



Basketball Resume

Although beaten in the opening round of the WVIAC tournament for the third straight year, Glenville's 1953-54 Pioneers showed a decided improvement over the previous season by winning 11 games against 14 defeats, including the tournament engagement.

During the 1952-53 campaign the Gee Men won only eight of 23 encounters and finished deep in the second division of the WVIAC. This season the White Wave got off to a slow start, losing nine games in their first 12 outings.

The Gee Men found themselves at mid-season, however, and played winning ball the remainder of the season, capturing seventh place in the league standings with a 10-12 mark. Glenville split their two non-conference tilts, beating the Alumni for the sixth straight season, and losing a heart-breaking 80-79 squeeker to Marietta's Ohio conference champions.

Under their new mentor, Dr. Peter Wisher, the Gee Men entered the Buckhannon classic with optimism running at a fever pitch. Unfortunately, the Pioneers ran into West Liberty on the Hilltopper's greatest night. Led by all-tourney selection Myles Witchey, the panhandle quintet ran roughshod over the Wave, leaving little doubt to the outcome as early as the second period when the Hilltoppers raced to a 41-19 half time margin. Witchey continued his great scoring thrusts throughout the final two sessions and West Liberty coasted into the semi-finals with an 81-63 triumph over the Pioneers.

For the third successive season the White Wave was led by "Dynamite" Jack Tennant, Fairview's contribution to Glenville. Although off to a slow start, Tennant found the scoring range at mid-season and led the Gee Men in their late surge into the conference first division.

The Pioneer forward tallied better than 400 points for the third straight season, carding 448 points for the 1953-54 season, an average of 17.9 points during the regular season campaign.

Tennant's spurt in the latter stages of the year raised his career figure to 1,425 points, an average of 18.3 points a game for the three seasons he has been the mainstay of the Glenville hoop corps.

Finishing behind Tennant was the year's freshman find, Bill Reit, importee from McKeesport, Pa. Reit enjoyed tremendous success as a yearling, scoring 287 points

for an average of 11.4 points a game. In addition, Reit led the squad in field goal and foul shooting percentages and was second in defensive rebounding.

Elkview's Harry Smith, returning after a two-year stint in the Army, finished behind Tennant and Reit with 224 points, the only other Pioneer to go over the 200-point mark. In addition to being the team's third-ranking scorer, Smith was one of the league's top rebounders with 147.

With only Merriman and Barrett graduating this year, the future looks bright for the 1954-55 season. The team was blessed this year with an unusually large crop of outstanding first-year men. Reit came straight from McKeesport Vocational high school to land a starting berth on the team at the start of the season. Bob Weaver, another Army veteran, began to find himself in the final phase of the season to land a starting berth. Jim Hamrick, a transfer from West Virginia University, showed up extremely well during the year, giving indication of future greatness. Another freshman, Alan Reich, a graduate of Theodore Roosevelt high school in New York City, proved to be a top-flight reserve — and came through in several crucial contests, most notable being the Tech encounter when he scored 18 points.

Although the future looks bright for next season, the team will sorely miss the guiding hands of Don Merriman and Dickie Barrett, a pair of veterans who have been on the Glenville scene for four years.

A native of Glenfield, Pa., Merriman established himself as one of the finest allaround athletes ever to represent the Gee Men. Excelling in football and baseball, as well as basketball, the affable Merriman climaxed his career with 113 points, an average of 4.9 points a game. Although he saw action in only 23 contests, Merriman ranked third in the rebounding department with 98.

Barrett's 182 point total for the past season raised his career total to 877 points, eighth highest in Pioneer hoop annals. Dick tallied 33 as a freshman, 301 as a sophomore, and 361 in his junior season for an average of 10.8 points a game for his four-year career. The diminutive Barrett, a product of Glenville high school, always played his greatest in the crucial games, averaging better than 15 points a game in his last three tourney appearances.


