Glenville State Normal School originated in an act of the legislature, February 19, 1872, as a branch of the State Normal School of Huntington, W. Va. The act provided for the establishment of the school with the understanding that the citizens of the town would donate suitable buildings. The first Normal building was a two-story frame dwelling so changed in the interior as to serve the purpose of a school building. From such meager beginnings, GSC has grown to, we believe, one of the most outstanding state colleges in W. Va. By authorization of the State Board of Education in 1931, Glenville Normal became Glenville State Teachers College, offering a four-year program leading to a degree, first conferred in 1931. In 1944, because of the many additions to the school's curricula, the name of the school was further shortened and changed to Glenville State College.

During the fourteen years of Dr. Heflin's administration great growth has taken place in Glenville State College. It is deeply rooted in the interests and affections of thousands who think with pride and pleasure of the "Lighthouse on the Hill."



AGRICULTURE

To meet the demand for work leading to a degree in agriculture, GSC offers a course of study giving two years of credit toward this degree. The program is approved by the College of Agriculture at West Virginia University. After having completed two years in the field of agriculture at GSC, students go to WVU to receive the other two years of their education.

The training offered in agriculture is adapted to fit the student for farm life or professional and business fields. Graduates may enjoy farming as managers or as farm owners, in the teaching of agriculture in high schools or colleges, in extension work as county agents or specialists, in research work in experiment stations or other organizations, or in many of the federal activities in aid of agriculture. They may engage in business related to farming, such as dairy manufacturing, meat processing, seed and nursery stock, feeds and fertilizers, or marketing.

BUSINESS EDUCATION

The business education department of Glenville State College is one of the largest departments on campus. It now employs two instructors, Mrs. Genevieve Butcher and Mrs. Dorothy Peterson. It offers a variety of business classes; such as typing, shorthand, office practice, salesmanship, and retailing. A four-year teacher's degree is available and also some classes for business administration. A special A. A. (Associate of Arts) degree is given for two-year secretarial science students.

The Division of Education and Psychology has as its main purpose the providing of professional experiences, training and background for students who plan to enter the teaching field. More specifically these purposes are: (1) To provide for an introduction to teaching and an understanding of the school system. (2) To provide an understanding of the physical, mental and social development of the child and the principles governing his learning at all levels. (3) To provide a thorough understanding of desirable practices and principles of teaching, learning, and evaluating pupil progress and skill in adapting subject matter and learning materials to various levels of child development. (4) To provide the best possible teaching experiences under supervision so that the student teacher may achieve maximum growth.

MUSIC

The Music Department is perhaps one of the busiest units on the Glenville State College campus. With a full curriculum for both its majors and minors, it offers the ambitious student a rich and diversified musical education. Classes in music history, theory, conducting, teaching methods, as well as applied study and small and large ensemble training are provided for the future music teacher. For the non-music student, music appreciation and ensemble training are available.

Instrumental ensembles include the 50-piece marching and concert band, woodwind quintet, brass ensemble and orchestra. Vocal groups include the 85-voice college choir, the Glenechoes (a madrigal group), the Men's Varsity Quartet, and the Girls' Quartet. All of these instrumental and vocal ensembles perform off campus as well as for Glenville audiences.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The department of physical education offers a professional training curriculum leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science; a service, recreational, and intramural program for all students; and a teacher-training curriculum leading to the Bachelor of Arts degree in Education.

The service program offers men and women a variety of activities designed to meet the needs of students. The chief objectives of this program are (1) to correct and ameliorate handicaps, (2) to develop fundamental motor abilities, (3) to develop physical fitness, (4) to teach recreational activities, (5) to develop an appreciation of physical fitness and sports, (6) to realize the proper and important place of physical education in the educational program, and (7) to develop desirable character and social traits.

