Trae Sprague '12, Director of Residence Life at Glenville State College, has been named the 2020 Staff Employee of the Year.

Presidential Candidates to Visit Campus

The five candidates for Glenville State College's next president are scheduled to visit campus May 27, 28, and 29. They will participate in open forums that are open to the public, but with social distancing restrictions in place that will require a maximum occupancy be observed. Each forum will be broadcast live for those wishing to attend the sessions virtually.

Each candidate has provided their resume, a letter of interest, and a short introductory video so members of the campus community can learn a little about each of them prior to their on-campus interview.

Nominations for the award called Sprague incredibly polite, a calming influence on students and his peers, and noted that he rarely shows distress or frustration during work. An administrator said, "When COVID-19 hit, Trae didn't look to others – he developed a plan, communicated the plan, and took a key leadership role in dealing with all of the uncertainty associated with the pandemic as it relates to our students."

Sprague, originally from Parkersburg, West Virginia, graduated from Glenville State College with a Bachelor of Arts in Education degree in Physical Education in 2012. In August of that year, he joined the Office of Admissions as an Admissions Counselor. Sprague then became the Supervisor of Student Life and Intramural Sports within the Office of Student Life in 2016. Sprague became Director of Residence Life in August 2019.

Trae becomes the 31st recipient of the staff recognition award that has been presented at GSC since 1986.
