WELCOME TO GSU!!!

Welcome to the Glenville State University Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment Program. We are pleased to provide high school students across West Virginia with the opportunity to begin a high quality college education while still completing their secondary studies.

The Dual Credit program allows students to earn both high school and college credit simultaneously. The Dual Enrollment option provides students the opportunity to enroll in college level courses that are not part of the high school curriculum, enabling them to further expand their academic experience. Through strong partnerships with school systems in 19 counties, Glenville State University currently serves approximately 500 to 600 dual credit and dual enrollment students each semester.

Students who participate in these programs demonstrate initiative by gaining an early start on their college education and future careers. Glenville State offers a variety of program pathways, including the Associate Degree Program, High School Honors, the West Virginia Department of Education Grow Your Own Teachers initiative, and career focused pathways such as Health Sciences, Social Services, Natural Resource Management, Business Management, and Criminal Justice.

For students who are still exploring their academic and career interests, general education courses and a wide range of offerings across the University's eight academic departments are available. These courses allow students to earn transferable college credit that can be applied toward degree requirements or electives at any public college or university in West Virginia.

Participation in Glenville State's dual credit and dual enrollment programs also provides significant cost savings. Courses are offered at a reduced rate of \$25.00 per credit hour, or \$75.00 for a standard three credit hour course, making early college access both affordable and accessible.

We are excited to support you in this important step toward your academic and professional future.

BECOMING A DUAL ENROLLMENT/DUAL CREDIT STUDENT



Becoming a Glenville State University Dual Enrollment/Credit student is an excellent opportunity for high school juniors and seniors to begin earning college credit while still completing their high school requirements. This program allows motivated students to get a head start on their college education, experience the expectations of higher education, and make meaningful progress toward their academic and career goals.

To participate in the GSU Dual Credit/Enrollment Program, students must meet the following requirements:

- Be a junior or senior in high school
- Maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Submit ACT or SAT scores that meet GSU requirements for Science, and select Math courses
- Complete the GSU Dual Enrollment/Dual Credit Application
- Receive approval from your high school counselor or principal
- Submit a completed Glenville State University FERPA Release Form

APPLICATION PROCESS

The GSU Dual Enrollment and Dual Credit Application process is evolving to better serve our students through the introduction of the new GSU Student Portal. Students interested in participating in the Dual Enrollment or Dual Credit Program, as well as those planning to apply as first time freshmen, can now complete the entire application process in one convenient location.

Each student will create a personalized account, giving them secure and direct access to their application. After setting up their account, students simply select the High School Dual Enrollment or Dual Credit Application to get started. Within the portal, they can submit their application, upload ACT or SAT scores, provide parent or guardian consent, complete high school approvals, and manage all required documents with ease. This streamlined process empowers students by offering full visibility into their application status at every stage. With real time updates and a clear progression through each phase, students will always know exactly where they stand, creating a more transparent, efficient, and student friendly experience.

TEST SCORES & COURSE PREREQUISITES



Certain courses within the Dual Credit/Enrollment Program require students to meet specific prerequisites prior to enrollment. Students may satisfy these requirements through qualifying ACT and/or SAT scores, successful completion of or concurrent enrollment in designated courses, or by achieving the required score on a diagnostic exam. Diagnostic exams must be completed by August 1 for Fall enrollment and January 1 for Spring enrollment.

- **BIOL 120/BIOL 121 – Principles of Biology I and II** – ACT Math score of 21 or higher, SAT Math score of 530 or higher, or successful completion of or concurrent enrollment in MATH 115.
- **CHEM 101/102 – General Chemistry I & II**, --- ACT Math score of 24 or higher, SAT Math score of 610 or higher, or have completed or be concurrently enrolled in MATH 115.
- **MATH 115 – College Algebra** --- ACT Math score of 21 or higher, SAT Math score of 530 or higher, or successful completion of MATH 108 with a grade of C or higher, or a minimum score of 50 percent on the Math Diagnostic Exam.
- **MATH 230 – Euclidean Geometry** --- ACT Math score of 21 or higher, SAT Math score of 530 or higher, or successful completion of MATH 108 with a grade of C or higher.
- **MATH 256 – Probability and Statistics** --- ACT Math score of 21 or higher, SAT Math score of 530 or higher, or successful completion of MATH 108 with a grade of C or higher.
- **SCNC 101 – Earth Science** --- ACT Math score of 18 or higher, SAT Math score of 470 or higher, successful completion of MATH 108 with a grade of D or higher, or a minimum score of 50 percent on the Math Diagnostic Exam.
- **SCNC 103 – Contemporary Biology** --- ACT Math score of 18 or higher, SAT Math score of 470 or higher, or successful completion of MATH 108 with a grade of D or higher, or a minimum score of 50 percent on the Math Diagnostic Exam.
- **HLTH 230/231 – Anatomy and Physiology I & II for Allied Health** ~~~ students must have an ACT Composite score of 18 or higher, SAT Composite score of 940 or higher, or a minimum score of 50 percent on the Math Diagnostic Exam.