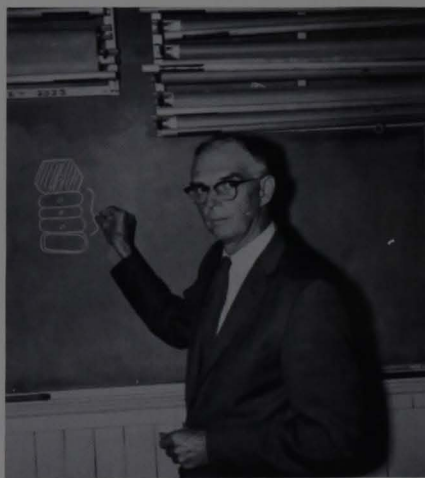
SCIENCE

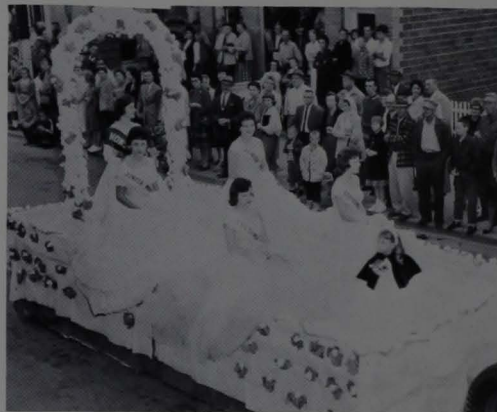

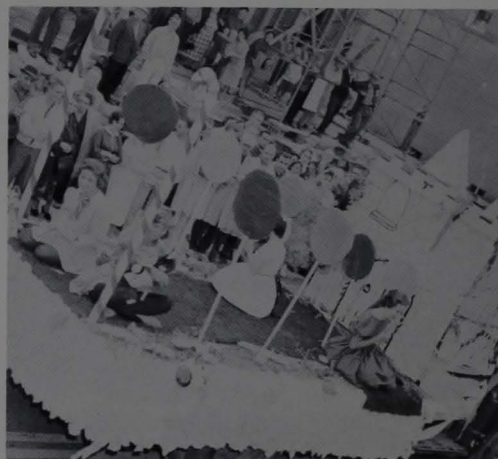

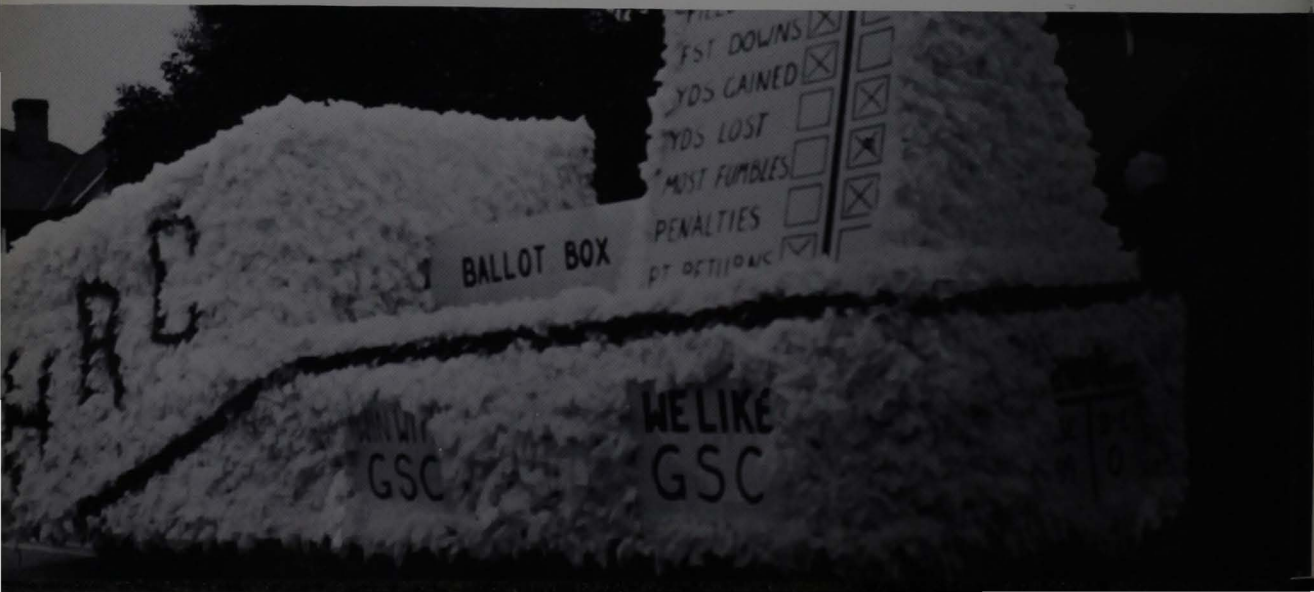
