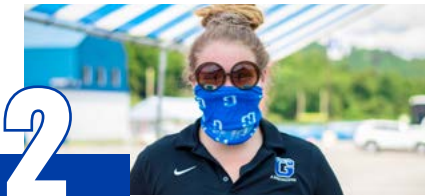

Greetings Pioneer Alumni and Friends!

On July 1, 2020, I began my tenure as Glenville State College's twenty-sixth President. My wife Gigi and I are so pleased to be here in Glenville and I am very proud to be serving as the President of this fine institution.

Shortly after I learned that I would be the next President at Glenville State, I received several phone calls from people who shared with me that they were GSC alumni. They were proud to call themselves Pioneers, and I know that you are as well. Glenville State College is a great place and that is truly reflected in all of you. Who we are today has been shaped by our graduates, countless donors and friends, and our past and present faculty and staff.

For those of you who may not know me, allow me a moment to tell you a bit about my past. I was born and raised in Farmington, West Virginia. I attended public school in Marion County and eventually earned a Doctorate of Educational Administration degree from West Virginia University in 1986. As I mentioned, the success of Glenville State College moving forward will be built upon the solid foundations laid by those who have come before us. My goal is to build on the progress we have made and continue to do great things at the Lighthouse on the Hill.

Recruiting and retaining students is an obvious goal. No college can be successful without students and we are working hard to seek out a motivated, passionate, and diverse group of both traditional and non-traditional students who will hopefully someday call themselves Pioneers. Keeping students in college after they enroll is another matter. I believe that, as the old saying goes, "It takes a village" – that means establishing a holistic approach to student advising, course scheduling, campus life and recreation, and more. As I near six months in this role at Glenville State, I find myself reflecting on the things we have already accomplished and the challenges faced here and around the globe. The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted our campus in terms of course delivery and the ability to gather and hold events. It has also reminded us of the importance of keeping our students, faculty, staff, and community safe amid the pandemic. That focus will remain a top priority until such time that we are all able to rid ourselves of the Coronavirus risk.

In closing, I want to express my gratitude for what you have done in the past and I ask you to join us in imagining the future. Gigi and I look forward to meeting you just as soon as we are able.

Land Resources Students Benefit From WVDOF Trainings

Department of Land Resources students who were enrolled in the Timber Harvesting course this semester again had the opportunity to take part in the West Virginia Division of Forestry's (WVDOF) Timber Felling and Chainsaw Safety Workshop on the College Farm.

The workshop, organized by WVDOF Service Forester, **Jesse King '14**, was led by **Johnny King '13** (pictured above with student) and **Jack Spencer '95**, both of the WVDOF. During the workshop, students learned the importance of personal protective equipment, timber harvesting laws and regulations, how to obtain a timber harvesting license in the State of West Virginia, and OSHA regulations.

The students also worked to refine the skills that they had already learned in their Timber Harvesting course, as well as learning new skills along the way. The hands-on training included practicing notches, boring into a tree, spring pole removal, tree topping, and more.

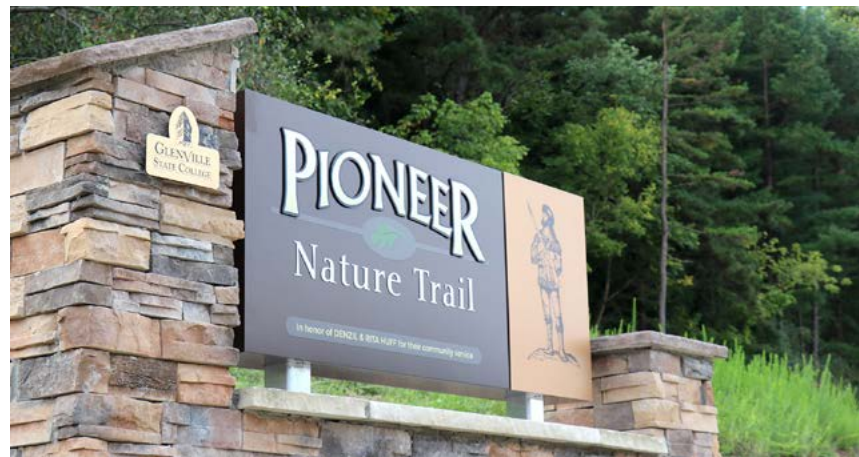
"We hope that the students will take the techniques from this training and the skills learned in their Timber Harvesting course at GSC to go on to be the future of our field," Jesse King said.

Home Grown Program Expands Throughout W.Va.



In 2019, Glenville State launched the Home Grown Initiative, a scholarship program designed to address the growing teacher shortage in West Virginia. The program focuses on prospective teacher identification in the county schools partnered with scholarship support for candidate attendance at GSC, practical experiences, and mentoring during teacher preparation into the start of full-time teaching. The goal is for those students to return to their home counties to student teach and, if available, be able to apply for open positions in their home district.

The program has since expanded to all 55 counties in West Virginia. Qualified students are nominated by the county superintendent or their designee for a scholarship in a "high need" teaching area in their county.

Percussion INTERRUPTION

The April 2020 performance of the Glenville State College Percussion Ensemble should have marked the 40th anniversary of the annual show. The sets were built, the musicians were rehearsing, and tickets were on sale.

However, the COVID-19 pandemic halted all gatherings and live in-person concerts so the performance, under the direction of John McKinney '73, was cancelled.

Masahiro "Masa" Yamaguchi served as Glenville State's Japan Outreach Coordinator between 2018 and 2020. Yamaguchi grew up in Shiga, Japan, received his undergraduate degree in linguistics, and spent time studying abroad in Russia. He came to GSC after working in Kyoto and Tokyo.

In addition to his time spent on campus with GSC students and staff, Yamaguchi also visited various community groups and schools for activities and presentations.

FLOWER FARMING

In the heart of central West Virginia

With a lifelong passion for art, **Tamara “Tammy” (Stalaker) Hough ‘85** holds a degree in art and previously served as an art teacher in the Lewis County (WV) School System. Combining her love for art and some newfound flower farming skills, Hough now operates Morning Glory Flowers from her Gilmer County farm. We caught up with Tammy in the early fall to talk about how she found this new passion and why she finds flowers so joyous.

How did you get started with flower farming?

“I went to a farm conference put on by the West Virginia Extension Office. At that farm conference, there was a session called ‘A Day in the Life of a Flower Farmer,’ and I just really fell in love with everything that Jean Stewart had to say. I emailed her afterwards and decided right there and then that I wanted to be a flower farmer and florist.”

“It’s been a process with little baby steps at a time, making a lot of mistakes along the way. But I have to say that it was the right decision. I do not regret it whatsoever. It’s brought a lot of joy to me and other people.”

How did Glenville State influence your career?

“I have found that what I learned at Glenville State College in my art program - the elements of art: color, design, color theory - have all really helped in this process of being a flower farmer and florist.

Not only do I do flower work, but I also do art - coming back to my degree - from the flowers. I make portraits with the blooms. That’s been another nice part of my business,

and I sell them at different shops in West Virginia. It’s brought another facet to the business that’s been a lot of fun.”

Who was your favorite professor at GSC?

“[Professor Emeritus] Charles Scott. He was known for his pottery especially. He helped me buy my first camera and I got involved with photography then, which was really good. He would take trips to Nova Scotia and we would have painting trips, which were amazing.”

Do you work alone?