FERPA FORMS AND DIRECTIONS (RO – 06/25)

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA) RELEASE FORM

This form is required if a student wishes someone other than themselves to have access to their education records. Complete form with full legal name and GSU student ID#. Student will need to acknowledge consent of release of education records and enter names of individuals or agencies they are giving consent to have access to their records. A FERPA password must also be indicated so any individual or agency listed will be able to request information. Sign, date and submit form to the Registrar's Office. **Form will not be accepted or processed if it is not completed in its entirety and should not be submitted if it is already on file and there are no changes. If the form is submitted again and there were changes, the most recent submission will be retained, the changes will be made, and the previous release on file will be discarded.**

FERPA REVOCATION FORM This form will be required if a student has a FERPA Release Form on file with the

Registrar's Office and wishes to

remove the release entirely from their student record and is no longer authorizing others to have access to their education record. Complete form with full legal name and GSU student ID#, check appropriate box(es), sign, date and submit the form to the Registrar's Office.

REQUEST TO PREVENT DISCLOSURE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION FORM

Directory information (as described on form) can be released without the consent of the student. This form is required if you wish to prevent disclosure of your directory information or to remove a previous request to prevent disclosure on file in the Registrar's Office. Please keep in mind, if you choose to withhold directory information, University officials will not be able to confirm your enrollment or degrees awarded with third parties such as potential employers or insurance companies. Complete the form with your full name and GSU Student ID#. Sign, date and submit to the Registrar's Office. If removing previous prevention on file, check box at bottom of form, sign and date.

PARENT/GUARDIAN REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO STUDENT'S EDUCATION RECORDS FORM

A parent or guardian may complete and sign this form and submit it to the Registrar's Office. A signed copy of the preceding year's tax return must accompany the form to demonstrate the student is a dependent for federal income tax purposes. The copy provided must have either been completed by a third party (i.e., H&R Block) or be an official complete copy from the Internal Revenue Service or tax preparation software (i.e., TurboTax). Dollar amounts may be whited out or marked through if preferred. If a copy has already been provided to another office during the admissions process, please notify our office so we can obtain a copy.

This form and accompanying tax return will be required to be completed and submitted for each academic year the student is enrolled at Glenville State University. If a new form is not submitted, the student's education records will no longer be released after the conclusion of the academic year indicated on the form. In addition, a student has the legal authority to notify the Registrar's Office if they are no longer a dependent for federal income tax purposes. If the Registrar's Office has been notified of this change, their education record will no longer be released unless the student signs and submits a "FERPA" Release Form" identifying a parent or parents as having permission to their education records.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The Glenville State University Academic Calendar is an essential resource for all Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment students. It provides important dates and deadlines for each academic semester, including:

- First Day of classes
- Last Day to add or drop a course with a “W”
- Last Day to withdraw from a class with a grade of a “W”
- Last Day of classes
- Last day to completely withdraw from the University.
- Final Exams
- Holidays
- Breaks

Students are encouraged to review the calendar regularly to stay informed and ensure timely completion of all academic requirements.

*Please note that the GSU Academic Calendar **does not** align with most high school calendars. Even if your high school is closed for weather-related or scheduled breaks, you are still responsible for completing all assigned coursework and meeting GSU deadlines for any online courses.*

ADD, DROP, WITHDRAWAL

- Add/Drop a Course
 - Students may add or drop a course during the official add/drop period, usually the first week of the semester.
 - If a course is dropped during this time, it is completely removed from the student's schedule and academic record.
 - It will be as if the student never enrolled in the course.
 - Be sure to check the GSU Academic Calendar for exact deadlines.
- Withdraw from a Course
 - Withdrawing happens after the add/drop deadline has passed.
 - The course will still appear on the student's transcript with a grade of "W."
 - A "W" does not affect GPA, but the course will not count toward completed credits.
 - Withdrawn courses are not eligible for a refund.
- FIW (Failure due to Irregular Withdrawal)
 - This occurs when a student stops attending class or submitting assignments without officially withdrawing.
 - The course will appear on the transcript with a grade of "FIW."
 - An "FIW" is a failing grade and is calculated the same as an "F" in the student's GPA.

