Glenville State captures MEC title



Glenville State knocked off second-seeded Fairmont State, 65-58 in the March 8, 2015 championship game of the Mountain East Conference men's basketball tournament at the Charleston Civic Center in what was the first Conference Title for GSC since 1972.


Glenville's Donte Morales scored a game high 21 points and grabbed four rebounds. He was named MVP of the MEC Tournament. GSC's Sedric Nady scored 15 points while Reggie Williams and Brett Morris both chipped in with 10 points each. Morris also grabbed a game high 11 rebounds as he finished with a double-double. Thomas Wimbush, lead scorer for the Falcons garnered 19 points and 10 rebounds.

Glenville State ousted top-seeded West Liberty in the Semifinals the evening before, 83-68.

Both Glenville and Fairmont earned at-large berths to the NCAA Division II Regional Tournament which was hosted by West Liberty because of their top-seed status going into the MEC Tournament. The Pioneers' first game at the Regionals, however, brought their season to an end when they fell to IUP (Indiana University of Pennsylvania) 73-53.

Regardless, the Glenville State Pioneers (22-11), head coach Stephen Dye, and assistant coaches **Justin Caldwell '14** and **Bill Lilly '82** had a terrific season as they finished with the best record in school history since becoming a member of the NCAA Division II and also winning a Conference Tournament Championship, the first championship in 43 years and that one in 1972 under Bill's father, Curtis Elam Inaugural Hall of Fame Inductee **Jesse R. Lilly, Jr. '48**.

Heffelfinger Gives Keynote Address in Inaugural Winter Ceremony

Glenville College's State first full commencement ceremony took place on Saturday, December 13, 2014. The graduates, officially part of the Class of 2015, completed requirements for an Associate or Bachelor's Degree in a variety of academic areas including business, criminal justice, teacher education, and natural resource management among others. The grads were made up of approximately 90 students who completed their degrees in July and December 2014. The students were from several counties throughout West Virginia as well as seven other states (California, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, New York, Tennessee, and Virginia).

GSC Unveils Three New Majors

Students at Glenville State College now have the opportunity to take classes in the field of Health of Human Performance and major in three new programs: exercise science, health promotion, and athletic conditioning and coaching. There is a dramatic increase in the need for health professionals. The Health and Human Performance program offers students multiple paths in order to pursue this need.

Students who complete their degree in exercise science will have a strong foundation in the life sciences which will prepare them for a variety of professional environments including: cardiac rehabilitation, personal training, cardio pulmonary

technologist, collegiate strength and conditioning coach, and pharmaceutical sales representative.

Coursework in the health promotion major will teach students the skills to work in a number of public health settings including: corporate/worksite wellness, public health agencies, hospital based health agencies, community health programs, and chronic disease health promotion program coordinator. The athletic conditioning and coaching major will prepare students for entry-level positions in collegiate strength and conditioning, tactical strength and conditioning, athletic recruiting, and sport coaching.

Glenville State College has invested around \$60,000 in new equipment for the programs. In addition to devices like blood sugar and lactic acid monitors and testing kits for functional movement, the department has also added other specialized equipment including a Vertec vertical jump measurement device, a dynamometer to measure hand strength, two high-end stationary bikes, and a research-grade treadmill with monitoring equipment from Parvo Medics; all will be part of the arsenal of tools available to students. The new department is housed in the refurbished Health and Physical Education Building.

The equipment and classroom furnishings were purchased with funds from a recent gift from **Mike** '73 and **Nancy Rust**. Their generous support follows the donation last year that was used to fund the Nancy Lemon Rust Nursing Scholarship. "Mike and Nancy's continued support of health field initiatives here at Glenville State College is greatly appreciated in the current climate of decreasing state funding. This Health and Human Performance initiative would not

have been possible without their support," said Dennis Pounds, Vice President for College Advancement.

These new degree programs, along with the physical education (PreK-adult) and pre-nursing programs, have been organized under GSC's new department of Health and Physical Education. Archived Films Being Converted for Online Viewing



Thanks in part to a West Virginia Humanities Council grant, staffers in the Glenville State College Archives have been working to digitize several old 8- and 16-mm films. Work on the project of converting the films mostly progressed this past summer with workers continuing to add to the varied collection. The materials have included footage from Glenville State College football games from the 1960s through 1980s, mid-century homecoming parades, pre-WV State Folk Festival Gilmer County music festivals, documentaries regarding local culture, and more.