“Another great part about the flower farm is that it’s been a family endeavor. My daughter, Lauren, my daughter-in-law, Kristen, we all work together to make events happen and that just really brings a lot of joy to me.”

Where can we find your work?

“So, I do have an Etsy shop - it is called “Morning Glory Flower Co.” and you can find prints and cards there. I also have people that will call and I deliver bouquets locally. What has been really great about that is that it’s a moment that I can share where those people are seen, especially during this time with COVID-19. Somebody from far off can send some love to somebody - it’s just been a wonderful thing and I really appreciate it and feel honored to be a part of that.”

Hough hopes to continue to grow Morning Glory Flowers in the future through her flower arrangements and prints. ■

2020 Hall of Fame Inductees Announced

The six newest members of the Glenville State College Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame have been announced.

The 2020 inductees include: **Larry Gandee '62, Jim Carter '74, Mark Reger '74, Lloyd Willis '87, Andy Jarrell '89, and Monique Johnson '90.**

Gandee was a three-year starter who scored over 1,000 career points in basketball. He later coached at Gwynn Park High School where, as head coach, he tallied a record of 237-74 and led the program to eight state title games, winning six of the eight.

Carter was a First Team All-WVIAC selection, was a running back on GSC's 1973 National Runner-Up Team, and ran for a school record 949 yards in 1973.

Reger played defensive tackle for

the Pioneers in the early 1970s, was a member of Glenville State's 1973 National Runner-Up Team, and was a First Team All-WVIAC selection in 1973. He went on to a distinguished coaching career after GSC.

Willis was a four-year starter for the Pioneer Track & Field Team, was a member of the Track & Field WVIAC Title Teams in 1984 and 1986, and was a three-year champion in both the long jump and triple jump. He went to Nationals three times (twice outdoor and once indoor) and finished tenth in 1986 at Nationals.

Jarrell was an All-Conference performer who ran on championship teams at GSC (three in Track and three in Cross Country). He competed three times at Nationals in Cross Country and was the High Point man at the WVIAC Championship in 1986. He also made Nationals twice in the steeplechase and has the second

fastest time in school history in the steeplechase, 5,000, and 10,000.

Johnson was a three-time All-WVIAC First Team selection, scored 1,731 points in her career and ranks fourth All-Time at Glenville State. She pulled down 684 Rebounds in her career (ranks 17th All-Time at GSC), dished out 271 Assists in her career (ranks 18th All-Time at GSC), and had 152 Steals in her career (ranks 24th All-Time at GSC). She won a league title in 1989, the first in school history.

The 2020 Hall of Fame Class will be officially inducted at a date to be determined due to COVID-19.

Glenville State College's Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 2001 through the generosity of the late **Curtis Elam '49.** ■

Pioneering Through A Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted almost every aspect of our daily lives over the past several months. With input from state and local agencies, Glenville State College has been continuing to educate and support students while still emphasizing the health and safety of the entire campus community.

In early March 2020, life at Glenville State College was proceeding much as it always has.

Students were preparing for the upcoming spring break and the Lady Pioneer Basketball team had just earned the #3 seed in the NCAA Division II Atlantic Regional Tournament after winning another Mountain East Conference Championship.

As it turned out, those events would be the last glimpses of “normal life” for a while. Shortly thereafter, on March 13, the United States declared a national emergency in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic. Days later, West Virginia’s governor issued a stay-at-home order for residents. Spring break was extended for an

additional week as faculty members transitioned all courses to fully online delivery formats. The day after the governor’s executive order was issued, all GSC employees aside from those deemed essential workers began working from home.

Like many events since, GSC’s traditional in-person commencement ceremony in May was traded for a virtual celebration.

As spring progressed into summer, staff members returned to campus and planning began to focus on the fall semester and how to welcome students back in a safe manner. Over the course of several days, individuals were screened and tested in order to properly prepare the campus for the fall semester.

In efforts to limit spread of the virus, alterations were made to on-campus dining options, traffic flow inside buildings was redirected to one-way where possible, masks and face coverings were required indoors and on campus shuttles, hand sanitizer stations were added, and the cleaning of high-touch areas was increased.

Course offerings were also adjusted for the fall to limit face-to-face interaction where possible. **Robin (Cottrill) Meadows ‘01**, GSC’s Online Program Services Specialist who helps coordinate online programs, said that the course delivery modalities for fall 2020 were different than what she had seen before. “I would estimate that 25% of classes were delivered face-to-face, 40% were fully online, 34% were hybrid, and 1% were via correspondence for our GSC courses being taught in correctional facilities,” she said.

Throughout the fall semester individuals continued to be tested and, when necessary, were isolated from the rest of the campus population. Meals, snacks, and other necessary items were delivered daily to students. “Our staff members also hand delivered things to students in isolation on evenings and weekends...everything from essential items to surprise cupcakes for someone who was unfortunately spending their birthday in quarantine,” said GSC Provost Dr. Gary Morris. “It’s those small acts that really set Glenville State apart from other schools.”

On the athletic side, competition for fall sports were shifted to spring 2021. The Mountain East Conference Board of Directors also voted that winter sports would begin no earlier than January 1, 2021.

“Many of our faculty and staff have gone above and beyond to make themselves available to students through a variety of means. However, I think I can speak for everyone when I say that we are all ready to be back in our GSC classrooms, labs, and residence halls learning and actually seeing each other in person just as soon as conditions allow,” Morris added. ■

My goal in life is to become a counseling psychologist. The opportunities that have been given to me have helped me gain the knowledge and experience to help shape my future.”



