

Grace Wine '07 has completed her Ph.D. in higher education leadership from Northcentral University after defending her dissertation 'The Influence of University Supervision on Student Teachers.' She completed her degree in English education from GSC in December 2006 and then earned a Master's Degree in adolescent literacy and technology from Walden University in 2010 before pursuing the doctoral degree.

We are very near the beginning of another, high school and college, football season. The Alumni Association will again be sponsoring our GSC Alumni Canopy at various high school and of course many GSC home and away football games. This is a request for you to help us promote and support the Blue & White by scheduling the GSC Canopy at a high school or GSC game in your area!

Our goal is to make the Blue & White visible to prospective GSC students and to reconnect with our GSC Alumni and friends! Last football season the GSC Canopy was on 10 high school campuses reconnecting with our alumni and handing out recruiting literature. The project works best if a graduate

her seventh year. She teaches dual credit courses for GSC, English 11/12, and broadcasting at GCHS in addition to being a Youth Mental Health First Aid instructor and parent advocate for WV Expanded School Mental Health.

Dr. Wine became a parent advocate for WV Expanded School Mental Health after experiencing mental health issues within her own family that, unfortunately, resulted in tragedy due to inadequate care services offered at the time. She says that, as parents, she and her husband were unprepared for the impact mental illness would have on their entire family and the lack of resources available. Grace says she feels that, although she cannot erase the tragedy that befell her family, she can be an active agent for change regarding mental health awareness as a Youth Mental Health First Aid instructor though Project AWARE. Those courses, she says, are not only beneficial for educators, but for anyone who interacts with youth. As an educator and a parent, Grace hopes to be able to bridge the gap in knowledge and practice to better serve students who have mental health issues. In the future she plans to become a certified instructor in Mental Health First Aid for higher education.

During her time at GSC she was an active member of the education honor society,


