Dr. E. Francene (Davis) Kirk '82 is a professor in the Department of Communication and Theatre Arts at Fairmont State University. She holds a doctorate in curriculum and instruction from WVU and teaches theatre education, children's drama, creative drama, storytelling, group communication, and documentary storytelling.

In 2005, Dr. Kirk was given the Boram Award for Teaching Excellence and, in 2013, was named the third Abelina Suarez Professor at Fairmont State. This is the only named professorship on Fairmont's campus. The active professorship is held

for five years and the name remains with the honoree in perpetuity.

During the course of the professorship, she interviewed 30 women who are/were age 60 and older about their lives. These oral history interviews were turned into scenes and monologues that resulted in three theatre productions at Fairmont State, including a one-person show that she performed in April of this year. The title of the oneperson show was 9 before IX, the title being in reference to the fact that these women were educated before Title IX was implemented in schools. Title IX protects students from discrimination based on gender in federally funded schools including colleges and universities accepting federal financial aid. Title IX has changed the way we talk to and about women. For example, before Title IX was passed in 1972, a female student could be denied access to medical school or law school simply for being female. These theatre productions brought women's stories to life. Some of the stories are funny; in one story a girl learns to cuss by emulating her father only to find out that he didn't "ever want to hear her talk like that again." Some of the stories reflect the darker side of gender discrimination. In one story, a graduate student was propositioned by her thesis advisor who showed