ACADEMIC REPEAT POLICY

If you earn a D or F in a college course (including an FIW), you are allowed to retake the course to improve your grade. When you repeat the class, your new grade replaces the old one in your GPA calculation, which can help raise your overall GPA. However, the original grade will still appear on your transcript—it just will not count toward your GPA.

There is a limit to how many credits you can repeat. You may repeat up to 21 total credit hours of courses with grades of D or F.

For upper-level courses (300–499), you may also request to repeat a course in which you earned a C, but there are a few extra steps:

- You can only repeat up to 8 credit hours of C grades
- You must get approval from your Department Chair
- You must submit the required form before enrolling in the course again

Keep in mind, the 21 credit hour limit includes both D/F repeats and any approved C repeats. For example, if you repeat 6 credits of a C, you will have 15 credits left for repeating D or F grades.

Once you reach the 21 credit hour limit, any additional repeated courses will no longer replace your previous grade in your GPA—instead, both grades will be counted.

This policy gives you the opportunity to improve your academic record, but ***it is important to use your repeats wisely.***

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY



At Glenville State University, academic integrity means being honest and doing your own work. As a dual enrollment student, you are expected to follow the same standards as college students. This includes not cheating on assignments or tests, not copying someone else's work (plagiarism), not reusing your own past work without permission (self plagiarism), and not making up information or data (fabrication). It also means you should not try to gain an unfair advantage, help others cheat, access materials without permission, or falsify any academic records or documents.

If a student is suspected of academic dishonesty, the instructor will review the situation and decide what action to take based on the course syllabus and university policy. In most cases, consequences follow a step-by-step process:

- First offense: You will receive a failing grade on the assignment.
- Second offense: You will fail the course.
- Third offense: You may be suspended from the university for a semester.
- Severe cases: More serious consequences can happen even on the first offense.

These policies are in place to ensure fairness and to help you build strong habits that will benefit you in college and beyond. Students are encouraged to ask questions, use resources appropriately, and always submit work they can be proud of.

EDNET ACCOUNT

EdNet is an online system that colleges use to manage student information.

For a high school student, think of EdNet like your school's digital hub where everything about your college classes is kept in one place. If you're taking dual credit classes through Glenville State University, EdNet is the system you'll use to stay on top of things.

Here's what you can do in EdNet:

- Check your class schedule
- View your grades
- Register for or drop classes
- See your unofficial transcript
- Access important academic information

In simple terms, EdNet is your college dashboard. It helps you keep track of your classes and progress, just like an app or portal you might already use in high school, but for college courses.

3. Click on **EdNET**.
4. Click on **Enter Secure Area**.
5. You will then be asked to type in your User ID and Pin.

You **MUST** enter it in a day, month, and year format, each Being 2 digits (DDMMYY).

BRIGHTSPACE


Brightspace is the online platform where your actual college classes happen.

If EdNet is your “college dashboard,” then Brightspace is your digital classroom. At Glenville State University, this is where you’ll go to do your schoolwork for dual credit classes. Here’s what you’ll use Brightspace for:

- Viewing assignments and due dates
- Submitting homework and projects
- Taking quizzes and tests
- Watching lectures or class videos
- Checking grades and feedback from your instructor
- Communicating with your professor or classmates

In simple terms, Brightspace is where you actually do your classwork online. If your teacher says “check Brightspace,” that’s your cue to log in and see what you need to complete for class.

GSU STUDENT EMAIL

Your Glenville State University student email is your official college email account, and it's one of the most important tools you'll use as a dual enrollment student.

Think of it as your college inbox. When you take classes through Glenville State University, all important information is sent there instead of your personal email. Here's what your GSU email is used for:

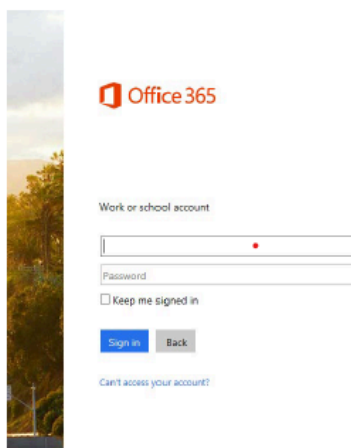
- Messages from your professors about assignments, deadlines, or class updates
- Important announcements from the university
- Financial aid or billing information (if applicable)
- Password resets and access to systems like Brightspace and EdNet

A few important tips:

- Check your email regularly (at least a few times a week)
- Use it for school communication instead of personal email
- Respond professionally when emailing instructors or staff

In simple terms, your GSU student email is your main line of communication for college. If you miss something there, you could miss an important deadline or update.

