## Drennen Receives Guggenheim Fellowship

Many of you may recall earlier this year when we featured Anthony Craig Drennen '88 in the Alumni Spotlight section of the Pioneer Update. Since that



time, Craig has been awarded a <u>Guggenheim Fellowship</u> from the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation.

The official awards ceremony took place in New York City on May 7.

Craig was among 172 other scholars, artists, and scientists who were appointed on the basis of prior achievement and exceptional promise. The candidates were chosen from a group of almost 3,000 applicants in the Foundation's ninetyfourth competition.

Ohio University, where Craig earned his M.F.A., has six alumni from their photography department who have been Guggenheim winners. Drennen is the first painting alum from OU to receive a Guggenheim Fellowship. The University has invited him back to campus to speak at the end of September.

His poetry has been published throughout the vears in a number of prestigious publications, including The Nation, North American Review, American Scholar, The Hudson Review, The Kenyon Review, Poetry, Boston Review, and many others. However, Dr. Busch considers the inclusion of his poems in The Best American *Poetry 2001* – an anthology of the year's best poems – to be one of his greatest honors.

During his years at Glenville State, he was a member of the football and baseballs teams, the G-Club, Kappa Sigma Kappa, the Ohnimgohow Players, Alpha Psi Omega, and Student Council.

Following his graduation from GSC, Trent received a Master's Degree from West Virginia University and a Ph.D. from the University of Utah.

Dr. Busch currently resides in Lark Park, Georgia and is an Emeritus Professor of English at Valdosta State University. He and his wife Carol have a daughter, Laura, and a son, Bret. In his retirement, Trent continues to write and enjoys

## **Rees' AMI Metals Inc. Wins Fifth Award**

Bernie Rees '91 (pictured here, second from left) is the Vice President at AMI Metals, Inc. in Brentwood, Tennessee. His company, which is a full service cut-to-size metal service center, providing aluminum plate, sheet, bar, and extruded profiles for the aerospace industry, was honored earlier this year with a Supplier of the Year award from Gulfstream. This was their fifth award from Gulfstream and is in addition to being selected as Supplier of the Year for Boeing three of the last ten

years.

Pioneer sports fans will remember Bernie as a four-year letterman in Basketball and a threeyear letterman in Track. He was captain of his basketball team during his junior and senior years and All Conference his junior year. Bernie lead the WVIAC for 3 point field goal percentage and was second in the Nation in 3 point field goal percentage his sophomore year. He remains #1 in three point percentage in a season at GSC, #4 in three point goals among career leaders with 195, and #4 in three point percentage among career leaders with 43%. Rees continues to hold the record for most consecutive 3 point field goals at GSC (8-8). An excellent splinter, Bernie was also Three Time All Conference in Track and Conference Champion High Jump and Long Jump all three years. At one time, Rees was record holder in long jump at GSC.