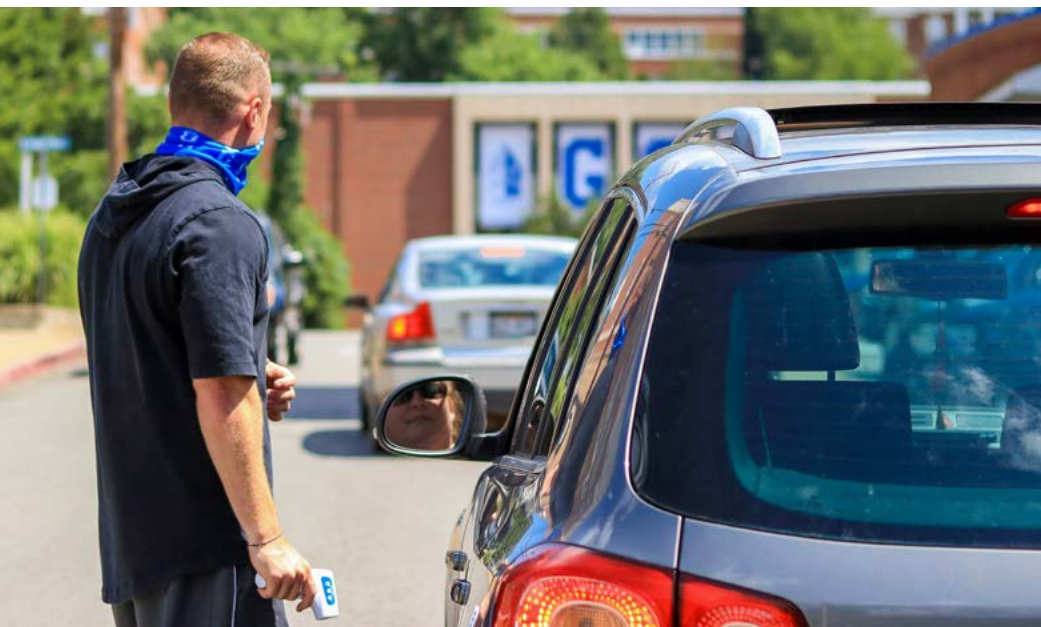

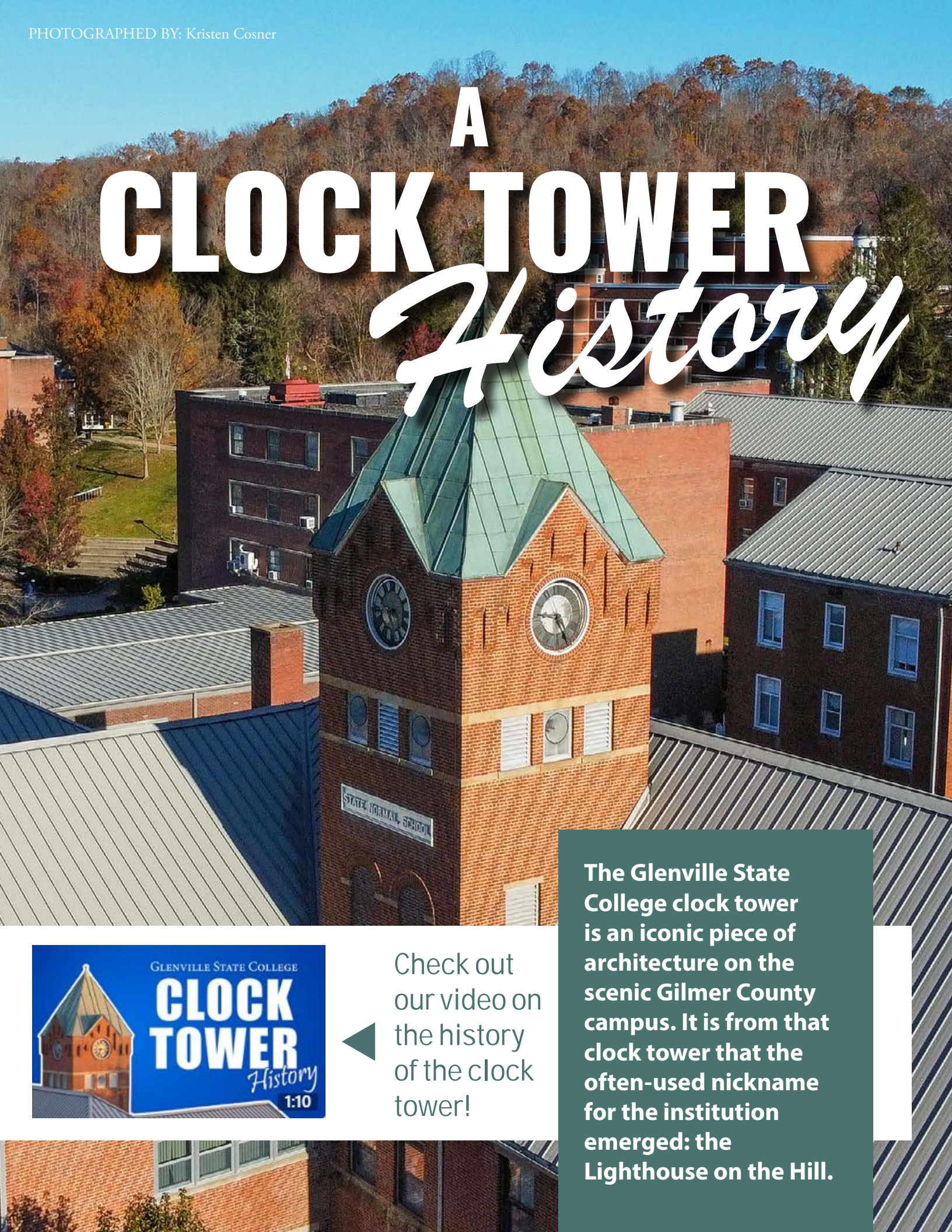

A CLOCK TOWER *History*

The Glenville State College clock tower is an iconic piece of architecture on the scenic Gilmer County campus. It is from that clock tower that the often-used nickname for the institution emerged: the Lighthouse on the Hill.

In 1893, the state legislature agreed to provide funding, around \$20,000, to build an addition onto part of what is now known as the Harry B. Heflin Administration Building.

With additional space provided by the new construction to the Administration Building, Glenville State continued to see growth in all aspects, including the student body. By 1897 the famous clock tower was added to the building. When first built, the tower was 20 feet higher than we know it today. The state Board of Regents required it to be shortened around 1904 over fears of it toppling in high winds.

According to archival records from GSC's Robert F. Kidd Library, it was 1899 before the finished tower was completed with a clock. The original clockworks were made by the E. Howard & Company of Boston, Massachusetts.

In those days, the clock on the tower was operated by two iron weights; one weighing 600 pounds and the other 2,300 pounds. The weights were raised by winding cables on two large drums which were operated by a crank. The clockworks also included an 80-pound pendulum and a 30-inch diameter bell. The bell, it was said,

could be heard for nearly two miles when rang on a clear day.

Of course no such clock of the time period could be expected to operate without some human assistance. Enter George Firestone. Firestone, who was a longtime janitor and confidante for students, was entrusted with maintenance of the clockworks and was the official time keeper of the tower for many years. Old stories recall some on campus and in the community wondering if the clock was perhaps a few minutes fast or slow on occasion. But then again, according to an article from the *Glenville Mercury* in 1931, in Glenville, "what does five or ten minutes matter?"

In the days before cell phones, students, faculty, staff, and community members used the tower chimes to make sure they got to class, work, church, dates, and more on time. Even today, the chimes help keep everyone informed of the hours throughout the day.

Various instruments have provided the hourly notice of the passing day...the original bell, chimes, and computerized speakers. In the 1970s, the chimes being used had become inoperable due to technical issues. Fast forward to 1979 when funds were

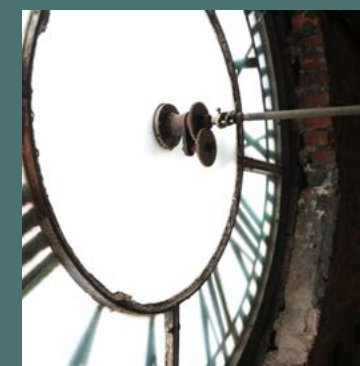
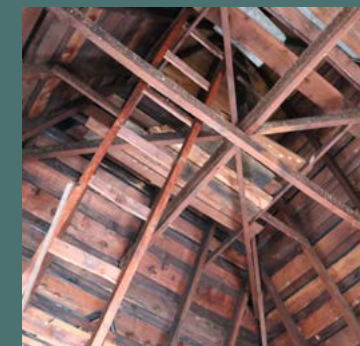
raised to repair the chimes and to install equipment to amplify the music from a carillon. In those days, daily at 11:50 a.m., songs were played live by a carillon player. Instructors of the day, such as Sidney Tedford and Professor Emerita Bertha Olsen, were frequent performers of the various hymns, folk songs, and other popular tunes played on the chimes. Song requests were also happily accepted. These days the chimes heard throughout campus are generated by an electronic carillon produced by the Schulmerich company.

In 2010 the historic bell was removed from the clock tower. In addition to the bell, the original clockworks, including the pendulum, were relocated from the tower and put on display inside Clemons Tower on campus. It was thought that, since the pieces were no longer in service, it would be fitting to showcase them where they could be seen by students and visitors more easily.