Glenville State University, in conjunction with the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission (HEPC) offer students who are interested in pursuing careers in Education, Nursing/Health Sciences, Psychology/Counseling/Social Work, Business, Criminal Justice or Energy Management are offered the following pathway opportunities. These pathways provide students with an opportunity to earn 24-30 college credit hours within their pathway of choice. Students participating in a pathway will receive all tuition and textbook cost at no cost to them at the completion of each term.

Students will be responsible for the full cost of any course that they withdraw from or do not complete, i.e. receive an FIW as a final grade.**

- Grow Your Own - Teacher Education Pathway
- Health Sciences High School Pathway
- Natural Resource Management High School Pathway
- Social Services High School Pathway
- Business Management High School Pathway
- Criminal Justice High School Pathway

Each of the pathways listed above will provide students with a one-year jumpstart on their four-year degree upon completion.

ASSOCIATES DEGREE PROGRAM

Students who wish to earn an Associate Degree in General Studies while still in high school have the opportunity to do so through the GSU Dual Enrollment/Dual Credit Program. This program allows motivated students to complete college coursework alongside their high school requirements, making significant progress toward a college credential before graduation.

To complete the program by the end of their senior year, students should begin taking courses in the fall semester of their junior year. Courses may be taken either face to face at the high school through Dual Credit offerings or online courses for Dual Enrollment credit.

The Associate Degree requires a total of **60** credit hours. Students are expected to enroll in approximately **15** credit hours per semester to stay on track for completion. For those who prefer a lighter course load during the fall or spring semesters, summer course options are available and may be used to remain on pace toward graduation.

As part of the degree requirements, students must select an area of interest and complete **12** credit hours within that chosen field. Current areas of interest include *Business, Criminal Justice, Education, Fine Arts, Land Resources, Language and Literature, Science and Math, Health Science, and Social Science*. Once a student selects an area of interest, they will receive additional guidance on appropriate course options within that field.

Students may also apply qualifying AP credit and approved transfer credit toward the completion of the degree, where applicable.

Each semester, students enrolled in the GSU Associate Degree Program will receive academic advising from the Director of Dual Enrollment/Dual Credit - Rachel Clutter. Advising ensures that students remain on track, understand their requirements, and make informed decisions about course selection throughout the program.

Elective credits are classes you choose based on your interests that count toward your degree but are not specifically required.

TUITION COST AND INVOICING

Glenville State University is committed to making Dual Enrollment an affordable option for students and families. Currently, Dual Enrollment courses are offered at a reduced rate of \$25 per credit hour, which equals \$75 for a standard 3 credit hour course. This allows students to earn college credit at a significantly lower cost while still in high school.

Students who participate in one of the approved career pathways may complete up to 30 credit hours at no cost. These pathways cover both tuition and textbook rental fees. Students must indicate their selected pathway on the GSU Dual Enrollment/Credit Registration Card to receive these benefits.

The approved pathways include:

- Natural Resource Management Pathway
- Social Services Pathway
- Health Sciences Pathway
- Grow Your Own WV Education Pathway
- Business Management Pathway
- Criminal Justice Pathway

Students who are not enrolled in one of the pathways listed above, or who attend a high school that does not cover Dual Enrollment costs, are responsible for paying tuition and textbook fees.

Invoices are mailed to the student's address provided on their registration card and are sent each semester on the following schedule:

- Fall Semester: October 1
- Spring Semester: February 1
- Summer Term: June 1

Students participating in a pathway should be aware that they are responsible for the cost of any course they withdraw from after the official add/drop period. Pathway funding only applies to courses that are successfully completed.

REQUESTING YOUR COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT



A college transcript is an official record of your academic work at Glenville State University. It includes the courses you have taken, the grades you have earned, and your overall academic progress. This document is important because it is often required when applying to colleges, transferring to another institution, applying for scholarships, or even for certain job opportunities. It serves as a verified record of your academic achievements.

Students are strongly encouraged to select electronic delivery, as it is the fastest option and typically processed without delay. If you choose to have a paper copy mailed, please allow up to five business days for processing and delivery.

