VA, after all WV federal judges had asked not to be assigned to the case. Moore pled guilty to two counts of tax fraud and one count each of extortion, mail fraud, and obstruction of justice. These crimes apparently took place during his 1984 campaign and his term as governor from 1985-89.

Moore was previously indicted in 1975. The former governor was sentenced July 10, 1990.

## Douglas

February 10, 1990: Douglas Breaks Tuson's Reign as Champ. James "Buster" Douglas knocked out undefeated heavyweight champion Mike Tyson in Tokyo, Japan.

## Noriega

December 20, 1989: U. S. Government Overthrows Manuel Noriega. President Bush sent troops to Panama to overthrow Noriega's government.