Glenville State College has a history spanning back nearly 150 years to its roots as a state normal school. The famous clock tower has been around nearly as long and has become an essential part of the campus. It continues to serve as an icon for its students and alumni. ■

Profiles of Pioneer Alumni Through the Decades

Bill & Martha Deel

1950s

Dr. William S. “Bill” Deel ‘58 and **Martha (Douglas) Deel ‘59**, married for 60 years now, first met during their years at Glenville State College. However, their paths to campus were quite different.

Bill had no intention of attending college whereas Martha had often heard stories from her mother and siblings who had already attended Glenville. She planned to follow in their footsteps.

“I grew up hearing about the professors my mother and siblings admired and who were their friends as well. Years later I was fortunate to meet some of the lifetime friends they made while attending myself. Incidentally, my mom was in the first group to live in Verona Maple Hall. When the time came in 1955 for me to decide upon a college, you guessed it – GSC! And I was assigned to Verona Maple Hall,” Martha said.

“I was just at Glenville because **Bob Gainer ‘61** invited me to come along and be his roommate,” Bill joked.

The Deels met on campus, Bill recalls, probably at the Wesley Foundation or in the dining hall. “We didn’t date, I just tried to be where he was,” Martha said with a laugh. “She did all the courting, I didn’t have to do anything,” Bill added.

Some may remember the freshman rules that were in place at GSC for a time. If a rule was broken, the offending student was required to go before a student court. One of those rules established that freshmen students were not to walk on the grass. “You’d go before the court and plead your case and if you didn’t win, they assigned you a penalty,” Bill said. “I never stepped on a blade of grass at Glenville in my life but I was accused and found guilty...Bob found himself accused of something also but I don’t remember what his infraction was. So, as punishment, Bob Gainer and I had to provide 15 minutes of entertainment for those gathered on the porch of Kanawha Hall who were waiting for their meal. Everyone got to know who we were after that,” he said.

Martha says one of her favorite memories from her time at Glenville were simply

times spent in the dorms with her friends. “I treasure the friendships with those girls and we still stay in contact today, calling and exchanging cards at Christmas,” she said.

Bill also recalls putting on plays with the Onmighow Players, playing bassoon and cymbals in the band, sweeping floors in the Administration Building and Louis Bennett Hall, and becoming photographer for the *Mercury*. “I wrote a paper for **Dr. [Max] Ward ‘40** and explained to him that if I had a way to include photos, I would. He said he could help and taught me how to take and develop photos in his darkroom. After that, a position came open for the photographer for the *Mercury* and I became campus photographer.”

During their senior year, Bill and **Randolph “Randy” Stein ‘58** were instrumental in preparing the 1958 *Kanawhachen* yearbook. Randy was the editor, Bill the photographer.

Upon her graduation, Martha took her first teaching job. That first posting was as a sixth grade teacher in Wood County. “Glenville provided me excellent preparation for becoming a teacher,” she said.

Bill also planned to begin teaching after graduating from GSC. “When I graduated, **Bob Higgins ‘49** asked me what I was going to do. He thought I should go to graduate school but I told him I had no real resources to do that. He got me a scholarship to go to West Virginia University for a degree in counseling,” Bill said. After graduating from WVU, he began working as a school counselor. “Later I met with then-President **Dr. Harry Heflin ‘37**. He told me that Bob Higgins was retiring and he offered me the Dean of Men job at Glenville. I said, when do I start?”

During his years as Dean of Men, the Deels lived in the second floor apartment in Louis Bennett Hall.

At the urging of former President Dr. D. Banks Wilburn, Bill began working on a doctorate at Indiana University. Again, thanks to a full-time scholarship

1960s Tim Carney

Tim Carney '62 is on the short list of Glenville State College's All-Time Greatest Coaches.

First and foremost, Carney has coached more league championship teams than any head coach in GSC history: 12.

With those team championships, Carney stands alone at the top of the mountain.

His athletic career began at Dunbar High School in Kanawha County (West Virginia). In the 1950s, it was a Golden Era in athletics for the county, especially in basketball.

"There were so many great players in the Valley at that time," Carney said. "We played against Jerry West and East Bank when I was a sophomore, and you knew then that he was going to do some big things. Nitro had Gary Justice who played at Richmond and also the McClanahan Brothers...Charleston High had Dean Blake and my future teammate **Mike Eberbaugh '63**. Clendenin had my future teammate **Larry Gandee '62**. Every game, you knew you were facing somebody that was going to be playing at the next level."

With a strong individual resume, Carney was getting attention from college recruiters.

Glenville was attractive on several fronts. For one, he would be able to play both sports. Second, the school had been a haven for stars from the Kanawha Valley. Former DuPont athletes **Keith Pritt '58** and **Larry "Doc" Stanley '59** were enjoying Hall of Fame careers as Pioneers, plus Carney and Clendenin star Larry Gandee were in the same GSC recruiting class for Hall of Fame Coach Leland Byrd. The year after Carney and Gandee arrived, Charleston High's Eberbaugh also signed with Glenville.

Carney was a key four-year player in both sports. In basketball, he scored 858 career points, and was a vital player as the team improved each season; going 8-20 in 1959, 12-15 in 1960, 14-13 in 1961, and 16-11 in 1962. "We had a young team in 1959 and several of the freshmen were in the

lineup," Carney said. "Besides myself, Larry Gandee and **Bob Lambert '62** were in that recruiting class. Coach Byrd added some nice pieces over the next few years and our team really improved."

In baseball, Carney was a slick fielding shortstop who helped the team show improvement in the three years he was on the team. Playing for Hall of Fame head Coach **Carlos Ratliff '34**, the team went 3-10 in 1959, improved to 7-4 in 1960, and 8-5 in 1961. He did not play in the 1962 season, as he was student-teaching during the last quarter of classes.

"Coach Ratliff was a great baseball mind. He was really ahead of his time," Carney said.

After graduating in 1962 with a degree in Health and Physical Education, Carney became a teacher and coach in Maryland for six years. He started by teaching and coaching in Calvert County for three years.

"While I was at Calvert County, I was contacted by **Don Merriman '54** at Gwynn Park High School (GPHS)," Carney said. "He was a former GSC player, and was looking to fill two 7-12 PE positions. He knew both me and Larry Gandee and he hired us both for these spots."

While in Maryland, Carney and his wife **Linda (Campbell) '61** started a family. Linda, also a Kanawha County native from St. Albans, met Tim during Glenville's spring semester of 1959. Their three kids; Steve, **Scott '85**, and **Sandy '92** would all have strong ties in the Glenville area. Steve and Scott played on some great teams at Gilmer County High School in the late 70s. The 1978 team made the Class AA quarterfinals, with the 1979 team making the State Tournament semifinals. Steve would play and coach basketball at Alderson-Broadus, while Scott enjoyed a strong college golf career.

Scott was on the 1985 GSC team that placed ninth in the nation. Daughter Sandy would attend GSC as well and was a cheerleader for the Blue and White in the late 80s.

Tony Franklin 1970s

Antonio "Tony" Franklin '76 first came to Glenville State College from White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia when he was still 17 years old. Coach **Bill Hanlin '53** had recruited him from Greenbrier East High School to play football for the Pioneers. "My cousin **Don "Jo Jo" Crump '78** and I decided to go to Glenville. The fact that we already knew people there helped us make the decision," he said.

