The Glenville State College Tuba and Euphonium Ensemble has been invited to perform at the 50th Anniversary International Tuba and Euphonium Conference (ITEC) at the University of Iowa. The conference is the largest of its kind and will take place in late spring. This will be the sixth time that Glenville State has performed at the ITEC since 2008.

Greetings Pioneers,

This week we celebrated the anniversary of the founding of Glenville State College, known back in those days as the Glenville Branch of the State Normal School. Believe it or not, the primary mode of transportation to and from Glenville at the time was via riverboats on the Little Kanawha – how far we've come in 147 years!



One thing that hasn't changed at Glenville State since 1872 is the generosity of our friends and neighbors. At the time of our founding, the state approved the idea of a college in Glenville but provided no funds to actually establish the school. So, fifty-six citizens of Gilmer County came together with their own money, investing anywhere from five dollars to one-hundred dollars for the cause. We saw this same kind of generosity this week on our Founders Day of Giving where nearly 400 individuals raised over \$100,000 in just one day for assorted projects at GSC. Please accept my personal thanks to everyone who donated!

Even as we work to establish new scholarships and supplement existing funds, we know that many GSC students feel the financial burden of paying for college more acutely than some of their peers. That is why we believe it is our responsibility to continue to be keenly focused on college accessibility and affordability. As such, our Board of Governors recently voted to not raise tuition rates for the third straight academic year. This is a direct response to what can only be described as out of control increases in tuition rates at other institutions across the Mountain State.

In addition to celebrating Founders Day, this week also saw several special ceremonies that signified our commitment to educating the citizens of central West Virginia and beyond. GSC has entered into agreement with Nicholas County and Richwood High Schools to offer those students the opportunity to complete their two-year Associate of Arts degree in General Studies with an emphasis in Education or Business at the same time they are completing their high school graduation requirements. Additionally, we also completed work on an articulation agreement with New River Community and Technical College to create a seamless transition to GSC for students who have already earned an associate degree in business at New River.
