Grace was a teacher for 18 years, a principal for 16 years, and a curriculum director for eight years. She worked at Sand Fork Elementary (teacher), Arnoldsburg and Normantown Elementary Schools (principal), Robert L. Bland Middle School (principal), and Lewis County Schools Board Office (curriculum director).

The Clay, West Virginia native came to GSC to major in Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, and Social Studies Education. During her time at Glenville State, she was also a member of the Ladies of the White Rose, the auxiliary group to the Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity.

After GSC, Grace earned a master's degree from West Virginia University in Leadership Studies in Education.

During her teaching days, she was named Teacher of the Year for Gilmer County and she assisted the WV Department of Education with student assessments.

Grace is married to Russell Tallhamer. Their son, Frankie "Andy" Tomblin, Jr., was a dualenrollment student at GSC while he attended Gilmer County High School. He then went on to WV Wesleyan College and WVU to complete his Pharmacy Ph.D. Their daughter, Misty L. Tomblin '02, attended Glenville State for four years, obtaining a business and marketing degree.

These days her hobbies include quilting, golf, helping others, community service, and fundraising for GSU Women's Golf Team. She also conducts LEI (Love, Educate, Inspire) Educational Consulting.

#### **Country Championships**

Late last month, Glenville State Women's Cross Country star Natalie Barr finished in the top half of the 2025 NCAA DII Cross Country Championships that were held in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

She placed 109th out of 263 runners in the 6K championship race, crossing the finish line at 21:56. Barr was one of the top five finishing Mountain East Conference runners. Adams State's Tristian Spence won the national title with a time of 20:11.

Barr completed her historic 2025 season with an Atlantic Regional championship, third-consecutive All-Region honor, third-straight All-Conference finish (second All-MEC First Team in a row), and was named USTFCCCA Atlantic Region Runner of the Year.

The Canvas, West Virginia native and GSU junior is an education student majoring in Elementary Education (K-6) and General Math-Algebra I (5-9).

"I have to thank Natalie for extending our Cross Country season for a few weeks," said GSU Track & Field and Cross Country Head Coach, Dan Meyers. "Between coach and athlete, we never even discussed nationals or Wisconsin until a week before she became regional champion, punching her bid to the national meet. It was amazing to see her confidence grow throughout this season. She battled hard at nationals and landed at 109th place with an impressive 21:56 6K on a difficult course. To be close to top 100 in the country, in a sport where thousands participate every year, is a major accomplishment."