"At that time, in my community very few people went to college...people just went to work. However, I give credit to **Bob "Skinny" Minnieweather '68**. He started that pipeline of African American students from our small town to Glenville State," he said.

During his time at Glenville State, Tony was a member of the 1973 NAIA Division II National Runner-up football team, played intramural sports, was a Student Lobbyist with the Student Government Association, chaired the Social Work Club, was a member of the Blacks United Together (B.U.T.) group, played in the marching band, wrote a column for the Mercury, and had parts in two campus plays, Jesus Christ Superstar and You Can't Take It With You.

"We had a lot of good times on campus. I have fond memories of relaxing in the amphitheater, listening to records in the library, Sadie Hawkins Day events, playing Bid Whist in the Louis Bennett Hall dorm lobby, the Commode Bowl...I could go on and on," he said.

These days Tony works as the Associate Director of the University of Illinois Extension. In that role he is a member of the core administrative team that provides leadership and vision to the Illinois Extension. He oversees logistical operations, including supervising the field-based leadership team as well as providing leadership for the organizational development of Illinois Extension units. He serves as the Affirmative Action/Equal Employment Opportunity Officer for Illinois Extension.

He says that his time in Glenville helped prepare him for his professional life in a number of ways. "I was given

opportunities to be a leader – through the Social Work Club and as a Student Lobbyist for example – that really allowed me to step into those sorts of leadership situations more easily. And the campus wasn't super diverse at the time...there was probably a small network of 30 or so African Americans...but that gave me the ability to work more effectively with white people. My cultural competency skills were enhanced because of my time at Glenville," he said.

In addition to his degree from Glenville State, Franklin also holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Education and a Master of Science degree in Physical Education from The University of New Mexico. Over the years he has accumulated a number of recognitions including the Outstanding African American Staff/Faculty Award, the Galesburg Human Relations Award, 2013 Illinois Department of Health Excellence in Community Leadership Award, and 2017 Larin Y. Cowan Make a Difference Award for Leadership in Diversity as a few examples.

More recently he and **Tim Cunningham '76**, along with others, were instrumental in organizing GSC's Black Alumni History Week that first started in 2018. They also worked to establish the Bob Minnieweather Scholarship Fund through the GSC Foundation.

After a personal and professional career filled with accomplishments and accolades, Franklin remains humble. "Nothing I do is because of me, there have always been other people involved. I give God the glory for all things in my life," he said.

Tony says that despite the years that have passed since their time together on campus as students, he and his fellow Pioneers still love to stay in contact. "Every month some old Glenville classmates and I try to have a Zoom call just to stay caught up with one another. Here it is 40+ years later and we still communicate. It came up in the conversation recently that I'm the youngest of the group," he said with a laugh. "But I'll retire one of these days. And at that stage, whatever else God needs me from me, that's what I'll do." ■

1980s Ken Kuhl

Since 2001, **Kenneth “Ken” Kuhl ‘82** has been the Senior Vice President of Arena Programming at the American Airlines Center in Dallas, Texas. But before that, he was a local guy from Letter Gap, West Virginia.

“I lived in the area and Glenville was just the place to go, plus it had a great reputation. I had planned on becoming a physical education teacher and coach. But I didn’t know what my career path would hold at the time,” Ken said.

He says that Glenville gave him the opportunity to really grow into an adult. “Even though I lived at home, we weren’t far so I still spent a lot of time on campus,” Ken said. “Some of my favorite memories from my years at GSC were spending time with friends in the student union...playing spades and foosball and being in the bowling alley.”

Additionally, Ken worked in the Media Center where he would set up speakers, helped with the public address system at the football stadium, and learned to solder broken electronics to get them working again. He even occasionally took to the microphone to do announcing at football and basketball games.

“The professors and instructors at Glenville were great. And the smaller classes helped keep those classroom interactions more one-on-one,” he recalls. “I was actually talking to a friend not long ago, asking if he could remember one of our GSC professors who was a walking encyclopedia of music...he could name the album, the artist, could tell you who produced it, almost anything. It was [Professor Emeritus] Wayne de Rosset of course – but those were the kinds of relationships we had with our professors, we actually got to know one another,” he added.

After graduating, Ken obtained an internship at the Louisiana Superdome. “That internship changed my life,” he said. “My family knew **Denzil Skinner ‘54** who was president of the company that ran the Superdome and he helped me out. It took a while for the people there to warm up to me because they thought I might be a spy for Denzil,” he joked.

During the internship, Angelo Chetta, Vice President for Operations at the venue, took Ken under his wing and taught him about facilities management. “Outside of my mom and dad and the structure I had growing up, Angelo was probably one of the most influential people who I’ve encountered in my life,” Ken said.

After the internship, Ken spent six years at the Superdome as the Senior Event Manager. Before his current role at American Airlines Center, he was the Director of Events and Booking for Reunion Arena in Dallas, Texas where the NBA Dallas Mavericks and NHL Dallas Stars played until the American Airlines Center opened in 2001.

He has a long list of high profile events under his belt from throughout his years in arena management. They include Big 12 Basketball Championships, NHL All-Star Games, USFSA National Figure Skating Championships, NBA Finals, a Superbowl, Men’s and Women’s Final Four, and a Republican National Convention.

In 2017 he was voted as a Venue Executive of the Year finalist in a survey by Pollstar. “That was one of my proudest moments,” Ken said. The award recognizes venue executives who exhibit integrity, operational competence, marketing savvy, a can-do attitude, flexibility, calm under stress, and business acumen. “That award is voted on by my peers – and that certainly meant a lot to me. It also takes into consideration the number of concerts booked, ticket sales, revenue generated, and so on.”

Ken says that the Coronavirus pandemic has, not surprisingly, brought most all events that are traditionally held at the American Airlines Center to a halt. “Concerts, conventions, sporting events...they all went away. But now I’m looking forward to seeing our business back through the pandemic. We need a full building to be successful and people need to be confident that they’ll be safe when out in a large crowd. We’ve been

Monica & Sterling Beane Jr. 1990s

Monica (Null) Beane ‘96 and **Sterling Beane, Jr. ‘96** found one another, and themselves to a certain extent, at Glenville State College.

“Both of my parents (**Judy (Morris) Beane ‘86** and **Sterling P. Beane, Sr. ‘70**) graduated from Glenville, so I was familiar with the college. It was just far enough away from home to provide independence, but close enough for support when I needed it,” Sterling said. “I received an academic scholarship out of high school and wanted to play basketball at GSC. The basketball part didn’t work out, but I quickly found a home on the cross country and track teams.”

Monica originally enrolled at another college, despite urgings from her dad to attend Glenville. Her father (**Michael C. Null ‘81**) and brother (**Michael A. Null ‘95**) are both graduates and her aunt, Joyce (Monroe) Beck attended GSC in the 1970s. “I originally wanted to go to college where none of my high school classmates were going. I transferred to GSC my sophomore year to join the cross country and track teams and I was amazed that Glenville was a perfect fit for me. The class sizes provided quality opportunities for me to learn from my professors – who not only knew my name, but also pushed me to excel academically, athletically, and personally,” she said.

Both Monica and Sterling were on the track and cross country teams during most of their time as Pioneers. Monica was also a member of Phi Beta Lambda and wrote for the *Mercury*.

