ABOUT THE MAJOR

The Department of Land Resources prides itself on a 'hands-on' approach to learning. Students are provided a teaching and learning experience that duplicates real world applications as closely as possible. The baccalaureate degree in Natural Resource Management is developed around the general education baccalaureate degree component, a Natural Resource Management core, a specific major, and a block elective component. Land Surveying is one of the six 4-year Bachelor of Science majors offered under the Natural Resource Management program. Land Surveying is also offered as a 2-year associate degree.

The Land Surveying major provides a pathway for associate degree students in land surveying to continue their education for a baccalaureate degree. Students will be technically proficient in land surveying and will be able to develop a strong concentration in geographic information systems and resource allocation for careers with government agencies and the private sector.

This degree will also provide the baccalaureate degree necessary for licensure as a professional land surveyor in West Virginia and Ohio.
