ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Land Resources prides itself on a "hands-on" approach to learning. Students are provided a teaching and learning experience that duplicates real world applications as closely as possible. Two Associate of Science degree programs are offered, Forest Technology and Land Surveying Technology. The baccalaureate degree in Natural Resource Management takes advantage of the two associate degree programs in the Department of Land Resources and the strength of course offerings in other academic departments. The degree is developed around the general education baccalaureate degree component, a Natural Resource Management core, six majors and a block elective component. The six majors offered are Criminal Justice, Environmental Science, Energy and Land Management, Forest Technology, Land Surveying Technology, and Wildlife Management.

Student organizations include the Forestry Club, Glenville Environmental Organization, and the Land Surveying Club. These groups promote camaraderie and provide opportunities for field trips, learning opportunities and community service. Several scholarships are available specifically to students who are enrolled in the Land Resources programs.
