Morris Family Health and Fitness Complex Coming to Glenville State

Visitors to campus may notice a bit of construction work taking place in and around the current site of Morris Stadium. That is because the space will soon become the site of the Morris Family

been there since 2012 and he runs the Bioptic low vision driving program. He previously served as a Driver Education Instructor with the Charleston Job Corps Center for over 23 years. Danny says that everyone who has completed the Bioptic Driving program under his instruction has received their Class G Bioptic Driver's License.

Danny originally came to Glenville State after graduating from Braxton County High School in 1971. The Sutton, West Virginia native majored in Health and Physical Education K-12. Danny also completed some post-graduate work at West Virginia University.

Williams is a longtime supporter of Glenville State Athletics and he has shot film and video for both football and basketball – something that he did for over 30 years. During that time, he worked with eight different head football coaches and with six different Athletic Directors.

When Danny first came to Glenville State, he recalls asking if there were any open jobs for keeping basketball stats since he had some experience doing so for BCHS basketball. Coach Tim Carney '62 told him that he already had work-study students doing stats but, a few weeks later, Coaches Carney and Jesse Lilly '48 asked him if he could handle videotaping basketball games. "I said yes and that I would be happy to do it. Don Phillips, who was in charge of the Media Center, instructed me on the college's video equipment. Since I was doing basketball, that spring, Coach Bill Hanlin '53 asked me if I would videotape the spring game for him, and I said no problem. In the fall of 1973, Coach Hanlin asked me if I could film the football games with the 16 mm camera. I said sure, since there was a trip to Michigan for the

Health and Fitness Complex. The facility will be located adjacent to the Waco Center on the Mineral Road Campus.

"Phase one of the project includes demolition of the current Field House, bleachers, press box, etc. Because of this work, there will be no football games hosted at Glenville State in fall 2025," said Glenville State University President, Dr. Mark Manchin.

The Morris Family Health and Fitness Complex will house the Health Sciences programs at Glenville State, in addition to a fitness center, classrooms, and offices.

"With this facility and our renewed focus on health sciences, it is my hope that Glenville State can help equip students with the ability to excel in rural healthcare," Manchin added.

For the fall football season, any games that the Pioneers would have played at home will take place on a neutral field. Plans are underway to take a Glenville "caravan" around the state to different communities, allowing the opportunity to visit and reconnect with alumni and friends in those areas. There are five games that will be classified as home games for the Pioneers in the 2025 schedule, and talks are underway to schedule games in Kanawha County, Roane County, Harrison County, Nicholas County, and Wood County. More information will be released as the football scheduled is finalized and published.

first game. I again sought out Mr. Phillips to properly operate the 16 mm camera. I became very adept with filming, and I thought that as long as I was nearby I would keep doing filming for football for however long they would have me. To make a long story short, I kept at it through 2008. I only quit because I wanted to see my sons grow up," Williams said.

When the college upgraded its equipment from 16 mm to video tape, the Media Center recorded the home games and Danny covered the away games. This freed him up to run the scoreboard during home games, something he did from 1987 through 1998. He also served a stint as the play-by-play announcer on WKKW radio for Pioneer Basketball from 1981-82.

In recognition of his years of meritorious service to Pioneer Athletics, Williams was inducted into Glenville State's Curtis Elam Athletic Hall of Fame in 2024.

In his spare time, he enjoys golfing and watching sports on TV and in person, especially the Pioneers. Danny was also a member of the Sutton Volunteer Fire Department for 42 years. He and his wife Joan reside in Charleston, West Virginia; they have two sons, Patrick Spradling and Riley Scott.

When asked what Glenville State means to him, Danny said, "Glenville State gave me the knowledge and ability to become the good driver educator that I have become. I try to come back as much as I can. Many of the professors and instructors have left a lasting impression on me, especially Jim Riffle who was my Safety and Driver Ed. instructor."

Historic flooding hit several parts of West Virginia in February and, as they often do, residents from throughout the state have responded to help their neighbors.

A group from Greenbrier County's Emmanuel Community Church (pictured above) visited McDowell County last month to help with cleanup efforts. That team included several alumni (Asa Dick '22, Elijah Dick '24, and Myles Hutton '21) and current GSU student, Simon Bertram.

Staffers from *West Virginia Executive* magazine, including their Graphic Designer Seth Stover '21, went to Kermit, WV in late February to lend a hand to a local resident who had been impacted by the flooding. The *WV Executive* employees said the woman they connected with had been so busy helping others recover from the floods that she hadn't taken time to tend to her own home – so they pitched in to help clear out her basement.

Jared Bishop '23 worked with the Southern West Virginia Chapter of Trout Unlimited and other chapters across the Mountain State, the Virginia Tech Fly Fishing Club, and B&G Pro-Shop and Sportsman's Club to assist with a supplies distribution and cleanup.

Several other groups and individuals with Glenville State connections have also raised money, collected supplies, and visited impacted areas to assist with cleanup efforts – kudos to everyone involved!

Due to the widespread nature of the flooding across southern West Virginia, the state has issued disaster declarations for 13 counties.

He also provided the overall supervision of the day-to-day operations and management of the readiness, fiscal, personnel, equipment, and real property resources of the agency.


