GSC Ranked as WV's Most Affordable College

Glenville State College was recently recognized as the Most Affordable College in West Virginia by Academic Influence. To qualify as an affordable college on Academic Influence, the college must be fully accredited, a non-profit institution, offer a broad range of bachelor's degrees, and have stated tuition and fees under \$16,000.00 per year.

Academic Influence also ranked Glenville State College among the top five across four other categories. In addition to ranking first in WV Affordable Colleges, GSC received second in WV Best Small Colleges, second in WV Liberal Arts Colleges, fourth in WV Best Public Colleges, and fourth in WV Best Colleges.

"I'm pleased that Glenville State College has earned this recognition. I believe being ranked, not only as an affordable college, but also a top Liberal Arts College is a great accomplishment. Affordability is important for students and their families, there's no question about that, but at Glenville State College a quality, hands-on education is even more important. Fall Semester Return to Campus

The upcoming fall 2021 semester at Glenville State College will be returning to a prepandemic normal.

Incoming first-time students will take part in a reinvigorated weeklong orientation beginning on Monday, August 9. The orientation will include welcome activities, a concert, food, and the traditional convocation ceremony which officially welcomes new students to the campus community. That ceremony is scheduled for Friday, August 13 at 2:00 p.m.

Monday, August 16 is the first day of fall semester classes. The <u>fall academic calendar</u> also sets final exams for December 6-9 with the winter commencement ceremony taking place on Saturday, December 11.

Courses will once again be fully in-person as well, as they were prior to the pandemic. Most courses had been offered either fully online or in a hybrid format over the past academic year due to COVID-19.