Many of the 16-mm reals already in the Archives' holdings were collected by former GSC First Ladies Irene Powell and Sandy Freeman. GSC Library Associate and Archivist **Jason Gum** '05 stated that the majority of the collection features past football games and were actually discovered earlier. "These more recent reels were found in the back of a storage trailer that was being torn down for construction of the Waco Center. GSC's Athletic Director **Janet Bailey** '79 is always mindful when she sees such things and called me to look the materials over. We've now been able to add them to our collection while also making

them widely accessible", said Gum. Gum explains that on average there is anywhere from 45 minutes to an hour of labor dedicated to each film. So far nearly 200 reels of film have been converted – with nearly as many hours devoted to the project.



Several of the newly digital files have been uploaded to the GSC website and are viewable via YouTube. According to Gum, the Glenville State College Archives, which is housed in the Robert F. Kidd Library, is always looking for additional historical audio/visual materials that relate to the institution.

GSC Graphic Design Students Complete Project for NASA IV & V Facility

Students in the college's Fine Arts Department recently completed an eye-catching new display to use during career fairs, conferences, and meetings for

the staff of NASA's Independent Verification and Validation (IV&V) Facility in Fairmont.

"NASA contacted us in early October of last year with a general request for the graphics. Seeing this as a tremendous learning opportunity for the students, we took on the challenge for the Intermediate Art and Design Class. NASA accepted and we provided them with a small brief on how the process works for design. NASA then gathered all the relevant ideas and wording needed for us to begin," explained GSC Assistant Professor of Art Chris Cosner.

The GSC graphic artists took part in the student design activity which was introduced by Justin Smith from NASA's facility. The students were given a lot of latitude with the creative look for the display and were only given an approximate size and some marketing guidelines to observe in their process. Throughout the end of the fall semester, the class produced three draft designs and submitted them. With some fine-tuning and input from NASA staffers, the end result took shape.

"We wanted something that would express NASA's well-established brand while having the ability to attract their audience by standing out among other displays. The students researched NASA's extensive library of images and working closely with NASA's Style Guide, we were able to start bringing the design together. The students learned the entire process of working with a real client from start to finish and shared in the success of the project which will add a valuable piece to their portfolio when seeking employment after college," continued Cosner.

"I'm happy to have been a part of the group that prepared this display for NASA. We were all really interested after Professor Cosner shared the idea with us and we researched the NASA website and some of their photo galleries to narrow down our ideas. It's great to see how nicely the finished project turned out," said Ryan Singleton, a senior art major who took part in preparing the graphic.

NASA's Smith recently brought the completed display, along with a commemorative plaque featuring the artwork that the students designed, to GSC so that the class could see how it turned out. They called it a "win-win situation for both groups involved" and said that they were very appreciative of how interested the Glenville State College student designers were in the project. The plaque is now on display in the GSC Fine Arts Center.

Cosner says that the graphics and digital media concentration often gets several design requests similar to this one throughout the semester and, if time and lessons permit, they try to incorporate them into the class. "The Graphics and Digital Media Concentration is now in its third year at GSC and the students have gained the knowledge and confidence to tackle these types of projects. As our enrollment, space, and equipment continues to improve, we hope there will be even more time for community engagement and real-world projects including the use of our brand-new 3D printer," said Cosner.




Minton Named Outstanding Faculty Member

A Bit of College History...

Glenville State College was established by an act of the Legislature on February 19, 1982, as the "Glenville Branch of the State Normal School. This was conditioned on the securing of a suitable building by the local citizens without cost to the State. Until the first building could to be erected on recently purchased land, the first session began on January 14, 1873 in the old Gilmer County courthouse. The school became Glenville Normal School in 1898. On May 1, 1930, the State Board of Education authorized the school to award the Bachelor of Arts in Education degree and on March 4, 1931, the State Legislature changed its name to Glenville State Teachers College. In 1943, the Legislature changed the name to Glenville State College. Certificates and degrees in the early years were in Teacher Education

Five Inducted into GSC's Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame

Five individuals were inducted into the Glenville State College Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame during the college's annual Hall of Fame banquet and induction ceremony on Saturday, May 16, 2015. The 2015 inductees, all graduates of Glenville State College, were Dick Barrett '55, Tom Coates '78, Leandis Hodges, Jr. '79, Larry Taylor '84 and Paul Grier, Jr. '91.

