- I. Vice President McCartney called the meeting to order at 12:34 p.m.
- II. Public Comment:
 - a. None.
- III. Attendance:
 - a. President Floyd took attendance.
- IV. Announcements:

- VI. Executive Appointments:
 - a. None
- VII. President's Report:
 - a. She informed the assembly that yesterday the planned Starbucks event was held to get surveys filled out. There were 75 people in total who took surveys and got a ticket. The library survey has 170 respondents, and the POD survey has about 90 respondents.
 - b. She informed the assembly that she handed the assembly Homecoming sign-up sheets for next week. Next week is going to be a very busy week. She asked that the assembly scan the QR code and fill out what events they can work or would be interested in working. The events that can be worked by SGA are the Bonfire and Carnival on Monday, Chili Cook-Off on Wednesday, and Casino Night on Thursday. She included that she would like to see everyone at the Spirit Walk on Friday. Coming to at least one of the events will count as attendance next week, and SGA will not have a regular meeting.

- c. She informed the assembly that she is going to start a GroupMe, so it is easier for SGA to communicate rather than send emails on outlook 24/7. She asked that everyone make sure to sign-up for the app.
- d. She informed the assembly that on November 6, 2025, at 12:30, SGA will have a meeting and confer. She explained that Dr. Manchin will meet SGA in the President's Theater, and members get to bring up issues and concerns. All students are welcome to come.
- e. She informed the assembly that we are having an open house on November 15, 2025. Freshmen will be there, and if anyone would like to talk to Freshmen, please talk to Liaison Ferguson.

VIII. Executive Reports:

- a. Vice President: He informed the assembly that Events Committee will not be meeting tonight. He will send out an email regarding what they are doing next week.
- b. Treasurer: He informed the assembly that SGA has a total of \$7,270 in funding. From last week, with bills being passed (Starbucks event \$600 and Canva bill \$130 = \$730 of SGA budget). An upcoming transaction for Homecoming is \$1,618. If the Homecoming bill is approved, the total amount for the SGA budget will be \$5,651.
- c. Parliamentarian: None.
- d. Secretary: She informed the assembly that the Trillium writing portion is going to be available to students to turn in poetry, prose, and/or short stories until November 31, 2025, at midnight. She encouraged the assembly to tell their friends and turn in creative writing.
- e. Public Relations: None.

IX. Committee Reports:

- a. Academic Policy Committee: Pro-Temp/Senator Hypes shared:
 - i. The committee is clarifying the language in the course program of study. They recommend that the Criminal Justice associate's degree should be reevaluated to meet the CJ core because at this moment CJ students do not earn the CJ associate's degree. They just earn the General Studies associates degree because it dips into both the Field of Forensics and the Admin of Justice majors. If it was just the CJ core, then CJ majors would get the CJ associate's degree.

- ii. They went over Academic Policy #33, which is the Attendance Policy. Language is still being updated for clarity but passed with updates.
 - iii. They are reviewing the Academic Integrity Violation Policy.
 - iv. The audit policy needs to be reviewed.
 - v. The committee is wondering if SGA will use members of the Judicial Branch to be on the committee that reviews appeals. There is no student representation right now, and if SGA believes in having a student representation, they need to send their recommendation to Faculty Senate. The bylaws would have to be updated. This motion was tabled.
- b. Co-Curricular Assessment Committee:
- i. Majority Leader/Senator Adkins shared that the committee went over the Outdoor Recreation Assessment and discussed putting the program on a hiatus due to a lack of student engagement and personnel/staffing issues.
- c. Enrollment Management Committee:
- i. Speaker of Representatives/Criminal Justice Representative Osborne shared that the committee met last week. They looked at locations across campus that would be adequate for a virtual tour. There are to be 30 places picked out for a virtual tour by the next meeting.

X. Assembly Reports:

- a. Speaker of Representatives/Criminal Justice Representative Osborne:
- i. She informed the assembly that Pioneer Shooting Club had a very auction on Monday night. They earned \$2,100 and still have to vote on the amount they are going to give to the cancer society.

 - iv. She informed the assembly that it is the month of October, which means that the Senate and the Representatives will be meeting again. They are going to try to get personalized flyers completed. Everyone make sure they are attending the meetings.
