

Guidelines for Summer Financial Aid

Students register for summer classes, <u>then</u> submit the Summer Financial Aid Application to the Financial Aid Office. Summer aid is limited and awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis, so please submit your applications as soon as possible <u>after</u> registration.

Students <u>may</u> be eligible for summer aid on *less than half-time* (5 and under hours), *half-time* (6, 7 and 8 hours), ³/₄-time (9, 10 and 11 hours) and *full-time* (12 or more hours) credit hours.

Summer Pell Grant funds may also be available if the student was Pell eligible during the 24-25 academic year. If the student was Pell eligible during the 24-25 academic year, then the student can be enrolled for as few as one credit hour in the summer in order to receive Pell Grant funding.

Students must be enrolled at least **6 hours** (half-time) to be <u>considered</u> for **LOANS.** A written request must be submitted to the Financial Aid Office (<u>financial.aid@glenville.edu</u>) if students are interested in summer loans.

Any combination of hours may be taken during all summer terms (example: 3 hours during the first 4-week term and 4 hours during the second 4-week term and 3 hours during the 8-week term = 10 hours for summer = 3/4 time).

Hours *can* be taken for one term only (example: 3 hours during the second 4-week term).

Federal and state financial aid may only pay towards courses required for the student's program of study (CPoS). Courses for elective minors are not considered degree-pursuant courses unless the minor is required in order to obtain the degree. ALL summer hours (up to 12 hours) must be degree-pursuant.

Because summer financial aid is based on the specific number of enrolled hours, students must notify the Financial Aid Office of any adjustments to their enrollment status.

E-mails from the Financial Aid Office will be sent to GSU e-mail accounts if questions arise during the awarding process for summer.

It is the intent of the Financial Aid Office to send award letters for summer in time to allow students to adjust or cancel their hours if they do not receive enough financial aid to cover classes and/or other expenses for summer.

- ---Financial Aid Award Notification Letters will be mailed to the permanent address on file

IMPORTANT

No aid for summer will pay to student accounts until attendance is confirmed for ALL classes for that term.

Students should be prepared to purchase books on their own, without financial aid, at the beginning of the term. There will be no credit checks until attendance is verified in all classes in that term.

To comply with US Department of Education regulations, all student loans processed for only one term will have two disbursement dates within that term (one at the beginning and one halfway through the term). First-time borrowers requesting student loans in the summer are also subject to a 30-day first disbursement delay.

*Rules for awarding/receiving Financial Aid for summer school are subject to change.
