Glenville State is currently working to take a focused lead in encouraging enrollment in teacher education programs, especially in areas where major shortages are identified such as special education, mathematics, early education



mathematics, early education, and science.

Our alumni know the proud history GSC has when it comes to training teachers. I've heard from many of you who, right out of college, recall being immediately recognized as an outstanding teacher candidate just for being a Glenville State College graduate.