Dick Barrett '55, a native of Glenville, excelled in football, basketball and baseball at Glenville High School where he played each sport for four years; also at Glenville State College where he lettered 13 times. He served as quarterback for the Pioneers; as point

guard for the Pioneer basketball team where he was known as "sparkplug" for energizing his team; as short stop, second baseman, and outfielder for GSC's baseball team and as a golfer.

Dick was a freshman on the 1950-51 WVIAC Basketball Championship team when they went to Kansas City for the NAIA Championship. His career total in basketball was 877 points, eighth highest in Pioneer hoop annals at the time. He tallied 33 points as a freshman, 301 as a sophomore, 361 in his junior season and 182 as a senior for an average of 10.8 points a game during his college career.

The diminutive Barrett always played his greatest in the crucial games, averaging better than 15 points a game in his last three basketball tourney appearances.

He began officiating in college and worked his way up to being one of the top ranked officials in Northern Virginia by 1965. Over the next 16 years, Barrett worked finals of a district and regional tournament each year. From 1970-81, he was selected to work in nine Virginia state high school tournaments before health issues forced him to give up refereeing. Dick retired in July 1987 and returned to his native Glenville where he can be found on the golf course most every day. He averages 200 rounds per year.

Tom Coates '78 was a two year basketball transfer from Allegheny Community College in Pennsylvania. He was inducted into that schools' Hall of Fame in 2008.

He led the Pioneers in scoring and rebounding during the 1976-77 season, received 1977 Honorable Mention All-American status, First Team WVIAC ALL-Conference in 1977 and was a member of the 1977 WVIAC ALL-Tournament Team.

Coates scored 470 points in 1975-76 and 479 points in 1976-77. His 46 points in the 1977 Glenville vs Alderson Broaddus game was the highest single game point production at the time. He was the 1978 winner of Glenville State's prestigious Montrose Award and was in a couple NBA camps until their final cut, specifically the New Orleans Jazz and the Detroit Pistons.

Coates continues to play in the American Old Timers League, Pittsburgh chapter and was named MVP when his Pittsburgh team captured the American Old Timers League Championship for the 2013 season. He works at Pressley Ridge in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania as a Family Specialist.

Leandis Hodges, Jr. '79, a native of Virginia Beach, Virginia, was named WVIAC Offensive Player of the Week on numerous occasions throughout his college football career. He received All-American status as a Running Back in 1976 (NAIA), this selection placing him in a very elite group of GSC football players to have been recognized for this prestigious national honor.

He rushed for over 1,351 yards his junior year, making him the third leading single season rushing leader in Glenville State College history; a record that he still holds. Hodges also remains 6th on the Career Rushing Yardage Leader Chart with 1947 yards which he also accumulated in 1976. He scored the first touchdown at Pioneer Stadium (now known as Morris Stadium) against Gardner-Webb College in the opening game of the 1977 season.

Known as one of the friendliest students on campus, Hodges exhibited the character traits that are emblematic of a GSC student athletic and with his excellent leadership skills, served as co-captain of the 1977 Pioneer football team.

He is employed by the US Department of Treasury, Bureau of Printing and Engraving, located in Fort Worth.

Larry Taylor '84, a St. Mary's High School Track and Cross Country standout, was a Four-Time ALL-Conference Cross Country Runner and Track Star earning Three-Time League MVP in Cross-Country and Two-Time High Point during the high school's conference track meets.

He led the Pioneers to Three Cross Country Titles and received the Pioneers First-Ever Track Title in 1984. Taylor is especially remembered for his performance in the WVIAC Conference Track and Field events. Specifically one year at the Conference, he requested to run the 800, 1500, 5000, and 10,000 meter events. The first day he won the 5,000, the second day, he won the 800, 1500, and 10,000 meter events. He went out extremely fast at the "bell lap" and the top 800 competitors could not catch him.

