PRESIDENT

Convocation

On August 18, Glenville State College held the first annual Convocation ceremony - a formal assembly for a specific purpose. The word "convocation" is based on a Latin phrase which means "to call together" and throughout history has been associated with religious or academic gatherings.

Distinguished representatives from Glenville, Gilmer County and West Virginia joined to offer greetings to the incoming class. Freshmen heard keynote speaker Chancellor Clifford Trump speak to the value of their upcoming education experiences. 



The Mace

The Glenville State College ceremonial mace was unveiled and presented March 15 to President Thomas Powell who said, "I accept this mace as a symbol of the authority of Glenville State College and I will ensure that the college community meets its responsibilities to the people of West Virginia." Powell then entrusted the mace to the new Faculty Marshals, who are responsible for campus traditions and ceremonies.

The tradition of the mace dates back to the earliest times of academia as a ceremonial symbol representing the legal and chartered authority of the college. When the mace is present, the authority of the college is present. For that reason, the mace will be present at all formal gatherings such as commencement and convocation, carried by the Chief Faculty Marshal.

The mace was created by Byron Johnson, a renowned wood carver and sculptor, from a design custom created for Glenville State College by retired art professor Charles Scott. A renowned ceramist with works displayed in the Smithsonian, Scott also created the ceramic pieces which adorn the walnut mace. The mace is topped by an 18-inch diameter cylinder with three carved images: the Pioneer, the original Administration Building and the state of West Virginia showing GSC's location. By combining the diameter of the cylinder (18 inches) with the height of the mace (72 inches) we are reminded of the date of our founding, 1872. Artistic inlays of holly and maple highlight the piece, which is topped with a bronze casting of the Glenville State College seal. Both the walnut and holly used in this piece came from college grounds.

"The mace reminds us that the power and the integrity of the college belongs to the people and is only entrusted to us for short periods of time. The mace serves to remind us of our calling and promise to society and that we, as a community, are vested with special responsibilities," stated President Powell.

When not present in public, the mace will be on display in the President's Office in a custom built case, which was also created from wood from the college campus, and was built by the college physical plant staff.


Commencement








Division of Business

This division offers both four-year and two year programs with emphasis on life-long learning and personal and professional development. Modern technology and current software are integrated thoroughly in each program.



Division of Education


The Division of Education is the foundation upon which Glenville State College was built. Since its founding in 1872, GSC has been regarded as a premiere institution of teacher education. There is at least one GSC graduate in every county school system in West Virginia, and Wood County employs 312.

The mission of this department is to prepare students to become exceptional educators for the future. Programs of study include elementary education, adolescent education, and special education with many specializations. Certification obtained by graduates will allow them to teach in West Virginia and all over the world.

Course work is updated providing the student with new technologies and the most recent educational methodologies. Through the cooperation of the surrounding school systems, students have many opportunities to interact in the classroom by observing teachers, participating in read aloud programs, and tutoring. Within the division there are two faculty- advised student organizations, the Student Education Association (SEA) and the Kappa Omicron Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, an international honor society.

Division of Fine Arts

The Division of Fine Arts is one of the most visually active divisions at Glenville State College and is housed in the Fine Arts Center -- a modern multimillion dollar, multi-use facility. Students have access to a large, modern stage, a first-class recital hall, the largest art gallery in central West Virginia, state-of-the-art practice rooms, and numerous classrooms for both specialized and general learning. Additionally, the art department has a darkroom, a fully equipped ceramic shop, and a newly remodeled art classroom.

The Division of Fine Arts prepares graduates for a variety of opportunities in our state and the nation. Students are prepared for an exit evaluation (performance, exhibit, or recital) which indicates an advanced level of achievement and training.

This division provides the community with a way to participate in college activities. Stage productions and art exhibits welcome people of all ages, backgrounds and origins. The Oral Communications students compete frequently in forensics conferences, and there are several theater productions each year. Student and professional art exhibits are presented throughout the year in the Gallery. The music department has many ensembles for student participation and has received the Peaks of Excellence Award.



Division of Land Resources


The Division of Land Resources offers “hands-on” associate degree programs preparing graduates for a wide variety of career opportunities in the state and region. The division has ready access to about 300 acres of forested land where field exercises replicate real world projects in all programs. In addition, the nearby Cedar Creek State Park, Gilmer County Recreation Center, and other private landowners offer cooperative land holdings for field exercises.

A wide array of global positioning systems (GPS) and other electronic measuring instruments, timber harvesting equipment, a sawmill, and air, water and soil analysis equipment are available for students in their respective programs. The division also has a modern computer lab with the appropriate software to replicate technology currently used by employers in all program areas.

The Division of Land Resources faculty possess the necessary credentials, professional license or registration, and work experience to provide high-quality educational experience for students. Many draw upon personal professional field experiences to develop teaching strategies that provide for a high-level learning environment. Much value is placed on making time for students for career counseling, advising, and problem solving.

Division of Language and Literature


The ability to read, write, and think critically is fundamental to success in college and beyond. The Division of Language and Literature seeks to develop this ability through the college's core curriculum.

Division of Physical Education





Division of Science and Mathematics


The Division of Science and Mathematics' recently-remodeled chemistry lab houses a new infrared ultraviolet visible spectrophotometer and a high pressure liquid chromatography machine. The biology lab is equipped with two big screen televisions that are connected to computers, enabling the instructor and students to participate in projects using the Internet and execute computer presentations.