These days Sterling is a Senior Account Executive for Microsoft. In that role he is responsible for Microsoft’s K-12 education accounts in North Carolina and Virginia. Monica continues to serve as Senior Client Relations Director for Educational Testing Services (ETS), working directly with the professional educator program in 13 states. They have a son, Sterling “Price” Beane, III.

Both credit Glenville State’s professors with ensuring they were prepared for their future careers.

“The academics and professors were excellent. And I had opportunities through athletics to develop discipline and leadership skills that have served me well. I was fortunate enough to be coached by **Steve Harold ‘87** and **Randy Maxwell ‘89**, and I was a part of multiple conference championship teams in both track and cross country,” Sterling said.

“GSC molded me into the professional I am today,” Monica says. “I was given opportunities to lead, to learn, and to excel. As a student-athlete, I further developed my individual work ethic as it directly impacted the overall success of the team. My leadership style today is based on the understanding gained from experiences at GSC. As the captain of the cross country team, I learned to negotiate with [former Athletic Director] Rich Rodriguez, to secure new uniforms for the women’s team. Working part-time for [Professor Emeritus] Dr. James Hilgenberg in the social sciences division, I learned time-management and the importance of being trusted with confidentiality. When I was possibly not going to be able to graduate on time because a class wasn’t offered until the fall semester, I learned to advocate for myself and communicate with faculty and leadership to schedule an independent study course with [Professor Emerita] **Yvonne (Hart) King ‘57**. This leads me to the most important skill I learned at GSC – and one that I use every day in my current role – developing and cultivating relationships.”

Monica says she also credits GSC for the preparation of some of her own teachers. “The most influential role model I had in high school was Mrs. **Eileen (Gross) Shaver ‘68**. She taught me that I am responsible for my success in life and that I always have value to add. I also was taught and coached by **Adair “D.A.” Wilson ‘73** from elementary through high school. He encouraged me to pursue distance running as early as sixth grade, even when Wirt County didn’t have a track or cross country team. Without that, I most likely never would have met Sterling,” she said.

2000s Dr. Andrew Minigh

Dr. Andrew Minigh '09 appreciates keeping things local.

The Glenville, West Virginia native will tell you that he grew up at Cedar Creek State Park where his father served as park superintendent. Many of his family members, including his father (**Paul Minigh '76**), mother (**Pam (Hacker) Minigh '82**), and sisters (**Ashley (Minigh) Butcher '09** and **Dr. Andrea (Minigh) Kinder '13**), are all Glenville State graduates.

When the time came to attend college, he knew that he wanted to become a dentist and staying local just seemed to make sense. "I already knew several of the professors at Glenville. And I knew that I wanted to go to dental school and that I would need a lot of biology and chemistry...Glenville had everything that I needed," he said.

After enrolling in 2002, he studied at Glenville State until 2004 when he earned early acceptance into West Virginia University's School of Dentistry. With only a few upper level electives left to complete at Glenville, he finished his degree with transfer credits. Through a technicality, Minigh actually graduated from dental school in 2008 and was awarded his degree from GSC in 2009.

"Being at Glenville gave me a giant leg up. In my upper level science classes, the professor knew you. You weren't working with a TA, you were working with someone who had a real interest in you," he said. "I was well-educated going into dental school coming from Glenville. The classes that I took at GSC, some of them I had almost the exact same class in dental school, just at a different level."

Since 2008 he has operated Minigh Family Dentistry out of an office on South Pike Street in Shinnston, West Virginia. Then, in 2016, he added a second location on Mineral Road in Glenville.

"Having the practice in Glenville is something that I'm really proud of. My parents still live in Glenville and one of my sisters does too," he said, noting that both of his sisters actually work for the

practice. "To have the ability to provide a good living for myself and some of my family members, that's something that I'm very proud of."

Aside from Andrew, Minigh Family Dentistry employs two other dentists to share the workload among the two locations; Dr. Andrea (Minigh) Kinder and Dr. Janel Martin.

Thinking back on his time at GSC, Minigh says he considers himself lucky to have had the types of interactions he did with his professors.

"I really enjoyed [Professor Emeritus] Mr. **[Jim] Meads '68** class. He tasked us with catching a reptile and an amphibian to bring to class. Of course, everyone was bringing in the tiniest things they could find and he would bring in a water snake or a big black snake and then would have them out in the hallway just to mess with us," he said laughing. "Mr. Meads was very influential when I was there. I still have a relationship with him today – he's a wonderful guy, a wonderful teacher. Some of my best memories were in his class."

He also recalled classes to Professor Emeritus Dr. James Hilgenberg, noting the way he related history to make it new.

"And **Dr. [Kevin] Evans '87**...he really pushed us in our chemistry classes to excel. He wrote me a wonderful letter of recommendation to get into dental school. He was probably the best teacher that I've ever had. Every bit of information that he threw at us or wrote on the chalkboard, I took time to absorb it. Organic or inorganic chemistry...he did such a thorough job explaining things that I felt like I could walk out of there and teach chemistry myself," he said.

As a young professional, Minigh sometimes thinks about the perception that places like Glenville have among those who have never visited.

"When you're not from Glenville, I think it's harder to get people to give Glenville a chance. But once they do...they're hooked. I think that's why you see people

Harmonia Rosales 2010s

For **Harmonia Rosales '14**, art was always present in her life, even at a young age.

Rosales was born in Chicago and raised in Champaign, Illinois, with her parents. "My mom was a children's book author and illustrator, so she would always be at her art table. As a child, I would make my little nest there and sleep most of the time. Often times, when she was painting, she would drop her paintbrush, and I would pick it up for her. Before I would give it back, I would use the little bit of paint from the brush on my paper. My mother saw that and nurtured it by not just teaching me, but providing me with the materials I needed."

Rosales began mimicking paintings that her mother did. "She believed in constructive criticism," said Rosales. "I would paint portraits and purposely not add the hands because hands are hard. She would give me an anatomy book and tell me to learn bone structure and the muscles."

Growing up, her inspiration came from other places as well. "My uncle would sometimes take us to Chicago to visit him, and he would take us to the art museums – that was my favorite place." In those museums, Rosales discovered her interest in Renaissance paintings – an interest that would later define her unique style. "They were very much like pictures in children's books, and I would tell my own stories with them. As I got older, I applied that concept, but it included people of color's identities – especially my West African history – into those images," she said.

Rosales' father worked at the University of Illinois, which is where she began her college art career. She was accepted into the Arts College because of her talent but found that it was too structured. "I felt like they were producing, and I can only speak at that time, cookie-cutter artists," she said. After a break, Rosales relocated with her then-husband to Glenville State College. "During that big gap between the University of Illinois, me taking a break, and finding my ex-husband, I didn't do art because I didn't feel like I could make money or was appreciated. I

didn't really paint at all during that time." When her mother suggested that she complete her degree at Glenville State College, Rosales reached out to Professor Emeritus, Wayne de Rosset. "He got me in right away. He didn't make it hard for me. He actually made me appreciate English through the way he taught it – it was fun," she said.

Though reluctant, Rosales also added a few art classes to her schedule. "When I first went to take some art classes, I was like, 'oh, I hate art classes.' But the faculty in the art program taught me to do art my way and encouraged me to develop my own style." Rosales won the first award for her art at Glenville State College, which she says really encouraged her.

"The environment was so peaceful among the mountains," she reflects. "Everybody was just so warm. I had my daughter and was taking night classes. If I needed somebody to watch my daughter, they would make accommodations. The football coach at the time would even babysit my daughter so that I could go to class. Also, in Glenville, I didn't feel like anybody saw or treated anybody differently because of the color of their skin. Everybody was treated the same."

