IX. Committee Reports:

- a. Curriculum Committee: Majority Leader Hypes informed the assembly:
 - i. Health Sciences added a transitional course for pre-nursing to nursing. It was voted on and approved.
 - ii. Social Sciences and Psychology degree changed the CSCI class requirement to a Psych 280 requirement (specifically psychology-based computer course). They are adding the course of behavioral statistics which will be an option to replace general math for psychology majors. They are adding a crisis intervention upper elective. Finally, they are altering course rotation to better accommodate demand for certain classes.
 - iii. Political Science is discontinuing the Appalachian Studies major. With that, the majority of Appalachian studies classes will be gone. Two of them will be retained and they will go to the regular history major. The geography minor was also lost. They are combining the Political Science project with the History one because they are the same.

- iv. Social Studies 5-adult removed the European history requirement, and the concepts and methods class. All content should be covered by World history and American history.
 - v. Since losing the Appalachian Studies major, there is a micro-credential waiting to be approved.
- b. Co-Curricular Committee: Representative Gibson informed the assembly:
- i. They went over the counseling center's assessment plan and the goals that they have. One of the goals were to be involved and participate more in athletic counseling. Another was to be more involved on campus altogether.
 - ii. They filled a position for the other counselor. There are now two counselors.