Science and Math graduates leave prepared to enter professional schools of their chosen field. A wide variety of employment opportunities exists as well; our graduates are employed as teachers, nurses, pharmacists and lab technicians. In addition to the public schools, graduates are employed at the state Division of Natural Resources, the state Division of Environmental Protection, and the state police forensics lab.

There are three student organizations that are advised by faculty; The American Chemical Society, Pioneers in Nursing, and Chi Beta Phi (a science and math honorary).







Division of Social Science



The programs offered by the Division of Social Science have a common concern with human behavior and share the belief that human behavior, culture, and society can, and should, be studied through the methods of science.





RFK Library

The Robert F. Kidd Library houses information that students depend on for their research. There is constant access to the Internet and a data base that provides an array of journals containing academic literature. Professors include lessons in their agenda that teach students how to access the online catalog. Interlibrary loans and consistently-updated materials are always an option.










Pioneer Football

FALL

A season highlighted by two exciting home victories on each end of the schedule, Glenville State's 1999 football campaign can only be described as a roller coaster ride. The fall season began with the Pioneers overtaking California, Pa., and the season ended with a win over West Liberty. During the season, the Pioneers were the only WVIAC team to even threaten conference champion Shepherd College, who defeated GSC 22-17 at Pioneer Stadium. The Ram's next closest game was 32 points. Throughout the season, the Pioneers played well, finishing the 1999 football season with five wins, and six losses.

Two GSC players earned first team All-WVIAC honors; freshman tailback Thaddeus Hampton with 925 rushing yards, and senior offensive lineman Mike Frank. 
Men's Basketball


This year's Men's Basketball Team finished the season with a respectable 12 wins and 15 losses. The Pioneers were led by All Conference Player Salim Lazreg and seniors David Davis, Henry Hurst, Tommy Ewing, Aaron Clark, junior Petrus Hawkins, sophomore Chad Drennen, and freshmen Josh Foster and Jacob Tolley. Other players for the Pioneers include James Arnold, Chad Tingler, Jeremy Wolfe, Erik Butler, Andy Laible, and Rich Swiger.

The Pioneers finished sixth in the conference and headed to Charleston, only to lose to nationally-ranked Salem Teikyo University. During the year the pioneers upset WVIAC Champion University of Charleston, handing UC its only loss. The Pioneers will graduate four players this season, however top returnees hope to improve their record and make another run at the WVIAC tournament.

Salim Lazreg was named second team all WVIAC and Josh Foster named to the WVIAC all-freshman team. Lazreg led the Pioneers in scoring with a 14.5 average, while Chad Drennen averaged 11.4, David Davis 10.6, and Pete Hawkins 10.2. David Davis finished 3rd in the WVIAC in rebounding with a 9.1 average. The Pioneers' rebuilding process under third-year coach Bob Williams has paid dividends as GSC has gone from a thirteenth-place finish in the WVIAC in 1998 to a sixth-place finish in 2000.

The highlight during a tripleheader day of basketball January 29, 2000 was the renaming of Pioneer Gymnasium in honor of former basketball head coach Jesse R. Lilly Jr. prior to the men's game. Lilly was a Beckley native who graduated from GSC in 1948, became GSC's basketball coach for one season in 1961-1962, served as football coach from 1962 through 1966, and then took over as permanent head coach of the basketball team in 1966. His teams won the WVIAC tournament championship in 1970 and 1972 and was named coach of the year in 1972.




Women's Basketball

The 1999-2000 Women's Basketball Team finished with a 20-9 record. They earned second in the WVIAC regular season and runner-up in the WVIAC tournament. Four all-conference players, Colleen McBrien, Sabrina Stout, Kelly Osborn and Tammy Spence led the Lady Pioneers this season. Joining All-Conference members were senior co-captain Tara Rutherford, sophomore Christy Crow and freshmen Samantha Williams, Leah Whitley, and Chrissy Richards.

The Lady Pioneers went undefeated at home, with a 10-0 record, and finished strong, winning fifteen of the last eighteen games. The Lady Pioneers earned a first round bye in the tournament, sending them to Charleston, where they defeated West Virginia State and West Virginia Wesleyan, but eventually fell to West Liberty in the championship game. 

HIGHLIGHTS

Forty-eight Glenville State College student athletes were awarded academic honors for the fall 1999 semester. These students, representing nearly one-third of the students in GSC's athletic programs, achieved a 3.50-4.00 GPA to be named to the President's List or achieved a 3.00-3.49 GPA to be named to the Director's List. Four of ten athletic teams, Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball, Golf, and Volleyball, scored team GPAs of 3.0 or higher.

"These honor students epitomize the true meaning of the words student athlete," said Tim Carney, Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and chair of the Division of Physical Education. "Our athletes are excelling both on the field and in the classroom."

Janet Bailey, senior women's administrator of the GSC athletic department, served as a crew chief for United States Olympic Committee drug testing clinics. In this role, she oversaw random drug testing for U.S. athletes aspiring to compete in both the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney, Australia, and in the 2002 Winter Games in Salt Lake City.

Freshman Ben Hiener made Glenville State College sports history last May by earning an individual berth in the NCAA Division II golf championships held in Valdosta, Ga. The GSC golf team finished ranked 17th in the country according to Division II polls.










Organizations






