  - a. She informed the assembly that the SGA folders have the Constitution and Bylaws for members. There are still things like recently passed bills that need to be added to them.
  - b. She informed the assembly that next week she is going to meet with the Board of Governors.
  - c. She informed the assembly that Freshmen elections are most likely going to start next Monday.
  - d. She informed the assembly that SGA is going to start tabling once a month on Mondays from 11 a.m. - 1 p.m. It is for students to tell SGA anything that is going on and about any problems on campus.
