He creates informational graphics and interactive web modules while also working with graphics and marketing teams to enhance content design and branding efforts.

During his time at GSC, Bill received the Outstanding Student Award and the Whiting Art Award. In 1994 he earned a Presidential Citation Award for meritorious achievement as a visual journalist and illustrator. A colorful abstract painting of Bill's – *Downtown* Glenville - still hangs in the Robert F. Kidd Library. He donated it to the institution in 1981.

Originally from Charleston, West Virginia, Bill currently resides in Davidson, North Carolina with his wife, Jackie (they met while students at GSC), who works at nearby Davidson College. They have two sons.
