a. Vice President: Informed the assembly that the Judicial cabinet met, and they have chosen a Chief Justice: Rita Kelly. They also met with Pro-Temp

a. Gave President Wade's report:

i. President Wade met with the provost yesterday and they are talking about adding microcredentials to one's bachelor's

b. Gave Public Relations report:

- ii. Jar Wars is also going to be held to help raise money for the Athletic department. It will be located in the athletic training room in the Waco. Jar Wars consists of being able to pie certain athletes, coaches, and professors chosen by the SAAC org.
- b. Treasurer: Informed the assembly that the Finance Committee had a successful meeting last week and got started on the dog bag stations cleanup. There is a bill in the works right now and it will be proposed at the next meeting.
- c. Secretary: Encouraged the assembly to submit literature and art to the Trillium.
- d. Parliamentarian: Thanked the assembly for transparency of their attendance at meetings.

IX. Committee Reports:

- a. Curriculum Committee: Majority Leader Hypes shared
 - i. Significant changes:
 - (a) The Fine Arts department will be changing course rotations on three classes. Two of those classes will be alternating to 18-month rotations because of lack of enrollment. The photography class will be increased in rotation, being offered every single semester due to interest.
 - (b) The Honors Program will also be changing course rotation, so now if someone comes in with their associate's degree, they will still be able to be admitted into the Honors Program. They will be offering an honors section every single season instead of only in the fall.

(c) The Math and Science department is also updating their course rotation, but it has not been finalized. All three departments (Fine Arts, Honors Program, and Math and Science) will be coming back with additional changes.

b. Academic Policy Committee: Pro-Temp Gauldin shared

- i. In the past meetings the procedures for Academic Integrity issues have been brought up and have asked to be brought up to the Deans and Chairs at their next meeting. At this past meeting, it was reported that many of the Deans and Chairs thought it was in the best interest of the students to wait to report the violation until a decision has been made.
- ii. There are issues with summer graduate laws within which graduating group, and they discussed that since there were a lot of things that go with changing the policy, a motion was passed to leave it until February so Alumni Council can talk about the change.
- iii. The FERPA Policy was brought up saying that the original policy was vague. There was more language added to who sees private documents, what "education records" is defined as and the rights of the FERPA.
- iv. Diploma Policy is for both undergraduates and graduates. It was created to have a document stating what diplomas are and how to get one in simple terms: how big they are, what comes on them, and the information on printing, digital and replacements.

X. Assembly Reports:

- a. Speaker of House/ Social Science Rep Floyd informed the assembly:
 - i. Psychology Club rescheduled this week's meeting to tomorrow, and Dr. Lieving is going to come in and do a behavioral experiment with a dog. If anyone would like to come and watch, please do.
 - ii. Psychology Club and Criminal Justice Honor Society are collaborating on doing a game of Clue at the Criminal Justice house toward the end of the month.
 - iii. At the Aramark meeting this week it was discussed that Aramark is under a new person, and they are holding a lot of events every month. If anyone decides to take a look at the monthly calendar in the cafeteria and would like to collaborate with Food Services, they can.
- b. President Pro-Temp/ Math and Science Rep Gauldin: Informed the assembly about the wrestling team so far.

- i. Their season started about six days ago and they had their invite in Glenville. There were 14 teams, the Pioneers and 13 others. Last year's regional champions were here, and they blew the other teams out of the water. They were in first place by 100 points.
- ii. They dueled WVU last night, winning 3 out of 10 matches.
- iii. Also, if anyone is graduating next semester, do not forget to apply before the end of the current semester.
- iv. Gave Representative Crites report:
 - (a) The Student Reading Interest Group is hosting an event at the football field in conjunction with the football game. There is going to be soup, baked goods (GSU themed cookies), and drinks. There is also going to be a fall themed raffle basket.
 - (b) The deadline for admission to education is approaching, it is November 21, 2024.

It does have graphic content because it is related to causes of death, however, if one is not sensitive to such things, there will be popcorn for anyone who would come join.
 - ii. Blue and White Day is this weekend and there are a lot of tours expected to come through.
 - iii. At the leadership meeting they discussed a few changes that are relevant to the student population, such as over Thanksgiving Break meal plans will not work. On Thanksgiving Day food services will be serving Thanksgiving dinner. There will be a heavy reliance on the Pioneer Pantry,

- and they are now looking for student workers to work at the Pioneer Pantry.
- iv. With the new turnover at Aramark, the leadership team will be having a meeting with Aramark on November 21, 2024.
- v. Majority Leader Hypes' Intern Elizabeth Adkins gave Senator Tanner's report:
 - (a) The Clothesline Project lead by her sorority alongside Chi Zeta Pi and Alpha Phi Sigma was very successful. It led to some beautiful conversations for those who have been affected by domestic violence in the area and on campus. Expressed gratitude to Majority Leader Hypes and her intern Elizabeth for their immense help.
 - (b) The entire week, of November 18, 2024, the sorority Delta Xi Rho will be hosting a dual fundraiser that will consist of baked sale and raffle for Boo baskets. On that Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, winners will be announced.