Taylor also went out hard and fast in the 10,000 and his top competitor couldn't catch him. He enjoyed a very successful road-racing career up until three years ago, many times participating in meets that were 15 miles long. He still runs competitively.

Paul Grier, Jr. '91, a native of Charlotte, North Carolina, excelled in Pioneer Basketball. He is 11th on Glenville State's All-Time Career Scoring Leaders Chart with 1670 Points during his playing time, 1985-1989. As a point guard for the Pioneers under Hall of Famer Coach Gary Nottingham '79, he played in three WVIAC Tournament "Final Fours", posting a record of 7-4 in tournament play. Grier gained last second field goals to secure wins in two successive tournament settings, helping the Pioneers advance in post season play.

He was named to the WVIAC Tournament Selection two times and made ALL-WVIAC Section in 1988 and 1989. Grier holds Glenville State's record for the most three point field goals in one game (9). He remains fourth among the All-Time Seasonal Three Point Field Goal Leaders with 46.1 percent in 1988-89 and sixth on the Three Point Field Goal Leaders Chart with 151 goals during his 1986-89 playing career. Grier is also ranked third on the Three Point Career Leaders Chart at 43.1% (1986-89) and received the college's prestigious Montrose Award in 1991.

Grier played on four straight winning WVIAC season teams, the teams winning 63 overall games for about 16 wins a year. He is remembered for his magnificent clutch shots.

Nine former Curtis Elam Hall of Fame inductees were in attendance at the banquet and induction ceremony to extend their welcome to the Class of 2015 inductees into the ranks of GSC's Hall of Famers. They included: Matt Bullett '89, Steve Gandee '82, Coach Bill Hanlin '53, Bob Hardman II '75, Ralph Holder '56, Coach Gary Nottingham '79, Keith Pritt '58, Keith Smith '64 and Bob Turner.

The Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 2001 through the generosity of the late Curtis Elam, a 1949 GSC graduate. Hall of Fame member plaques are displayed in the lobby of the Physical Education Building.

Remembering Miss West

The 2015 edition of the *Trillium* was dedicated to Glenville State College Professor Emerita Virginia West. The reprint of that verbiage seems appropriate with her passing...



Professor Emerita Virginia West '41 DOD February 16, 2015

After attending and graduating from GSC in 1941, Miss West taught in Virginia and later at nearby Troy High School. She then earned her master's from West Virginia University in 1950 and in 1955 became an instructor of English and journalism at Glenville State College. She also was the advisor for the college newspaper, *The Glenville Mercury*.

In 1978 she became a professor at GSC and Chairperson of the Language Division. In 1979, she was awarded the Outstanding Faculty Award by the Alumni Association. Miss West was the first woman president of the GSC Faculty Administrative Organization. She retired in 1983 after 42 years of teaching, 28 of those years at Glenville State College. That year she served as honorary parade marshal for the GSC Homecoming Parade.

According to a fellow GSC colleague, Miss West was an avid reader, sometimes finishing up to three books in the span of a weekend. She was also known for her strength in grammar and writing. The student editors of the 1984 GSC yearbook, the *Kanawachen*, even took the rare step to dedicate that issue to Miss West. In the inscription they referenced her support of the college in all aspects, her concern for her students, her sharp, dry wit, and her desire to better educate the people of central West Virginia.

After her retirement she was bestowed with the title of Professor Emerita. It is infrequent that one gains the title 'professor' without a doctorate; Miss West was so recognized because of her excellent performance and significant contribution to GSC for a long period of time. She was a member and participant in the West Virginia Library Association, Kappa Delta Pi, Delta Kappa Gamma, the Glenville State College Alumni Association, the Glenville Trinity United Methodist Church, and the Troy High School Alumni.

In 1998, a scholarship was established in her honor at GSC to assist upperclassmen education majors. Miss West passed away on February 16, 2015 at the age of 94.

Posthumous Selection:

1. Deceased candidates shall be given equal consideration in all categories and may be inducted posthumously. The five-year waiting period may be waived for deceased candidates.
