
GSU Students Earn Over \$15,000 in Business Investments

Glenville State University student Avalon Green recently competed in the WV Business Plan Competition hosted by the Encova Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship in the West Virginia University John Chamber College of Business and Economics. She walked away with \$15,000 to help launch her business.

Green, who is working to launch a line of performance golf apparel for women under the moniker Avalon Green Apparel, was presented \$10,000 in prize money as part of the competition. Additionally, 3 Steps to Startup also awarded her with an additional \$5,000 during the awards ceremony.

Glenville State also had four students compete in the WV Innovation and Business Model Competition that was held at Marshall University. Marcus Kelley '22, Marshawn Kelley, Trenton Holcomb, and Jonathan Williams were awarded \$1,000 and a third-place position in the competition. Their concept, the SCup, is a new venture that aims to address safety and security in public settings. The SCup is a restaurant-style beverage container with a lid that uses processors and circuits to notify the owner when the lid is removed without authorization, helping prevent the owner from ingesting doped or poisoned drinks.

Glenville State University, Marshall University BSN Partnership Approved

During its May 12 meeting, the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission approved Marshall University's request to offer the BSN degree on the campus of Glenville State University.

Marshall University and Glenville State University have developed a partnership that intends to alleviate West Virginia's nursing shortage by offering an educational opportunity that is not currently available in the central part of the state. Beginning in fall 2023, Marshall plans to extend its existing BSN program to Glenville's students on Glenville's campus. Students have already begun to enroll in a Pre-Nursing track at Glenville State for the fall 2022 semester.

The program is among 27 nursing education programs at colleges, universities, schools of nursing, and career technical education centers across the state that have received a total of \$25.5 million through Gov. Jim Justice's Nursing Workforce Expansion Program.

"Glenville State University is excited about this opportunity, and I want to again thank Governor Justice for his leadership with this Nursing Workforce Expansion Program. We see the need for nurses in West Virginia and throughout the nation and this initiative will allow us to train more nurses for the future right where we need them the most – in rural areas of our state. So, with this endeavor, I believe that it will make a real difference in the clinics and small hospitals of the Mountain State and beyond," said Glenville State University President, Dr. Mark A. Manchin.

University of the Philippines Los Baños Researchers Visit GSU

Earlier in the spring semester, Glenville State University hosted two scholars from University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) College of Forestry and Natural Resources. The scholars – Dr. Rogelio Andrada and Leilani Castillo – delivered a series of lectures and presentations on ecotourism and biodiversity conservation in the tropics. They were also invited to judge the Poster Presentation at the Pioneer Showcase, Glenville State's annual forum in which undergraduate participants present on their research, experiential learning, and creative projects in all disciplines in a formal setting.

The visit was supported by a West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission J1 - Support Grant through the West Virginia Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (WVEPSCoR) Travel Grant and Glenville State University Professional Development Funds.

"It was a great honor to host Dr. Rogelio Andrada and For. Leilani Castillo. They delivered lectures and presentations on biodiversity and ecotourism, which are very relevant to what we teach in the Department of Land Resources. We hope to continue to collaborate with the UPLB by establishing a faculty, researcher, and student exchange program," said Dr. Rico Gazal, Professor and Chair of the Department of Land Resources. Gazal and three Land Resources students – Ciera Heine '22, Adem Hupp, and Corey Foster – will be traveling to the Philippines this summer to visit the UPLB campus and conduct research on tropical plant biodiversity and ecophysiology. That trip is being supported with funding from a West Virginia

Higher Education Policy Commission Opportunity Grant, GSU Professional Development Funds, an EQT STEM Grant, and the GSU Foundation.

The Glenville State University and University of the Philippines Los Baños student and faculty exchange program, designed to strengthen international experience of students in the field of ecology and environmental science, will soon be formalized with a Memorandum of Understanding. The partnership will commit both academic institutions to provide opportunities for collaboration and positive academic engagement.
