






### . . . TO LEARN

## SCIENCE

The science department of Glenville State College offers B.S. and A.B. degrees in fields of mathematics, biology, chemistry, and physical science.

The Science Hall is well equipped with laboratories and classrooms to meet student needs. Students are also given an opportunity for doing research work.



#### ART

In the art department of Glenville
State College, art is considered as it
applies to the home, the community,

### HOME ECONOMICS

Women majoring in Home Economics have instruction in sewing, food preparation, marriage, and home management. Students are then given an opportunity to experience what they have learned by spending a term in the home management house where each girl is given basic responsibilities of the home.



### LANGUAGE

French, English, and speech are the three areas making up the language department of Glenville

State College. Nine professors express a genuine concern and deep desire to develop a clear, correct style of communication in all students attending the college.



### **MUSIC**

The Music Department of Glenville State College has one of the
smallest enrollments in the college.
This year the department has an
enrollment of 30 music majors.

The music department is steadily growing and provisions are being made to expand it even more next year with the addition of a fourth member to the teaching staff.





The Social Studies Division is, perhaps, the largest academic division at Glenville State College, having a full time teaching staff of seven and a total student enrollment of 312.

The general objective of instruction in social studies is the attainment of a broad understanding of human society and of its various and complex interrelationships. The students may view the complexities of modern society aided by perspectives and insights gained by studying economics, history, geography, political science, sociology and integrated social science courses which attempt to interrelate the various academic disciplines.

Among the duties carried out in the Division of Education are the teaching of courses in professional education, the regulation of admission of students to a program of teacher education, and the administration and supervision of student teaching, the operation of a pre-student teaching laboratory experience program and a kindergarten for children of the community.

The program of physical education at Glenville State College is organized and administered to help prepare students to take their places as responsible, productive citizens in our democratic society.

Intercollegiate athletics are conducted to enable students to participate in competitive sports, to provide a laboratory for the preparation of future coaches and teachers of physical education, to promote individual physical development, and to provide additional opportunities for developing leadership.