The Associate of Science in Forest Technology program at Glenville State University has been offered since 1968 and continues to be successful and in demand. The two-year degree allows students to complete the program promptly and then start their forestry career. Through classroom study, field trips, hands-on lab experiences, and an internship, students will acquire in-depth forestry knowledge and real-world forestry skills.

Students become knowledgeable and skilled in tree and wood identification, forest measurements, mapping, forest ecology, silviculture, timber harvesting, forest health, and forest management. Graduates pursue careers in wood products industries, consulting firms, state and federal government, and with utility companies. Glenville State University's A.S. Forest Technology program is one of only 25 programs nationwide that is accredited by the Society of American Foresters. This accreditation means that the program meets demanding nationwide standards and provides a high quality, rigorous education to students. The program is also a member of the Council of Eastern Forest Technician Schools (CEFTS).

Students interested in obtaining a bachelor's degree after they complete their two-year degree can seamlessly enroll in the Natural Resource Management program and major in forest technology. 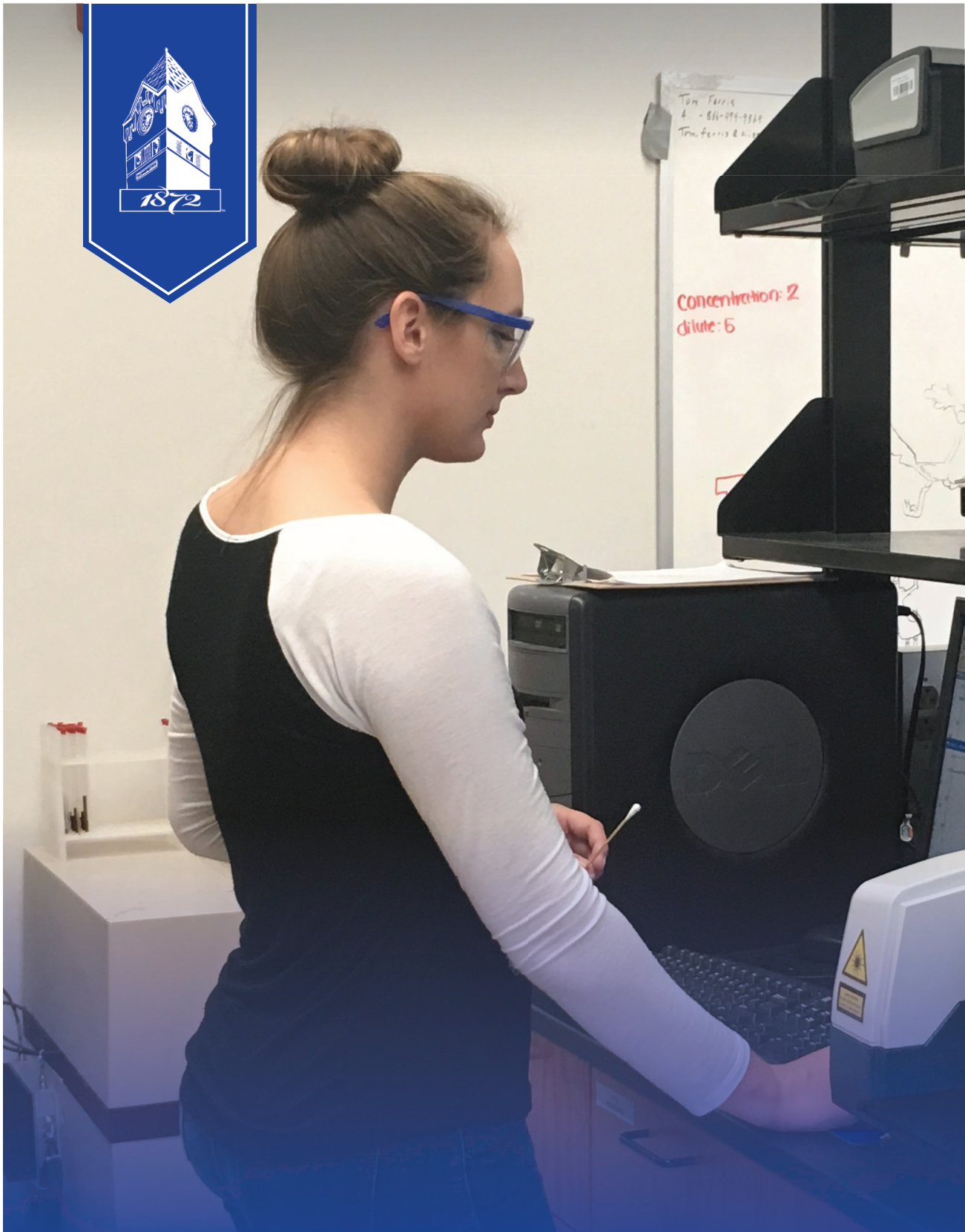

