GSC Ranked a Top Ten Regional College

Glenville State College has improved its ranking among the top regional colleges for 2022 according to newly released U.S. News and World Report Best Colleges rankings.

Glenville State College ranked #9 in Top Public Schools – Regional Colleges South, #43 in Best Regional Colleges – South, #7 in Best Colleges for Veterans – Regional Colleges South, and #16 in Top Performers on Social Mobility in the 2022 assessment. For the 2021 assessment, GSC was ranked #16 in Top Public Schools and #55 (tie) in Best Regional Colleges.

According to U.S. News and World Report, the schools listed in the Best Regional Colleges assessment focus almost entirely on the undergraduate experience and offer a broad range of programs in the liberal arts and in fields such as business, nursing, and education.

GSC Receives \$1.42 million from Appalachian Regional Commission's POWER Initiative

Glenville State College was awarded \$1.42 million by the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) to develop a Cybersecurity and Safety Workforce Development Initiative serving the coal-impacted communities of Barbour, Braxton, Calhoun, Clay, Doddridge, Harrison, Gilmer, Lewis, Nicholas, Ritchie, Roane, Tyler, Upshur, Webster, and Wirt. This award is part of a \$46.4 million package supporting 57 projects across 184 coal-impacted counties through ARC's POWER (Partnerships for Opportunity and Workforce and Economic Revitalization) Initiative. POWER targets federal resources to communities affected by job losses in coal mining, coal power plant operations, and coal-related supply chain industries. Additional support for the initiative is provided by the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation.

"The downturn of the coal industry has impacted economies across Appalachia. That's why ARC's POWER initiative helps to leverage regional partnerships and collaborations to support efforts to create a more vibrant economic future for coal-impacted communities," said ARC Federal Co-Chair Gayle Manchin. "Many of the projects we announced today will invest in educating and training the Appalachian workforce, nurturing entrepreneurship, and supporting infrastructure—including broadband access. These investments in our Appalachian coal-impacted communities are critical in leveling the economic playing field so our communities can thrive."

"We are very pleased to be part of this workforce development investment that is designed to impact our local communities," said Glenville State College President, Dr. Mark A. Manchin. "Careers in cybersecurity are growing and will only continue to grow in our ever-expanding digital world. We are grateful to the Appalachian Regional Commission

Jerry '76 and Kathy Zaferatos are the 2021 Pioneer Football Game Ball Sponsors.



GSC Athletic Hall of Fame to Formally Induct 2020 Class Members

Following months of delay due to COVID-19, the six members of the 2020 Glenville State College Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame class will officially be inducted on Saturday, September 25.

The inductees – who include Larry Gandee '62, Jim Carter '75, Mark Reger '74, Lloyd Willis '87, Andy Jarrell '89, and Monique Johnson '90 – were originally announced last year.

The banquet and induction ceremony will take place in the Mollohan Campus Community Center Ballroom at 6:00 p.m. A social reception will precede the event at 5:00 p.m. Tickets for the event are \$25. Face coverings are required.

Gandee was a three-year starter who scored over 1,000 career points in basketball. He later coached at Gwynn Park High School where, as head coach, he tallied a record of 237-74 and led the program to eight state title games, winning six of the eight.

Carter was a First Team All-WVIAC selection, was a running back on GSC's 1973 National Runner-Up Team, and ran for a school record 949 yards in 1973.

Reger played defensive tackle for the Pioneers in the early 1970's, was a member of Glenville State's 1973 National Runner-Up Team, and was a First Team All-WVIAC selection in 1973. He went on to a distinguished coaching career after GSC.

Willis was a four-year starter for the Pioneer Track Team, was a member of the Track & Field WVIAC Title Teams Track & Field in 1984 and 1986, and was a three-year champion in both the long jump and triple jump. He went to Nationals three times (twice outdoor and once indoor) and finished tenth in 1986 at Nationals.

Jarrell was an All-Conference performer who ran on championship teams at GSC (three in Track and three in Cross Country). He competed three times at Nationals in Cross Country and was the High Point man at the WVIAC Championship in 1986. He also made Nationals twice in the steeplechase and has the second fastest time in school history in the steeplechase, 5,000, and 10,000.

Johnson was a three-time All-WVIAC First Team selection, scored 1,731 points in her career and ranks fourth All-Time at Glenville State. She pulled down 684 Rebounds in her career (ranks 17th All-Time at GSC), dished out 271 Assists in her career (ranks 18th All-Time at GSC), and had 152 Steals in her career (ranks 24th All-Time at GSC). She won a league title in 1989, the first in school history.

Glenville State College's Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 2001 through the generosity of the late Curtis Elam '49.
