- c. AB-02-26
  - i. The bill is to buy Canva Pro for SGA, in order to optimize our advertising and marketing strategies by using Canva Pro items. The rules and cost are also outlined for using the Canva Pro account. It is primarily for the use of Public Relations, but it will be available to other SGA members if they are given permission. - d. Turning Point USA – Andrew Lathem
  - i. Turning Point USA is to bring together the youthful voters of America to the conservative movement, sharing their ideas, beliefs, and general politics of the world. Founded by Charlie Kirk, they aspire to move the younger generation of Americans to fight for their country so it can be its best possible version.
