

Hello Students,

Welcome to the Glenville State University Dual Credit/Enrollment Program! We at GSU are eager to have the opportunity to help High School students across the state of West Virginia get an early start on a quality college education.

The Glenville State University Dual Credit/Enrollment Program allows students from across the West Virginia an opportunity to meet high school and college requirements at the same time – hence the name "Dual Credit." In addition, high school students can opt for a number of courses that earn college credit but are not part of the high school curriculum - hence that name "Dual Enrollment." GSU currently enrolls 500 to 600 students each semester through educational partnerships with 19 counties across the state.

Students who complete coursework as a dual enrollment/credit student through Glenville State University are being proactive, as they are getting a "jump-start" not only their college careers but also into their careers of choice. Several program opportunities are available to students enrolled at GSU Associates Degree Program, High School Honors; West Virginia Department of Education Grow Your Own Teachers; and the following pathways: Health Sciences, Social Services, Natural Resource Management, Business Management, and Criminal Justice.

Students who are not yet sure of their eventual career path can take general education courses or explore our course offerings across GSU's eight academic departments, earning college credit toward required or elective units in any public college or university in West Virginia.

Students who take part in any of GSU's educational opportunities are not only saving time but money as well! Glenville State currently offers dual credit enrollment courses at the lowest price in the history of the program: \$25 per credit hour, only \$75 per 3 credit hour course!

# **ACT/SAT Scores**



#### FERPA FORMS AND DIRECTIONS (RO – 03/22)

#### FERPA: FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT RELEASE FORM

This form is required if you wish someone other than yourself to have access to your education records. Complete form with your full name and GSU student ID#. Acknowledge consent of release of education records by checking box. Enter names of individuals or agencies you are giving consent to have access to your records. You must also include a FERPA password so any individual or agency listed will be able to request information on your records over the phone or via email. Sign, date and submit form to the Registrar's Office. Form will not be accepted or processed if it is not completed in its entirety. Please do not submit this form if it is already on file and there are no changes.

#### FERPA REVOCATION FORM

This form is required if you have a FERPA Release Form on file with the Registrar's Office and you no longer wish to give consent for release of your education records to an individual or agency which was indicated on the original release form or you wish to remove the FERPA form entirely from your student record. Complete form with your full name and GSU student ID#. Acknowledge consent of removal of an individual/agency and list the name you wish to remove or request to revoke FERPA release by checking appropriate box. Sign, date and submit the form to the Registrar's Office.

#### REQUEST TO PREVENT DISCLOSURE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION FORM

Directory information (as described on form) can be released without the consent of the student. This form is required if you wish to prevent disclosure of your directory information or to remove a previous request to prevent disclosure on file in the Registrar's Office. Please keep in mind, if you choose to withhold directory information, Univerity officials will not be able confirm your enrollment or degrees awarded with third parties such as potential employers or insurance companies. Complete the form with your full name and GSU Student ID#. Sign, date and submit to the Registrar's Office. If removing previous prevention on file, check box at bottom of form, sign and date.

#### PARENT/GUARDIAN REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO STUDENT'S EDUCATION RECORDS FORM

You as the parent or guardian may complete and sign this form and submit it to the Registrar's Office. You must accompany this form with a signed copy of the preceding year's tax return to demonstrate the student is a dependent for federal income tax purposes. The copy provided must have either been completed by a third party (i.e., H&R Block) or be an official complete copy from the Internal Revenue Service or tax preparation software (i.e., TurboTax). Dollar amounts may be whited out or marked through if you prefer to not share this information. If a copy has already been provided to another office during the admissions process, please notify our office.

This form and accompanying tax return will be required to be completed and submitted for each academic year your student is enrolled at Glenville State University. If a new form is not submitted, your student's education records will no longer be released after the conclusion of the academic year indicated below. In addition, a student has the legal authority to notify the Registrar's Office if he or she is no longer your dependent for federal income tax purposes. If the Registrar's Office has been notified of this change and verifies the change, their education record will no longer be released to you unless the student signs and submits a "FERPA" Release Form" identifying you as having permission to their education records.

# Glenville State University Dual Credit/Enrollment Add/Drop or Withdrawal from a Course

#### What It means to Drop a course:


When students drop a course, they officially unenroll from the class before the add/drop deadline. (Usually the first week of the semester. Please refer to the GSU Academic Calendar page 10.) The course is wiped clean from their academic record. Once the drop is completed, it is as if the student never registered for the class.

#### What it means to Withdraw from a course:

When students withdraw from a course, they officially unenroll from the class after the add/drop deadline. The course appears on their academic transcript with the final grade showing as a "W." **Course withdrawals are not eligible for refunds.** 

#### What it means to FIW a course:

When students stop attending or submitting work for a class they are assigned a grade of FIW - Failure due to Irregular Withdrawal. The course appears on their academic transcript with the final grade showing as an "FIW." This is a failing grade and is treated as an "F" for purposes of grade point average calculation.

# Academic Repeat Policy

Students earning a grade of "D" or "F" (including failures due to irregular (FIW) withdrawal) on any course taken prior to the receipt of a baccalaureate degree may repeat up to twenty-one (21) hours and the original grade shall be disregarded and the grade or grades earned when the course is repeated shall be used in determining the grade point average. The original grade will not be deleted from the student's record.

In upper level courses (300-499), a student may request permission to repeat up to eight (8) credit hours of a grade of "C." To obtain written permission from the Department Chair of the academic unit where the student's major is housed, the student must submit a Request to Repeat a Grade of "C" in an Upper Level Course Form before enrolling in the course they are repeating. When the form has been approved by the appropriate Department chair, it must be submitted to the Registrar's Office for processing.

