Mike Kellar Named Head Pioneer Football Coach

Mike Kellar has been named the 25th Head Football Coach of the Glenville State College Pioneers.



Kellar comes into the position with 51-35 (.593) career record as a head coach at the NCAA Division II level with stops at California (PA), Concord, and Lenoir-Rhyne (NC). Before breaking into the head coaching ranks, he made his mark as offensive coordinator for a trio of NCAA Division II playoff squads, including a pair of California (PA) teams that advanced to the national semifinals. As a head coach or assistant coach he has been part of seven conference championship teams.

During the 2018 season, he served as the Offensive Coordinator for West Liberty University. The Hilltoppers averaged 25.0 points per game and 327.5 yards per contest this past season.

The Shinnston, West Virginia native was the starting quarterback at Glenville State in 1989 and later at Fairmont State during the early 1990's. After graduating from Fairmont State in 1994, Kellar traded his playing cleats for a headset and whistle and spent the next eight seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Falcons. He helped lead Fairmont to a pair of WVIAC championships.

While a student at GSC, Ferguson was a member of Student Government and the Black Gospel Choir where she served as the Choir Director. She received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in English Education from GSC, and went on to earn a Masters Degree in Education from Regent University.

This season, the Lady Pioneers claimed their third straight Mountain East Conference (MEC) Regular Season Championship title along with winning their second consecutive MEC Tournament Championship. With the tournament win, GSC earned the number one seed and the honor to host the NCAA Division II Atlantic Regional Tournament at the Waco Center last week.
