Also established is a Security Deposit Revolving Loan Fund which helps families and individuals into stable, affordable housing.

Arbuckle Desk has a New Home at GSC

The Arbuckle House on Glenville State College's campus now serves as the College's Alumni Center. John E. Arbuckle built the home in 1905 and spent most of his career working in banking in Glenville, West Virginia. In 1967, the bank in downtown Glenville where Mr. Arbuckle worked was severely flooded and the furniture, including Mr. Arbuckle's desk, had to be replaced.

In years after the flood, Sharon (Dobbins) '70 and the late James Phares '65 took ownership of the desk, refinished it, and used it as their family desk. In the spirit of homecoming, last week Sharon proudly donated the desk to Glenville State College for it to be used in the Martha Jarvis Cottrell '35 Office of the Alumni Center.
