Immediately after graduating from GSC in 1998, Rebecha was offered multiple positions with Berkeley County Schools. She says the education she received at Glenville State made her a highly-qualified special education teacher, an area that was and still is in high demand. She began her teaching career at Martinsburg South Middle School, teaching Special Education. In 2006, she worked as a Special Education Coordinator for Berkeley County Schools Office of Special Education. She notes it was during this time that she realized her heart was happiest with a classroom full of students, so she returned to classroom as a Special Education teacher at Spring Mills Middle School in 2007. She now teaches English as a Second Language at Spring Mills High School and Spring Mills Middle School. Rebecha is also a National Board Certified Teacher, a distinction she earned in 2014 as an Exceptional Needs Specialist.

In addition to her degrees from Glenville State (Elementary Education K-12, Mental Impairments K-12, Specific Learning Disabilities K-12), and Behavior Disorders K-12), Rebecha also holds a master's degree from West Virginia University in Special Education with an Emphasis on Learning Disabilities. In 2020, she became certified to teach English as a Second Language.

She piloted Berkeley County's "Read 180" reading intervention program and middle school inclusion program. Additionally, she has served her school community as Team Leader and Special Education Referral Agent and she started two new programs at Spring Mills High, the Multilingual Student



Glenville State Grad is 2024 WV Teacher of the Year Finalist

Kimberly (Handley) Hunt '02 is among the five finalists for the 2024 Teacher of the Year as recently announced by the West Virginia Department of Education.

Each finalist was selected from county Teachers of the Year winners and is recognized for their contribution to the profession and commitment to supporting and advancing student learning and overall well-being.

Kim is a 17-year veteran of teaching at Roosevelt Elementary School in Point Pleasant, WV.

She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Elementary from Glenville State and a Master of Arts in Literacy Education from Marshall University. Hunt has completed several professional training courses to advance her teaching effectiveness. This has led to her being awarded titles of Mason County Reading Teacher of the Year and the Eddie C. Kennedy Reading Teacher of the Year.

She is a member of the International Literacy Association and a lifetime member of the West Virginia Reading Association. Hunt received the Jeri Calhoun Scholarship for the FOSS Summer Institute in Berkeley, California and the Mason County Community Foundation Grant reflecting her commitment to improving education for all.

The other Teacher of the Year candidates include Sharon Cole, Michael Harshbarger, Jennifer Kirk, and Jamie Young.

West Virginia's 2024 Teacher of the Year and School Service Personnel of the Year will be announced on September 12, 2023, during a ceremony at the Clay Center in Charleston.

Glenville State University's Dr. Amanda Chapman Among 2023 Generation Next Honorees


Glenville State University Associate Professor of English Dr. Amanda Chapman has been named to the




Glenville State University Athletic Hall of Fame 2023 Class Announced
