Two associate of science degree programs are offered in Forest Technology and Land Surveying. Two baccalaureate degrees are offered in Land Surveying & Mapping and Natural Resource Management. The baccalaureate degree in Natural Resource Management takes advantage of the two associate degree programs in the Department of Land Resources and the strength of course offerings in other academic departments. The degree is developed around the general education baccalaureate degree component, a natural resource management core, four majors, and a block elective component. The four majors offered are criminal justice, environmental science, forest technology, and wildlife management.

Student organizations include the Forestry Club, the Environmental Science Club, and the Land Surveying Club. These groups promote camaraderie and provide opportunities for field trips, learning opportunities, and community service. Several scholarships are available specifically to students who are enrolled in the land resources programs.

Wildlife Management is one of the five 4-year Bachelor of Science majors offered under the Natural Resource Management program.

This Wildlife Management major is designed for students who want to pursue a career in wildlife management or pursue an advanced degree in wildlife. Through the Wildlife Management major, students will acquire knowledge of the life history, habitat, and ecological requirements of important game and non-game wildlife, learn to identify, classify, and name important flora and fauna endemic to the Appalachian region, demonstrate and apply wildlife management techniques and methods, develop office and field skills in the use of geospatial technologies, computer software, and quantitative analysis, and develop wildlife management plans.

The Bachelor of Science degree in Land Surveying & Mapping is designed around three key components: a comprehensive general education foundation, a core curriculum in Land Surveying & Mapping, and an elective block tailored to broaden expertise. This degree is one of two four-year Bachelor of Science programs offered by the department, alongside a two-year Associate's degree option in Land Surveying.

The Land Surveying & Mapping degree provides a clear pathway for students with an Associate's degree in Land Surveying to advance to a baccalaureate level. Graduates are equipped with technical proficiency in land surveying and develop strong skills in geographic information systems (GIS), mapping, and resource management, preparing them for careers in both government and the private sector.

Additionally, this program meets the educational requirements for licensure as a professional land surveyor in most U.S. states and territories.

ABOUT THE MAJOR

The Associate of Science in Forest Technology program at Glenville State University has been offered since 1968 and continues to be successful and in demand. The two-year degree allows students to complete the program promptly and then start their forestry career. Through classroom study, field trips, hands-on lab experiences, and an internship, students will acquire in-depth forestry knowledge and real-world forestry skills.

Students become knowledgeable and skilled in tree and wood identification, forest measurements, mapping, forest ecology, silviculture, timber harvesting, forest health, and forest management. Graduates pursue careers in wood products industries, consulting firms, state and federal government, and with utility companies. Glenville State University's A.S. Forest Technology program is one of only 25 programs nationwide that is accredited by the Society of American Foresters. This accreditation means that the program meets demanding nationwide standards and provides a high quality, rigorous education to students. The program is also a member of the Council of Eastern Forest Technician Schools (CEFTS).

Students interested in obtaining a bachelor's degree after they complete their two-year degree can seamlessly enroll in the Natural Resource Management program and major in forest technology. The four-year degree program opens up more employment opportunities in state and federal government agencies that require a bachelor's degree.