Today, Rosales' artistic focus is on black female empowerment in western culture through depicting and honoring the African diaspora. She reimagines famous Renaissance paintings to feature people of color and seeks to reimagine them in new forms of aesthetic beauty. Her message is not to create an ideal or simply copy, but rather to create a sense of harmony.

"When I would show my daughter a Renaissance painting, she would not be as interested because she would say, 'they don't look like me – her beauty is not my beauty.' So, being able to see through my children's eyes, who are completely innocent and just pure love, led me to create the artwork I am doing now. They are my greatest accomplishments because they have influenced me 100%."

Rosales encourages young artists who are trying to find their place in the industry to find their voice. "I think you can sell anything as long as you believe in it."

he received that had been arranged by Bob Higgins. “In the time I was away working on my doctorate, the Dean of Men position had to be filled as Dr. Wilburn couldn’t hold it open for me. After I finished, Dean **Delmer Somerville ‘36** recommended me to the Dean of Education at Marshall University to fill the Associate Dean position they had open; 30 years later I retired from Marshall,” Bill said. Martha earned a master’s degree in education and went to work in the accounting office at Marshall University. During their last two years there, she served as the business manager for the University’s H.E.L.P. Center. They retired at the same time.

In their retirement, Bill and Martha have both served as president of the GSC Alumni Association at different times. They recall traveling around to alumni chapter meetings with **Ralph Holder ‘56** and GSC’s long-time Alumni Director Debbie (Reed) Nagy as fond memories from those times. They have also served on the GSC Board of Governors, GSC Foundation Board, and in other roles within the Alumni Association.

“Glenville State College offered me not just a degree, but personal development, importance of community, and life-long friendships. One of those life-long friendships Glenville afforded me happens to be Bill,” Martha said. “We know the importance of Glenville State College to the State of West Virginia and have supported it by being active in the Alumni Association, the Foundation, the Board of Governors, and by mentioning GSC at every opportunity.”

“There was a guy in our church who would say, brothers and sisters, say a good word for Jesus. And when I was Alumni Association president I adapted that. implementing some of those safeguards at the American Airlines Center in the form of socially distanced watch parties for our NHL team’s Stanley Cup Finals pursuit recently. They’ve gone well and from what we’ve seen people are eager to get back out again, but they have to be safe and the time has to be right,” he said.

That comeback is something Ken sees happening over the coming months and years. Longer term? “Retirement!” he says with a laugh. “I started working in this business right out of graduate school in 1983 and I’ve loved every minute of it – still do. But, you know, I think I could picture myself being retired.” ■

A YEAR IN REVIEW

While the 2019-20 academic year will long be remembered for the COVID-19 pandemic and how the final two months of the school year were forced fully online, the world of collegiate sports will be a critical chapter when the history books attempt to dissect the overall impact of the event. Here at Glenville State College, the pandemic put an end to spring sports which were just a few weeks in, and ended the post-season run of the Mountain East Conference Champion (MEC) Lady Pioneer Basketball squad.

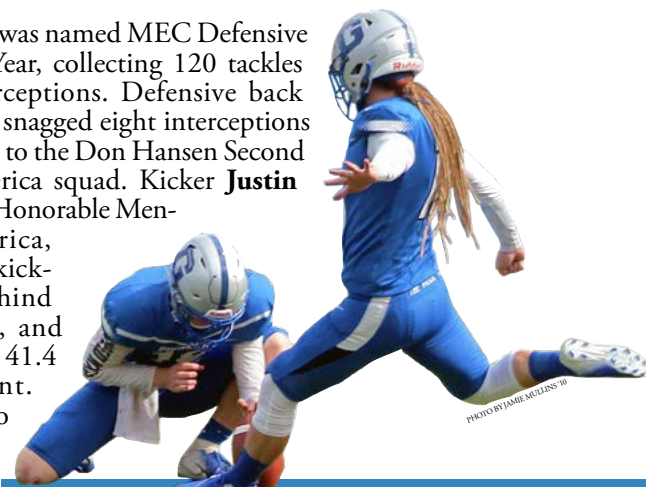
Still, there was much to celebrate during the 2019-20 seasons. Glenville moved up two spots in the Mountain East Conference Commissioner's Cup Standings, finishing ninth overall. They also produced three student-athletes who earned high individual honors within their sport.

In the fall, freshman golfer Kyle Chung won the individual title at the MEC Championships. His Player of the Year season was a major boon to Coach **John Lilly's '76** young team, as a medalist with a one-under par performance at the Championships, winning the title by an astounding six strokes.

In football, the Pioneers finished 7-4 under first-year head coach Mike Kellar. Senior linebacker **Dominic**

Cizauskas '19 was named MEC Defensive Player of the Year, collecting 120 tackles and four interceptions. Defensive back Delonte Hood snagged eight interceptions and was named to the Don Hansen Second Team All-America squad. Kicker **Justin Watts '20** was Honorable Mention All-America, recording 88 kicking points behind 21 field goals, and also averaging 41.4 yards per punt. Seniors Mario Pender, Javon Butler, and Austin Ratliff were all Second Team All-MEC.

Glenville's women's golf team returned in 2019, and the team surprised many by finishing seventh, just missing making the third day cut by a playoff. Freshman Kendall Wall finished third overall at the Championships, earning Freshman of the Year. GSC's volleyball team finished tied

for 11th in the MEC, the women's cross country team eighth, and the men's cross country team seventh. Volleyball's Karlei Shaver made the MEC All-Freshman team.

Women's soccer won that program's first three games in program history. They also produced their first MEC victory, an historic 3-2 win over Wheeling. Boxing's season was highlighted by long-time star **Francois "Frank" Scarboro Jr. '20**, closing his career with a thrilling home victory.

In the winter, Glenville's Women's Basketball team rolled to their fourth consecutive MEC title, posting a 26-5 record and also winning the MEC Tournament. They were in Erie, Pennsylvania for the NCAA Tournament when play was stopped due to the pandemic. Sophomores Re'Shawna Stone and Zakiyah Winfield were First-Team All-Conference performers, while senior Emily Stoller was named MEC Tournament MVP. Coach **Kim Stephens '11** is now 111-16 overall at GSC, a staggering 87.4 winning percentage.

Glenville's men's basketball team finished in a tie for fifth with an overall mark of 14-15. Senior **Phil Bledsoe '20** earned First Team All-Conference honors.

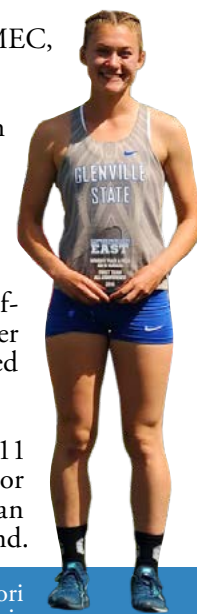
At the MEC Indoor Track and Field Championships, GSC senior **Tori Lewis '20** earned league MVP honors with a tally of 24.25 points. Senior **Megan Wilfong '20** was Second-Team All-Conference and set school records in both the weight throw and shot put. Seniors Javon Butler and Michael Null were also Second-Team. The

women finished fourth in the MEC, and the men sixth.

