 - iii. Students are informing her that Res Life is not effectively taking care of the marijuana issue in Goodwin Hall. Maintenance has informed them that the fire alarm has gone off two times in the last 12 hours because of smoke. She would like to meet with Res Life and Public Safety to take care of the issue.
