
Born in Glenville, West Virginia, on February 19, 1872, Glenville State College began her career as a state Normal School for the education of the people in the local area. Not only did she educate in the teaching arts, but included in her duties was general education, including primary and secondary grades.

She began her duties as a converted dwelling located on the same land, and on the same spot, as the present Administration Building. From the time of her birth to the present, she has continued to grow. This growth can be noted by the numerous buildings on campus.

But an institution does not simply grow because it is here. It is the result of the people who were actively involved with her, for only through people can growth be accomplished.

Thus, it is to the college and the people involved with her that we dedicate this edition. However, it is not just to those of the past, but also to those of the future to whom we dedicate this, the


Thomas Marcellus Marshall served as Acting Principal of the Glenville Branch of the State Normal School at its opening on January 14, 1873, was First Assistant to the Principal, Louis Bennett, during the two years following the first term, and then served as Principal of this Normal School to 1881. This school began in an era of depression and consequently suffered from a lack of financial support. One year the State Legislature failed to appropriate any funds for the operation of Glenville Normal School prior to its scheduled opening date. Marshall was able to get his faculty to join him in keeping the school in operation by serving without pay until the necessary appropriations were obtained. During that time, Marshall personally dug coal from a local coal bank for the heating of the school building and performed all the janitorial services for which the State later paid him the sum of eleven dollars. He also managed to sell apples from the campus orchard to defray some of the school's financial obligations. That Glenville State College has had a century of uninterrupted service and progress has been due, in no small measure to the fortitude and purposeful dedication of this



On October the eighth, 1926, the Ohnimgohow Players, a dramatic club, was organized under the direction of Miss Margaret Dobson. The name of the organization—Ohnimgohow Players—was suggested by one of the charter members of the group from an Indian word suggesting Kanawha.

Since 1926 the players have maintained an active interest in dramatics. In the years from 1932 to 1934 three-act plays were presented in the College. Stunt Night—formerly an annual event of great interest—was sponsored by the Ohnimgohow Players previous to the past two years.

Although the Club is not directly concerned with the State Speech Festival members of the organization have always numbered among the cast of the plays given by the College.

He prefers to wear old clothes while engaged in the business of looking after the buildings; but when he travels, he not only avails himself of the best means of transportation, but he likes to wear good clothing, selecting only materials of the best quality. In addition to his other qualities, George has a keen sense of humor. Almost without exception, students who have attended the College recall occasions when he quietly poked fun at them through the medium of a tall story.

He has taken three extended vacations, one to New York City where he visited many places of interest; one to the St. Louis Exposition; and a third through the West, stopping over at Yellowstone National Park, Cheyenne, Cripple Creek, and Denver.

The greatest tribute that can be paid to any individual is the measure of his devotion to duty; his worth as a citizen; and his contribution to the progress of society. By this standard, George ranks high. He has given unstintingly of his time and effort in providing the right physical surroundings for the students in the College. He has

always been sympathetic with the student of limited means, even to the extent of giving financial aid. He has set an example of kindness, good humor, honesty, and forthright simplicity that has not only had a wholesome effect upon the students, but has won for him the affection and esteem of all those who know him.

george firestone

a graduate of the school of experience, an ardent supporter of education, and one held high in the affectionate regard of the students, alumni, and instructors of Glenville State Teachers College, was born in Lewis County sixty-nine years ago.

He was appointed custodian of the Old Building by Robert Ruddell, member of the Board of Trustees, and Robert Carr, member of the Board of Regents, and assumed his duties in the autumn of 1894, under Principle W. J. Holden. At that time the Old Building, nucleus of the many which now adorn the campus, had been in use only one year. When President Rohrbough assumed his duties as president of the institution in 1908, George, his faithful lieutenant, regulated class periods by tapping a large dinner bell placed outside the building.

During his career of more than forty-two years of service with the school, George has always been popular with the students and instructors because of his unfailing kindness and good humor, his sympathetic interest in the problems of the students, his rugged honesty, and his unswerving devotion to duty. As evidence of his popularity, the Holy Roller Court, in October, 1935, granted him the first honorary membership ever granted by that organization.

In 1932, George became an honorary member of the Chemistry Club. In appreciation of this honor, he donated a beautiful display case to the physical science department of the College. Firestone Lodge, one of the newer buildings on the campus, was named in his honor.

George sponsored the graduating class of 1925, and entertained the members with a dinner in







The purpose of the 1972 KANAWHACHEN is to present a book for the college — to portray how the college was, how it is, and hopefully how it will be in the future. With the closing of the 1971-1972 school year we bring to a close 100 years of education at Glenville State College. In the second section, the staff felt the necessity to continue the chronological order, using the 1971-1972 school year events. Beginning with the first event of the year, the Centennial Opening Convocation, and terminating with the Centennial Graduation Exercises, we have again tried to show the very heart of Glenville State College — not placid faces staring from a page, but students actively involved in making Glenville a place to remember.

With the graduation of the senior class another year of education closes, as well as the first 100 formative years of the college. Although it is good that we look to the past for guidance we must look to the future also, for that is where we are to live. May we live our lives with love for our fellows so there may be 100 more centennial years for Glenville State College to celebrate.