In the spring, the baseball team was enjoying a solid 10-6 season, including a win over nationally-ranked Mercyhurst. Senior pitcher Jesse Weathers was dominant, sitting at 3-0 with a 1.05 ERA in 34 innings of work. Offensively, Tre'von Smith and Tyler Phillips had each already recorded four home runs.

The softball team was sitting at 9-11 at the time of the stoppage. Senior pitcher **Tori Ward '20** posted an impressive 6-2 record on the mound. The Acrobatics and Tumbling team had a rebuilding year in 2020, and was 0-3 when competition was stopped.

Since the onset of the pandemic, three head coaches have been hired. The new wrestling program now has Dylan Cottrell as head coach. Cottrell is native of Spencer, West Virginia and was West Virginia University's first Big 12 wrestling champion. The Acrobatics and Tumbling team hired Courtney Stack; she was a member of the nationally ranked team at Fairmont State as an athlete and served as the head coach for two years at Urbana. The softball team has hired Sara Scoone; she was a starter on the West Virginia Wesleyan squad that was third in the nation in 2017.

Currently, the GSC teams are working through conditioning and team activities within regulations from the NCAA and local health officials.

As Pioneers, the student-athletes and the entire Glenville State Athletic Department are working to be prepared to return to play whenever that time comes! ■

In 1968, the Gwynn Park basketball program won the Maryland State Championship. Following that historic season, Carney returned to GSC for the 1968-69 academic year. He would serve as GSC’s assistant coach in Men’s Basketball and take over the Men’s Golf program. Gandee took over the reins at Gwynn Park as head coach. The success would continue at GPHS, and also the pipeline from that area to GSC with basketball talent.

Serving alongside head coach **Jesse Lilly ‘48**, Carney was the basketball assistant for 11 seasons; 1969 through 1979. During this stretch, GSC won a pair WVIAC Tournament titles in 1970 and 1972, and advanced to the NAIA National Tournament in 1972. Along the way, Carney’s Maryland connection was able to recruit several Gwynn Park players to join the Pioneer program; this included **Ron Jones ‘73**, **Earl Hawkins ‘74**, **Steve Datcher ‘73**, **Randy Datcher ‘76**, **Robert Hawkins ‘77**, and **Eric Makle ‘75**.

It was during the same decade of the 70s that Glenville’s golf program became a dominant force in the WVIAC under Carney. They won the school’s first league title in that sport in 1972, and would win five more in the decade. Before Carney’s tenure was complete in that sport, the program would win a total of 12 championships.

“When I took over as golf coach, the cupboard wasn’t bare,” Carney clarified. “We had some nice players like Wayne Mencer, **Jim Collins ‘69**, Bob Greene, Chris Fitzsimmons, and **Charlie Carpenter ‘71**. We just had to recruit a few key pieces and then we had some championship teams.”

By Carney’s fourth year, the team snagged the aforementioned title in 1972, the program’s first. After that, a steady stream of great players found their way to Glenville. **Terry Crislip ‘77**, **Joe Crislip ‘80**, **Jim Brady ‘79**, **Jim Scott ‘77**, **Greg Del Prince ‘80**... all greats from the 70s. Del Prince was coached in high school in Ohio by former GSC player **Eddie Armstrong ‘58**, who referred the future Hall of Famer to Carney.

In the fall of 1979, Carney took over

the program in Women’s Basketball. He would remain on the bench in that program for nine seasons, coaching the Lady Pioneers from the 1980 season through the 1988 campaign. The team would make the WVIAC Tournament Final Four in eight of these nine seasons, and win exactly 17 five different times.

“When I took over the Lady Pioneers, the women’s game was just starting to flourish,” Carney said. “**Gene Davis ‘63** and Barbara Maiocco had some good years before me, and I was able to inherit some good players. That first team had **Mary (Zangari) Griffith ‘82**, **Debbie (Grogg) Munis ‘80**, **Pam Linger ‘82**, **Kim (Goodwin) Lewis ‘80**, and **Kim (Bickel) Sigman ‘81**...we were able to bring in a local star in **Pam Minigh ‘83** that first year, then we added **Lavern “Bunny” Taylor ‘84** the following year. Zangari helped us get **Sonja (Bailey) Craft ‘85** as well, and by then, the program was off and running.”

After the 1988 season, Carney resigned, choosing to devote his work time to golf and his faculty responsibilities. He definitely left his mark, finishing as the school’s all-time leader in wins with a 146-73 record. He would hold this mark for over a decade, and remains in the number two spot all-time.

Coaching golf only during the final seven seasons of his career as a head coach, the Glenville golf program took off to even greater heights. The 1985 squad was Carney’s first Top Ten National team, finishing ninth. His 1993 team finished as National Runner-up, and the 1994 team finished sixth.

Carney’s 27th and final season was in 1995...another WVIAC league title. In all, he coached league titles in 1972, 1974, 1975, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1985, 1987, 1990, 1993, 1994, and 1995.

The golf program had its own stable of stars throughout the 80s and 90s. **Bob Sowards ‘90** and **John Forrest ‘86** would earn All-America honors, and going into the 90s, **Patrick Geraghty ‘93** would begin a stream of great GSC golfers from Ireland. All-Americans **Michael Barrett ‘95** and **Colin Cassidy ‘95** would become major stars on the national stage, as did Canadian Vance Fitzsimmons. It was a special time for the GSC Golf dynasty.

Carney stepped down following the 1995 golf season.

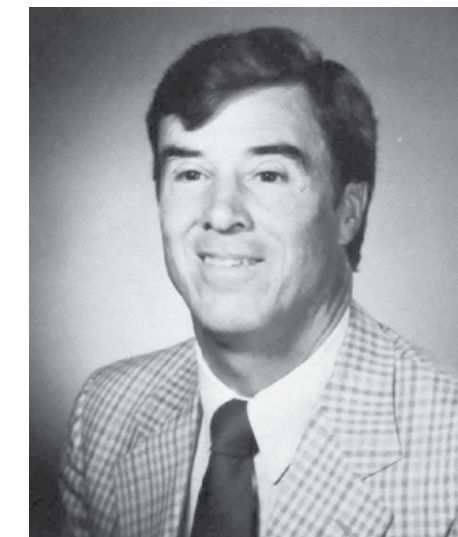
After his coaching career, Carney served a stint as GSC’s Director of Athletics. For the 1999 and 2000 basketball seasons, he returned to the bench, serving as an assistant to head Coach **Steve Harold ‘87**. It was a fitting curtain call for Carney, as those two versions of the Lady Pioneers set the table for an amazing run to follow.

In 2005, Carney was inducted into the Glenville State College Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame. As a student-athlete or coach/faculty member, Carney served the college for a total of 36 years. When the dust settled, he had coached or worked with a total of 27 Hall of Famers. He played for three Hall of Fame coaches, played with one member, coached 11 inductees as a head coach (five in golf, six in basketball), and 12 as a basketball assistant (nine men, three women).

After Glenville, Tim and Linda moved to South Carolina, where they still reside today. The legendary coach enjoys a life of sunshine and golf. In reflection, his contributions to GSC are monumental, and he possesses a volume of Pioneer memories. He spends his summer nights now, enjoying the broadcasts of his beloved Los Angeles Dodgers.

“My time at Glenville was truly the best years of my life,” Carney reflected. “I heard **Mack Samples ‘64** say once that these were the ‘Golden Years’ for GSC. I wholeheartedly agree with him...my time as a student, then as a coach and teacher...it was a very special time to be at Glenville.”

“I would do it all over again.” ■
