

Jeffrey Glenn "Jeff" Davis '84, a native of Summersville, West Virginia, has been chosen as the August Artist of the Month at the West Virginia Fine Artisans gallery in Lewisburg.

He came to Glenville State College in 1979, almost by accident, after first enrolling at another school before deciding it wasn't for him. Jeff was heading back home and had stopped for gas in nearby Burnsville when he saw a sign for Glenville State. He decided to visit the campus and was introduced to now Professor Emeritus Charles C. Scott. The semester had already begun



GSC Lowers Many Academic Course Fees

Glenville State College has committed itself to being a leading force in college access and affordability by lowering the cost of higher education to the students and families of West Virginia and beyond. Over the past year, GSC has reduced the cost of tuition, lowered meal plan costs, and opted not to raise housing fees.

As part of ongoing efforts, GSC evaluated all fees associated with academic courses. As a result, 70 course fees have been either eliminated entirely or reduced for the 2018-2019 academic year. Course fee reductions ranged from 13% to 50% with a total savings for students of around \$800.

"The idea of a college reducing any of its costs for students is unheard of these days. Glenville State is taking a different approach and recognizes that students are overburdened with debt when they graduate. This reduction in fees is an important step in demonstrating our efficiency in reducing but Mr. Scott worked with then-President William K. Simmons '61 to make sure he was able to enroll and catch up with his classmates.

Jeff, whose father built all of the signs for West Virginia's state parks for 30 years, is a relief wood carver and painter. He says he tries to represent the Mountain State in his work by choosing native hardwoods such as chestnut, white walnut, oak, and sassafras for his canvas. Davis then carves, sands, and paints each piece by hand before finishing it with a glossy clear coat. Many of the items he creates are functional. such as benches, tables. and doors.

He even has work on display right here at GSC. This secretary desk, which was originally owned by John Arbuckle, was donated to GSC by Professor Emeritus Ernest "Ernie" H. Smith '64 in memory of his wife Luanna T. Smith '55 who served as a longtime Assistant to the President. Jeff added the eagle artwork while the desk was in Ernie's possession. It is now proudly on display in the James W. Curry '37 Room of your Alumni Center on campus.

Jeff has demonstrated his work in Washington, D.C., at the Mountain Heritage Arts and Crafts Festival, and at the Ripley Mountain State Arts and Crafts Fair. He costs and shows that our top priority is being a student-focused institution," said GSC President Dr. Tracy Pellett.

These reductions in course fees come following the announcement in April that Glenville State would reduce its cost of tuition by .05% for the 2018-19 academic year in addition to a 25% tuition reduction for the summer, 2018 term. GSC also lowered tuition in the 2017-18 academic year, reduced its parking fees, and is working to incorporate more free and online course materials.
