Lifeguard Certification Classes Offered at GSC

Individuals interested in earning or renewing certification as a Red Cross lifeguard should make plans to sign up for classes being offered at Glenville State College's Pool at the end of the month.

The class, for first-time certification, is scheduled for June 29, 30, July 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, and 9 and will last from 3:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. daily. The cost for the certification is \$225 per person. Individuals who are looking to complete their recertification should attend June 29, 30, July 1, 2, and 3 from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. The cost for recertification is \$100 per person. All classes will take place at the GSC Pool which is located in the Health and Physical Education Building.

Participants, who should be at least 15 years old by the last day of the class, must pass a swim test at the first session. The test consists of a 300-meter continuous swim using either the front crawl or breaststroke, treading water, handsfree, for two minutes in the deep end of the pool, and completing a brick retrieval within one minute forty seconds.

Glenville State College students will return to campus for the fall 2020 semester that begins Monday, August 17.

I think that is demonstrated in our reopening plan," said Vice President of Enrollment Management and Student Affairs Marty Carver. "Additional information regarding athletics and other campus events is forthcoming and under careful consideration as we continue to make plans to reunite the Pioneer family this fall," he added.

Residential students will begin returning to campus in August through a phased move-in process that may include COVID-19 screening and/or testing. Students will also be required to obey all social distancing guidelines set forth by the CDC.
