 - b. She informed the assembly that next Wednesday, October 8, SGA will be hosting a tabling event outside of Starbucks at 10 a.m. The first 75 students to take the SGA survey will get a card for a free Starbucks drink worth up to eight dollars.
 - c. She informed the assembly that for Homecoming an Appetizer night was planned, but it was going to cost \$3,500, which is a lot of the SGA budget. She asked for input from the assembly.

- h. Goodwin Hall Representative Barrera: She informed the assembly that she met with RHA Eli-Anderson Lake and discussed managing the hard keys and how to get them back. a. Rooted in Him – Elijah Carr