The "D" or "F" repeat is capped at twenty-one (21) credit hours including any request for a "C" repeat in an upper level course. For example, if you request to repeat 6 hours of C, you would be left with 15 of D and/or F that course be repeated and disregarded for determining the grade point average. Grades disregarded in GPA computation under the Academic Forgiveness Policy are not counted in the twenty-one (21) credit hour cap.

After 21 hours (including up to 8 hours of C) have been repeated, all course attempts are utilized in the computation of the grade point average.

# **Academic Integrity**

Glenville State University requires adherence to the University's standards of academic integrity. While every case of academic dishonesty cannot be listed exhaustively, the following examples represent some basic types of behavior that are unacceptable and also represent those items for which students may be sanctioned.

- 1. Cheating
- 2. Plagiarism
- 3. Self-Plagiarism
- 4. Fabrication
- 5. Obtaining an Unfair Advantage
- 6. Aiding and Abetting Academic Dishonesty
- 7. Falsification of Records and Official Documents:
- 8. Unauthorized Access

# Procedures for Handling Cases of Academic Integrity

Although the specific circumstances of the academic integrity and the professor's individual course policy (as provided to the student in the syllabus) will determine the outcome in each circumstance, the punishment will typically be as follows:

- For the first offense, the student will fail the assignment
- For a second offense (in the same course or in different courses), the student will fail the course
- For a third or subsequent offense, the student will be suspended from the university for the following semester (fall or spring). If the suspension is imposed for fall semester, the student will also not be permitted to enroll in the preceding summer term.
- Particularly egregious offenses may receive more severe penalties, even on the first offense.








# About the Program

Grow Your Own West Virginia is designed to seek promising local high school students and facilitate a career path for them to pursue a career in education. The "Grow Your Own (GYO) West Virginia Teaching Pathway" is designed to address West Virginia's critical teacher shortage. Through the program, high school students who want to become classroom teachers can fast-track into their careers through a combination of dual enrollment/Advanced Placement courses, and an accelerated pathway. Through this pathway, students can graduate from a partner institution of higher education, like Glenville State University, with a bachelor's degree.



# How it Works

Participating K-12 counties identify and recruit students to participate in the "Grow Your Own West Virginia Teaching Pathway" program. High school counselors and partnering institution faculty advisors assist students with scheduling, financial aid, testing requirements, etc. Students graduate from their high schools with a goal of a minimum of 24 - 30 hours of dual enrollment/AP credits, including the four introductory education courses from Glenville State University. During the junior and senior years of high school, students participate in coordinated field placements in county schools.

# Associates Degree in General Studies Program Information

Students who wish to earn an Associate's Degree in General Studies by the time they graduate high school will need to begin taking courses in the fall of their junior year of high school.

Students will take either Dual Enrollment courses face-to-face at their high school or enroll in Dual Enrollment Online Courses.

Students will need to take <u>15</u> credit hours each semester, totaling <u>60</u> credit hours to complete the program. If a student wishes to take a lightened load of credit hours one or more each semester there will be summer course options available that may be used to catch up.

<u>As a requirement</u> for an Associate's Degree, students will need to choose an area of interest in which they will take **12** credit hours out of the **60** required.


AP Credits and Transfer Credits are also accepted for program completion.

Current available areas of interest are as follows: Business, Criminal Justice, Education, Fine Arts, Land Resources, Language and Literature, Science and Math, Health Science, or Social Science. Once an area of interest has been chosen, students will be given further information on courses in that particular area of interest.

Each semester students who have enrolled in the GSU Dual Enrollment Associates Degree Program will be advised by the Off-Campus Programs staff.

The Associate of Science in Forest Technology program at Glenville State University has been offered since 1968 and continues to be successful and in demand. The two-year degree allows students to complete the program promptly and then start their forestry career. Through classroom study, field trips, hands-on lab experiences, and an internship, students will acquire in-depth forestry knowledge and real-world forestry skills.





#### **ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT**


The Department of Science and Mathematics offers baccalaureate (four-year) degrees in biology, chemistry, and mathematics as well as Bachelor of Arts in Education degrees in mathematics (5-9 and 5-Adult), biology (9-Adult), chemistry (9-Adult), and general science (5-9 and 5-Adult). Many students major in biology and/or chemistry to prepare for professional schools such as medical, veterinary, and pharmacy schools.

GSU's relatively small size provides opportunities for personalized student-faculty interactions in both classroom and laboratory settings, with a balance of theoretical and applied instruction.

The biology degree allows students to concentrate on topics such as cellular biology, wildlife biology, or organismal biology. Similarly, the chemistry degree provides the flexibility to tailor the degree to prepare students for careers in chemistry laboratories as well as for graduate school or professional schools. Students who pursue the mathematics degree concentrate on applied topology, business, or science and engineering. Education majors spend three years in content courses followed by a year-long residency in a public school. Due to the high demand for science and mathematics teachers, graduates are quickly placed in teaching positions upon graduation.

Glenville State University students can benefit from partnerships between GSU and other West Virginia institutions. For example, students can enter the Marshall University Pharm.D. program after three years at GSU and after the first year at Marshall, receive a bachelor's degree in biology, chemistry, or interdisciplinary studies from GSU while completing the four years of pharmacy instruction at Marshall. Glenville State University also has a pre-osteopathic medicine program that provides a pathway for seamless admission into the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine.



#### PIONEER LEGACY

#### \$500 per academic year

The Pioneer Legacy Scholarship is an award designed to honor the familial connection and enduring legacy of alumni within the GSU community.
