- VIII. Executive Reports:
  - a. Vice President: He informed the assembly that the Events Committee will be meeting tonight at 6 p.m. to draft a bill for the organization's expenses of the homecoming budget.
  - b. Treasurer: He informed the assembly that SGA still has \$8,000 in the budget that has not been used. He also met with Representative Holmes, and they discussed ways to raise funds for the SGA. There is a fundraiser that must be planned to ensure the organization

IX. Committee Reports:

- a. Academic Policy Committee:
  - i. Pro-Temp/Senator Hypes shared that Academic Policy met, and they discussed updating their bylaws to the year 2025. They also addressed the attendance policy. She brought to their attention that they do have to have to observe the American Disabilities Act. She informed the assembly that students that are pregnant and otherwise disabled and are given permission to miss class because of a disability, they do have to be exempted. It will all be updated into the Attendance Policy.
  - ii. They addressed the updates to the catalog for transfer credit policy; there is a program that one can gain credits while in military service and people also having issues transferring certain credits.
- b. Curriculum Committee:
  - i. Social Science Representative Golden shared that the committee met on Tuesday and discussed Interdisciplinary Studies and there was no clarification in the terminology. There was confusion about whether upper-level courses had to be from both areas of study. They concluded they would leave it ambiguous that way students could individualize their plan of study to figure out what they want to do for their career.
  - ii. They are changing the abbreviation for CSCI to CIA. The number of the course will not be changed.
- c. Events Committee:
  - i. Math and Science Representative Gray shared that the committee met Thursday of last week to get things prepped for Homecoming. Tonight, they are getting a bill together for the budget.

a. Business Representative Holmes:

- i. She informed the assembly that she has been trying to get in contact with Garrett Copeland to discuss what is going on with FBLA.
