

Edward "Eddie" Johnston '67 is enjoying his retirement after a storied career in teaching and is currently serving as a basketball and golf coach.

Eddie began his teaching career in 1967 following his graduation from Glenville State where he served as a teacher at several schools in Ohio including Marietta, Bucyrus, Morgan, Warren, Crooksville, and West Muskingum.

As a coach, he received several Coach of the Year awards in Ohio's District 12, earned the District 12 Distinguished Service Award in 2005, and was inducted

In 1967, he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in education in health and physical education as well as history and government. He then went on to complete master's degree work at West Virginia University and **Bowling Green State** University.

Originally from Sistersville, West Virginia, Eddie currently resides in Zanesville. Ohio with his wife Emily. Together they have two children and six grandchildren. In his spare time, he enjoys golfing, staying fit, and swimming. He also works part time at the Zanesville Country Club, where he has established a local golf tournament to provide scholarships to junior golfers.

GSU has Lowest Regular Tuition for 2022-2023

Despite a slight percentage increase, Glenville State University is reporting the lowest regular tuition and fees (\$8,044) for the 2022-2023 academic year among other fouryear public institutions in West Virginia.

"Obtaining a college education is not something that should be reserved for only a certain few, but rather should be accessible to all," said Glenville State University President, Dr. Mark A. Manchin. "We are aware of the financial burden pursuing a degree can bring, particularly during these times of inflation and rising costs. We see that there is sometimes a gap between the cost of attending college and the ability of students and families to pay for that education. Glenville State University is working to bridge that gap in the form of student scholarships because at the end of the day, if a student wants to come to Glenville State, I want to see them be able to attend."

NASA WV Space Grant Selects GSU Student for Internship

Glenville State University student Natalie Fout will receive valuable lifetime work experience with NASA at the Clay Center for the Arts and Sciences this summer. NASA WV Space Grant Consortium (WVSGC) has announced they will sponsor and financially support Fout, who is a mathematics education major at Glenville State.

Unlike typical internships with a mentor-prescribed research plan, the Clay Center's unique experience offers the intern opportunities for personal and professional development by

enhancing their skills in creating STEM-based lesson plans, learning to address multiple age youth groups, and homing in on their unique mentoring style to motivate and inspire WV students to learn. Students were selected to be part of the internship program after a competitive application process and interviews.

"I feel incredibly honored to be selected for the NASA WV Space Grant Consortium Internship Program. I am excited to aid in developing fun and enriching summer camps at the Clay Center. As a future educator, I am always searching for ways to become a more knowledgeable and well-rounded person. This program does so many great things for our state, and I am thrilled to be a part of it," Fout said.

"These programs assist us in fulfilling our mission to improve our state's competitiveness in education in science, math, and engineering disciplines," said Candy Cordwell, WVSGC assistant director. "Providing paid summer NASA internships to students is an important step in addressing the limitations on access to STEM job-related experiences and how to change the face of education."

The NASA Space Grant Consortium awards a wide variety of internships and research fellowships to students and faculty from WVU and ten other member institutions for a host of summer internships, research grants, and other opportunities.
