Dr. Debra (McCartney Simon) Harrison '76 has been named Assistant Superintendent of Upshur County Schools. Her appointment took effect July 1.

Deb, to all of us on campus, taught in West Virginia and North Carolina public schools before coming to Glenville State College as an Assistant Professor of Special Education in 1990.

After serving in this capacity for five years, she left Glenville State for a two year stint as Principal of Frametown Elementary, Frametown, West Virginia. She returned to Glenville

# **Work Progressing on Riverfront Residence**

Glenville State College is embarking on an ambitious economic stimulus investment in downtown Glenville. A major part of this investment includes the new Riverfront Residence Hall.

The Riverfront Residence is the result of refurbishing and remodeling the Conrad Motel into a modern and attractive residence hall for GSC students. Besides providing employment for several workers in Glenville this summer, the renovation will create a new residence hall that will house up to 90 new students starting this fall. Seen above, is the progress that has been made during the renovation. Once the rooms are completed, they will be furnished with a mini refrigerator, microwave, extra-long twin bed, desk, chair, chest of drawers, and a wardrobe. The view below is a rendering of

State College in 1997 as Associate Professor of Special Education and was appointed Vice President for **Enrollment Services the** following year, a position that she held until 2001 when she was named Provost of Glenville State's Community and Technical College, headquartered at the time in Summersville, West Virginia although classes were offered in **Braxton and Lewis Counties** as well.

When the state legislature mandated in 2002 that community and technical components be severed from GSC's main operations by 2003, she was brought back to the main campus to lead our Teacher Education Department and served as Dean of Teacher Education through 2007. During this time, she also served as Chair of the Division of Professional Studies (2002-2004) and as Vice President for Enrollment Management (January 2007-May 2007), these additional positions being while she was still leading our Teacher Education Department.

Dr. Harrison left Glenville State in 2007 to serve as Dean of the School of Education at Salem University, Salem, West Virginia and in December of that year assumed the position of Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Salem, a position that she held until July 2013 when she worked for what the building exterior will look like when this phase of the project is completed.

Glenville State's Kim Stephens '11 has been named the Mountain East Conference Women's Sports Coach of the Year for 2017-18.

Stephens, in her second season at her alma mater, directed the Pioneers to a 31-2 season on the hardwood. Glenville State became the first program -men's or women's -- to navigate conference play with an undefeated record at 22-0 en route to a secondstraight regular season conference title.
