GSC's Coach Kim Stephens '11 returned to her alma mater as head coach of the women's basketball program in 2016. Since that time, she has been named the Mountain East Conference Coach of the Year and her team has won two MEC regular season championships, a tournament championship, made NCAA tournament appearances, and led the nation in several statistical categories including points per game, 3 point field goals made per game and offensive rebounds per game.

### GSC Awarded a West Virginia Humanities Council Grant

Glenville State College was recently awarded a grant from the West Virginia Humanities Council for the project "We, too, are Appalachia: an Exploration



of Identity and Place." The program, which includes presentations, displays, and a speaker series, provides an avenue for intellectual exploration of the culture that surrounds us. The project aims to illustrate a well-rounded representation of life in Appalachia. Those scheduled to participate in the speakers series include: Jessica Lilly, host of West Virginia Public Radio's *Inside Appalachia*; Frank X Walker, Poet Laureate of Kentucky and co-founder of the Affrilachian Poets; Scott McClanahan, author of *Crapalachia*: A *Biography of a Place*; Buddy Griffin '71, Vandalia Award-Winning bluegrass musician; and Wess Harris, a survivor of the Buffalo Creek Disaster, sociologist, certified underground miner, union organizer, educator, historian, and progressive activist.

Events are scheduled to take place from Folk Festival weekend through the fall semester and are open to students, faculty, staff, and members of the community at no charge. Students will be encouraged to get involved in the project through essay, art, and performance contests and by presenting their own scholarly Appalachian Studies work at an undergraduate conference to be held later in the fall.

To kick off the project, guests can join us for the first "We, too, are Appalachia" events during the West Virginia State

season ranked #10 in NCAA D2. Her current record as the Lady Pioneer Head Coach is 55-8, including a 26 game home win streak.

Kim, who received the Alumni Association's Outstanding Young Alumna Award at our annual Alumni Banquet on April 28, is a Parkersburg, West Virginia native. She initially joined the Lady Pioneer coaching staff as an assistant coach in 2012. Stephens helped lead Glenville State's 2012-13 team to a regular season **WVIAC Conference** Championship and saw the team advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In 2013, she became the head assistant coach at Sacramento State University where, during her three seasons in California with the Lady Hornets, the team had two 18 win seasons and made it to the Sweet Sixteen of the WNIT in 2015.