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Science and Mathematics offers baccalaureate (four-year) degrees in biology, chemistry, and mathematics as well as Bachelor of Arts in Education degrees in mathematics (5-9 and 5-Adult), biology (9-Adult), chemistry (9-Adult), and general science (5-9 and 5-Adult). Many students major in biology and/or chemistry to prepare for professional schools such as medical, veterinary, and pharmacy schools.

GSU's relatively small size provides opportunities for personalized student-faculty interactions in both classroom and laboratory settings, with a balance of theoretical and applied instruction.


The biology degree allows students to concentrate on topics such as cellular biology, wildlife biology, or organismal biology. Similarly, the chemistry degree provides the flexibility to tailor the degree to prepare students for careers in chemistry laboratories as well as for graduate school or professional schools. Students who pursue the mathematics degree concentrate on applied topology, business, or science and engineering. Education majors spend three years in content courses followed by a year-long residency in a public school. Due to the high demand for science and mathematics teachers, graduates are quickly placed in teaching positions upon graduation.

Glenville State University students can benefit from partnerships between GSU and other West Virginia institutions. For example, students can enter the Marshall University Pharm.D. program after three years at GSU and after the first year at Marshall, receive a bachelor's degree in biology, chemistry, or interdisciplinary studies from GSU while completing the four years of pharmacy instruction at Marshall. Glenville State University also has a pre-osteopathic medicine program that provides a pathway for seamless admission into the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine.

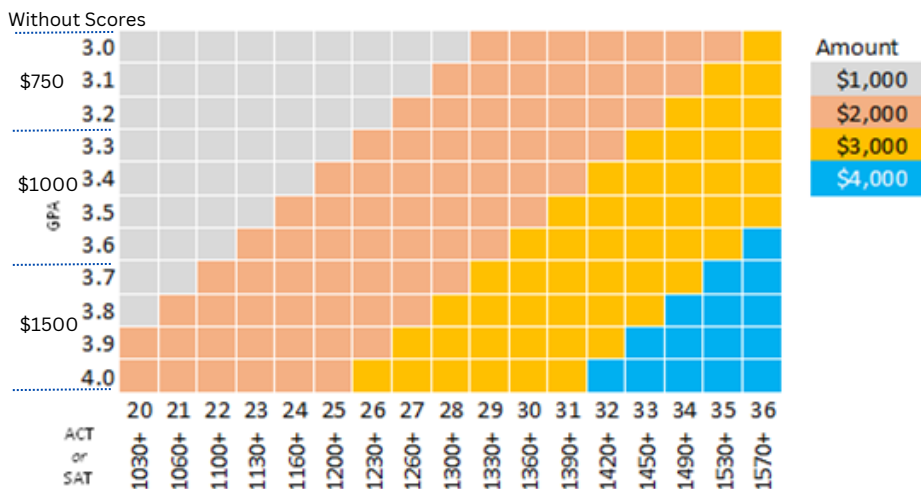

HOMEGROWN SCHOLARSHIP

\$3000/ per academic year

- Incoming first-time freshman
- Newly enrolled student at GSU and be from ANY West Virginia County
- Student must be attending a WV Public School District
- Minimum ACT composite score of 20 or SAT composite score of 1030
- High School GPA of 3.0+
- Must be recommended/referred by their high school superintendent, principal, or counselor
- Must enroll in the BAED degree program in the area identified as “high need” by a school designee (counselor, principal, etc.)

Renewal Conditions

- Successful progression (3.0 GPA+) in teacher education course work and program

PIONEER LEGACY

\$500 per academic year

The Pioneer Legacy Scholarship is an award designed to honor the familial connection and enduring legacy of alumni within the GSU community. This scholarship offers a transformative opportunity to pursue higher education without deepening the financial burden associated with college. Eligible applicants must maintain all stipulations associated with the WV Promise Scholarship including GPA and minimum passed hours for renewal. Through this scholarship, we aim to empower students to thrive academically while alleviating financial barriers that may hinder their educational journey.

- Must maintain a minimum 3.0 each academic year
- Have \$0 balance at the beginning of each term
